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Methodology

- The online survey was conducted among **1,095** current members of the INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 panel in **Ontario** from September 17th to September 30th, 2009.
- The Canada 20/20 Panel is recruited from a wide variety of sources to be representative of the known distribution of Canadians by age, gender, region and language.
- Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected sub samples of the panel and weighted according to Census data to ensure that the sample is representative of the age, gender, region and language breakdown of the Canadian population to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.
- Each panellist is provided with a unique URL in their invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete any specific survey. Each URL can only be used to complete one survey.
- An unweighted probability sample of **1,095** would have an estimated margin of error of \pm **2.96** percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
- The margin of error will be larger within each sub-grouping of the sample




Provincial Vote and Outcomes


Decided Provincial vote in Ontario

Generally speaking, how satisfied are you with the performance of the PROVINCIAL government in Ontario? Would you say you are...




Thinking about politics in Ontario, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a...







NDP outperforms base on protecting women's ¹⁴ right, environment and health






PCs maintain top choice for tax cuts

How about cutting taxes? September 2007, March 2009 and September 2009




PCs remain 'tough on crime' top choice




Liberals and Tories in tight race on improving economy











Favourable impressions for McGuinty remain stable since his election














McGuinty dominant on 'strong leadership'

McGuinty slowly easing out of "flip flopper"


"Flip flops" best describes...




Horwath has made a difference for the NDP on ³⁷ 'too negative' label

"Too negative" best describes...




Majority sees no leader caring 'about people like me'



Ontario's Value Clusters






Issue Publics - August 2007

Liberal challenge

- The Liberals retain an eight point lead in brand loyalty
- Strength on party attributes such as responding to the downturn, managing the economy, delivering results for me and managing health care support their current strength.
- McGuinty now has edge on best plan and strong leadership but vulnerable on motive.
- Liberals have two key challenges:
 - Keep bad news away from McGuinty
 - Define Hudak and Horwath



The Tory Challenge

- Build Liberal and McGuinty negatives without adding to Hudak's negatives.
- Build Hudak positive image
- Either pull the Liberals down on economy or shift the channel to strengths such as taxes and crime.



The NDP challenge

- Build Liberal and McGuinty negatives without adding to Horwath's negatives.
- Build Horwath's positive image
- Go after Liberals on caring as well as the environment.
- Consider a frontal assault either on economy from the left or health.



Get ready

- With low turnout and a strong Liberal base, opposition parties are going to have to go negative with deeply emotional appeals to stop the juggernaut.
- In turn, the Liberals will want to define the opposition leaders before those leaders define themselves.





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
