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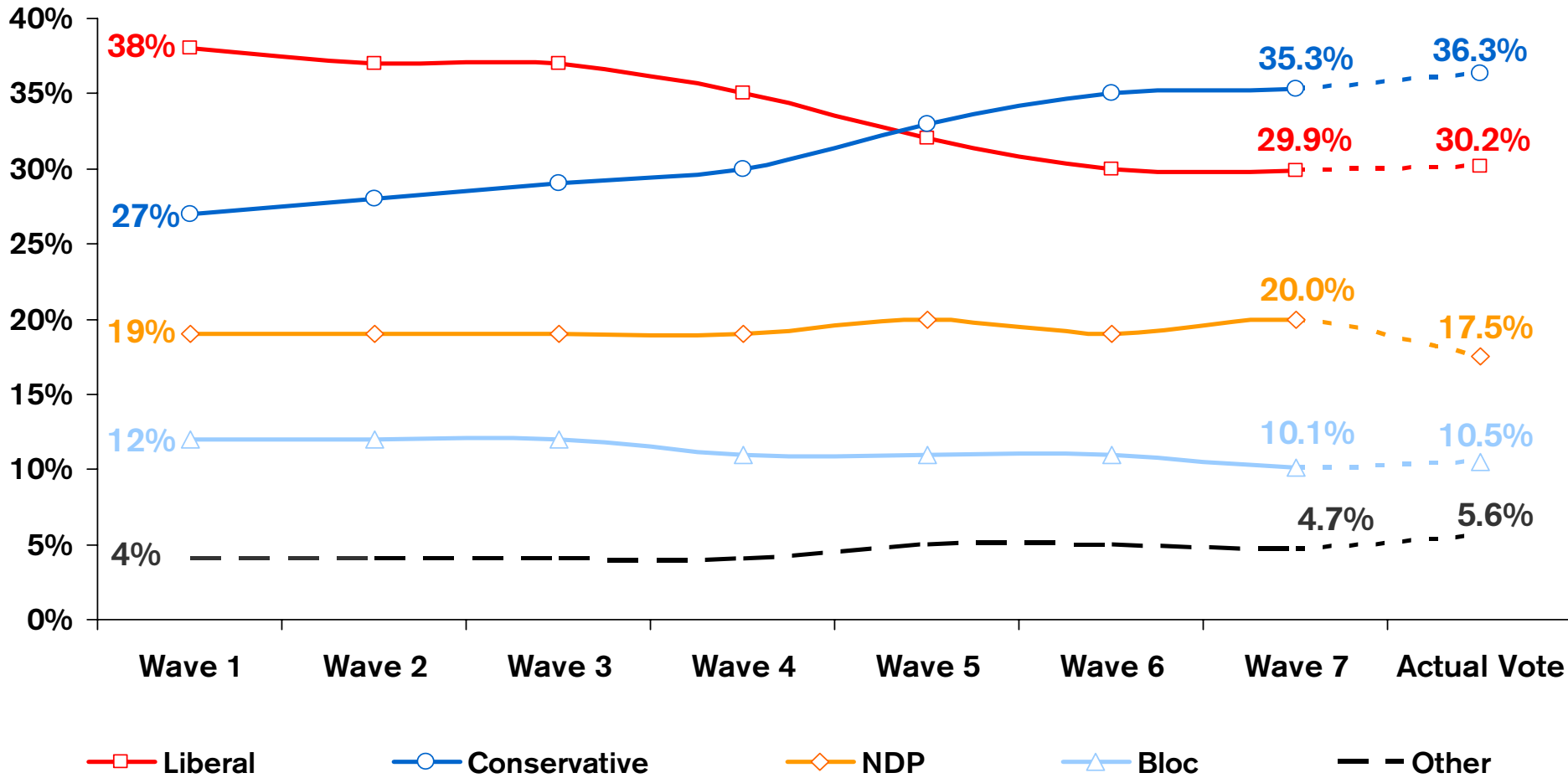


# Methodology

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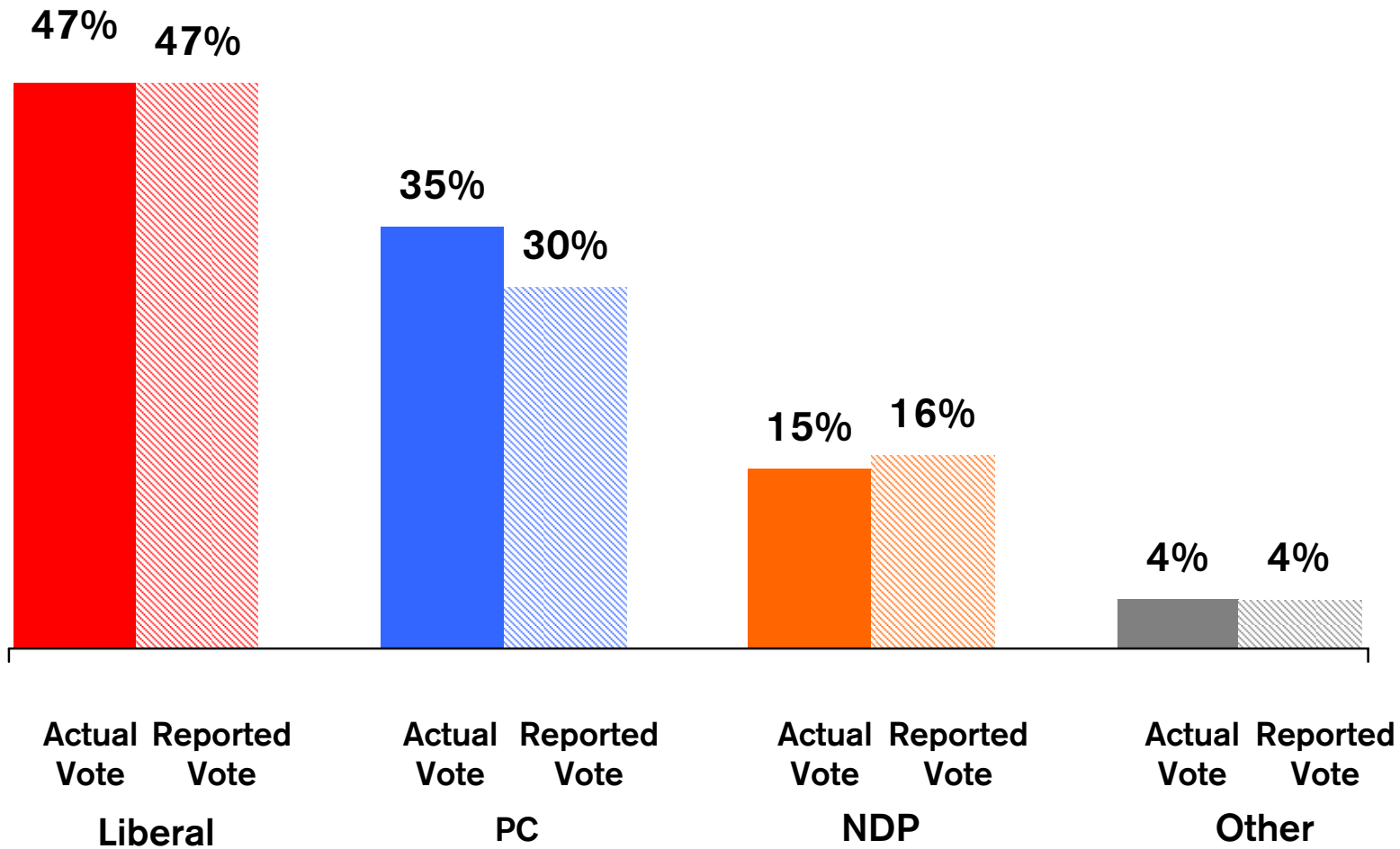
- The online survey was conducted among current Ontario members of the INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 panel between August 30<sup>th</sup> and September 5<sup>th</sup> 2007.
- The study included 1,377 responses eligible for inclusion in our analysis.
- After weighting a sample of this size the aggregated results are considered accurate to within  $\pm 2.6$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what they would have been had a representative cross-section of Ontarians eligible to vote been polled.
- The margin of error will be larger within each sub-grouping of the sample

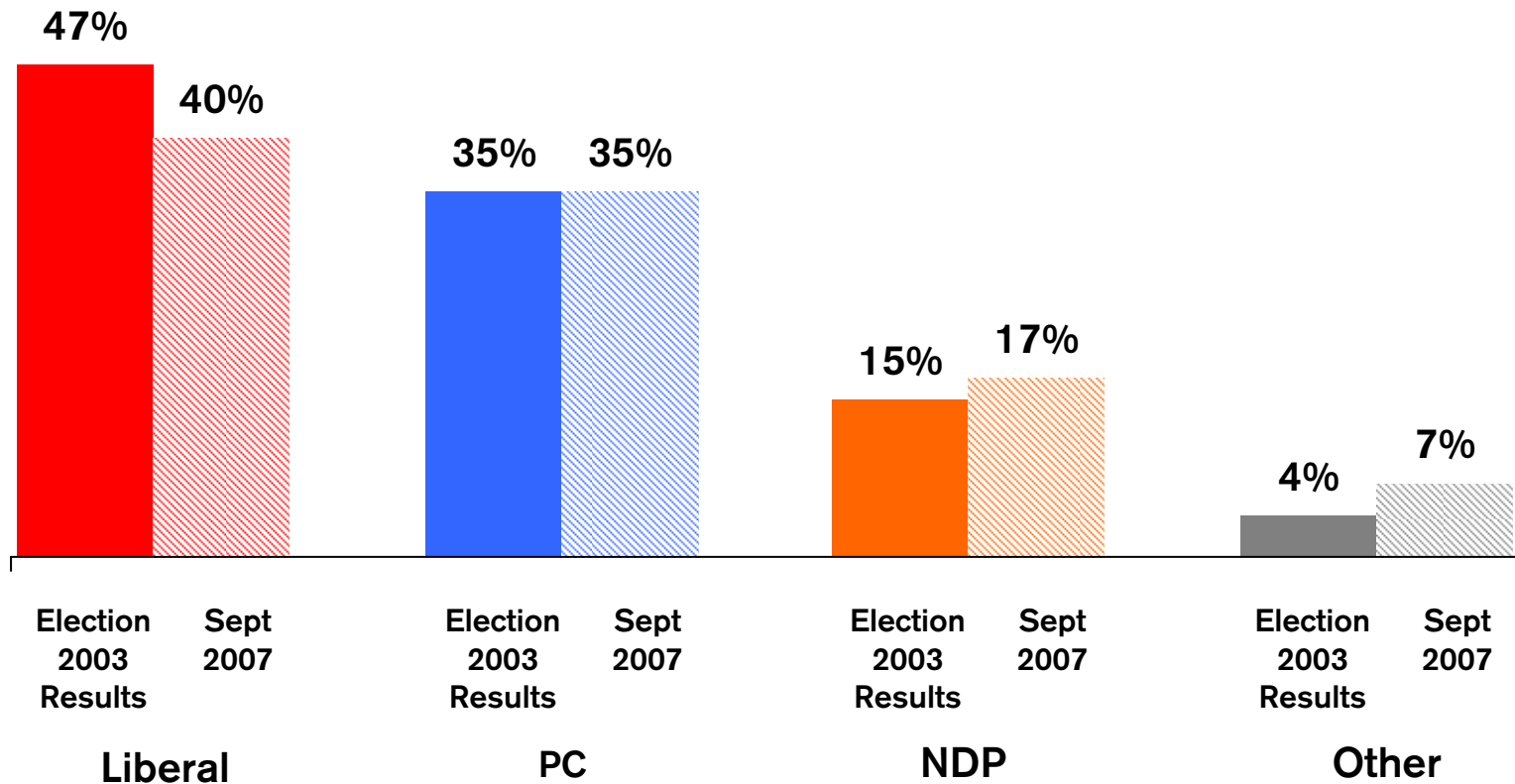

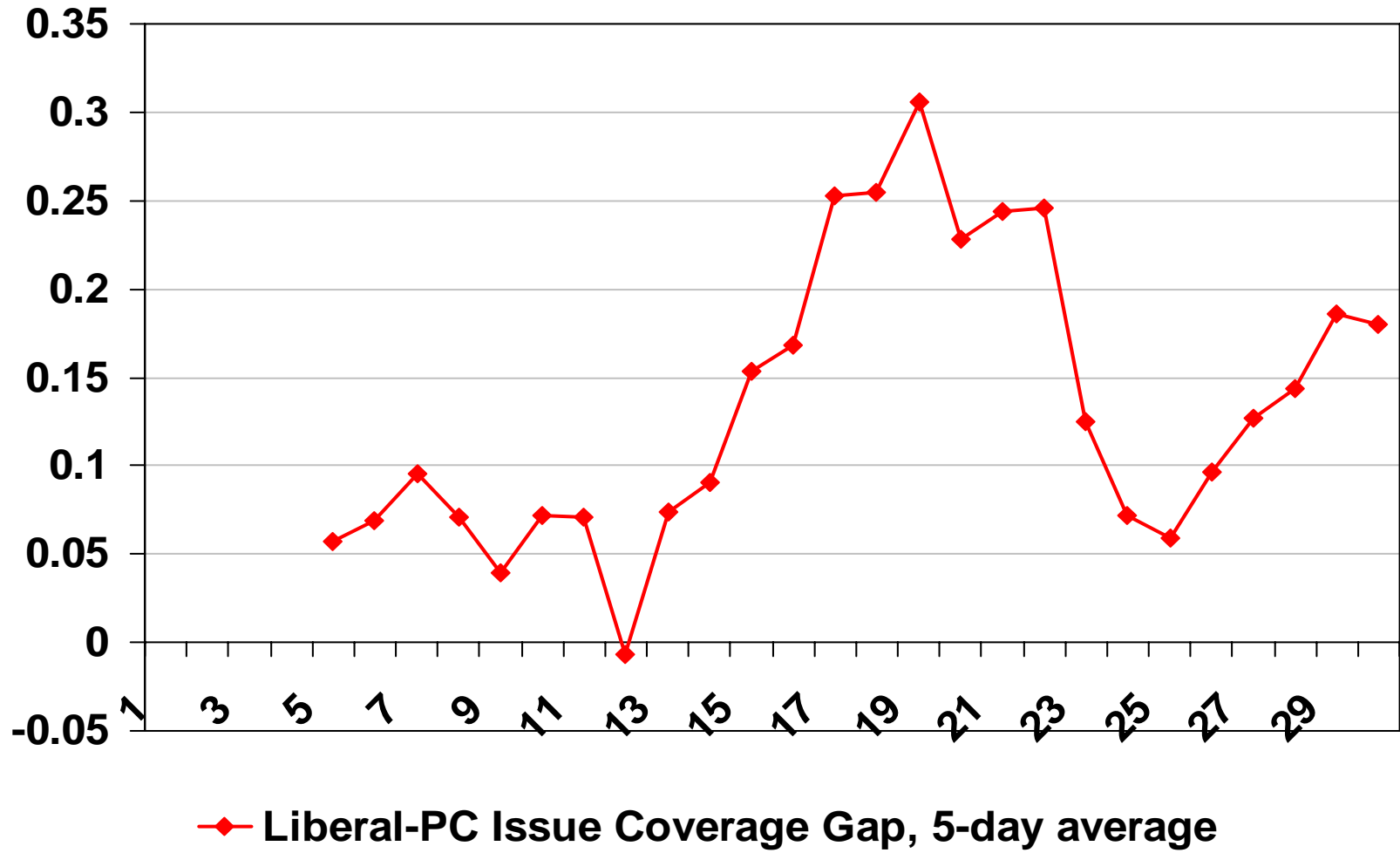

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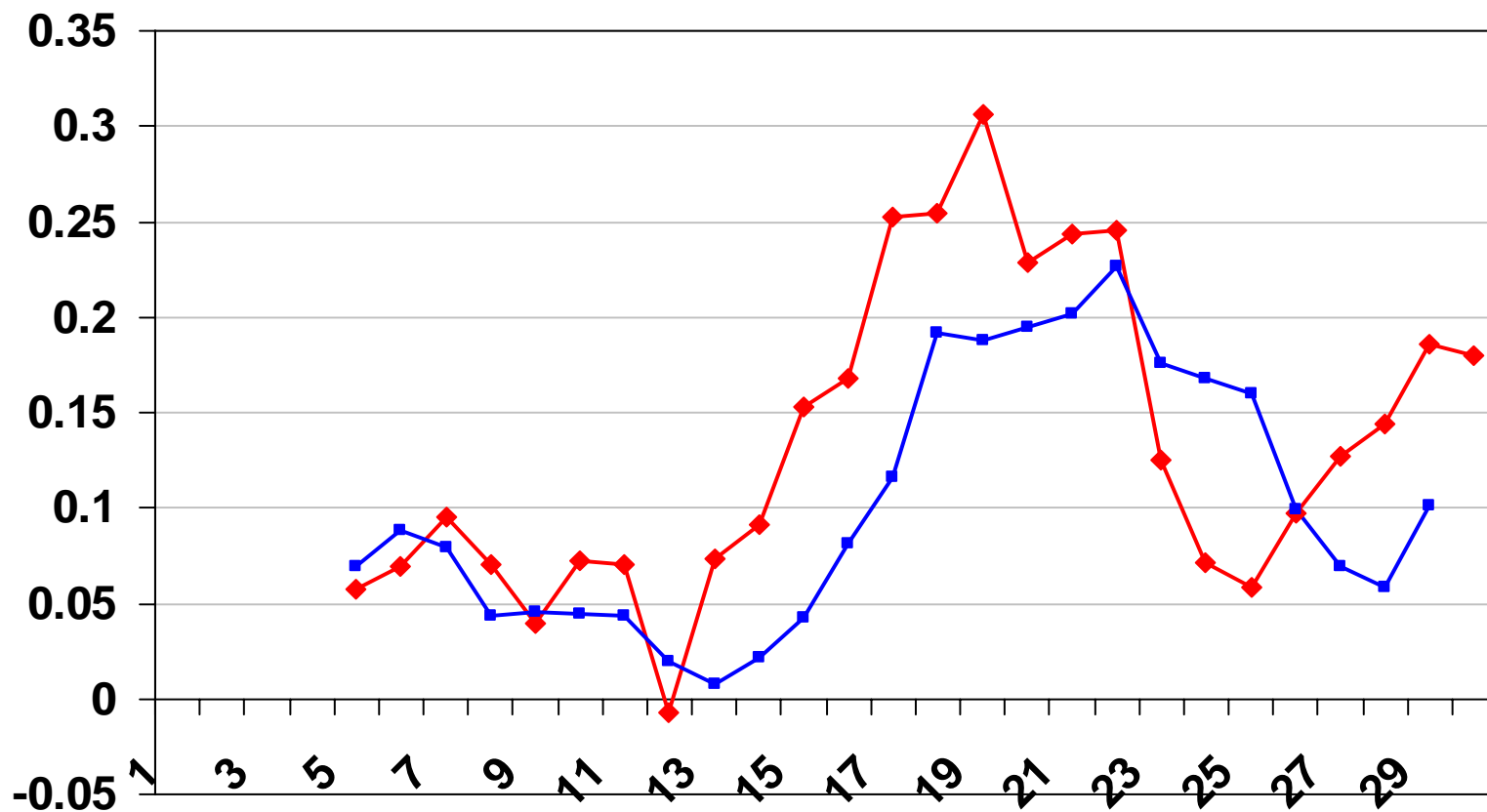

■ Liberal-PC Vote Gap, 5-day average

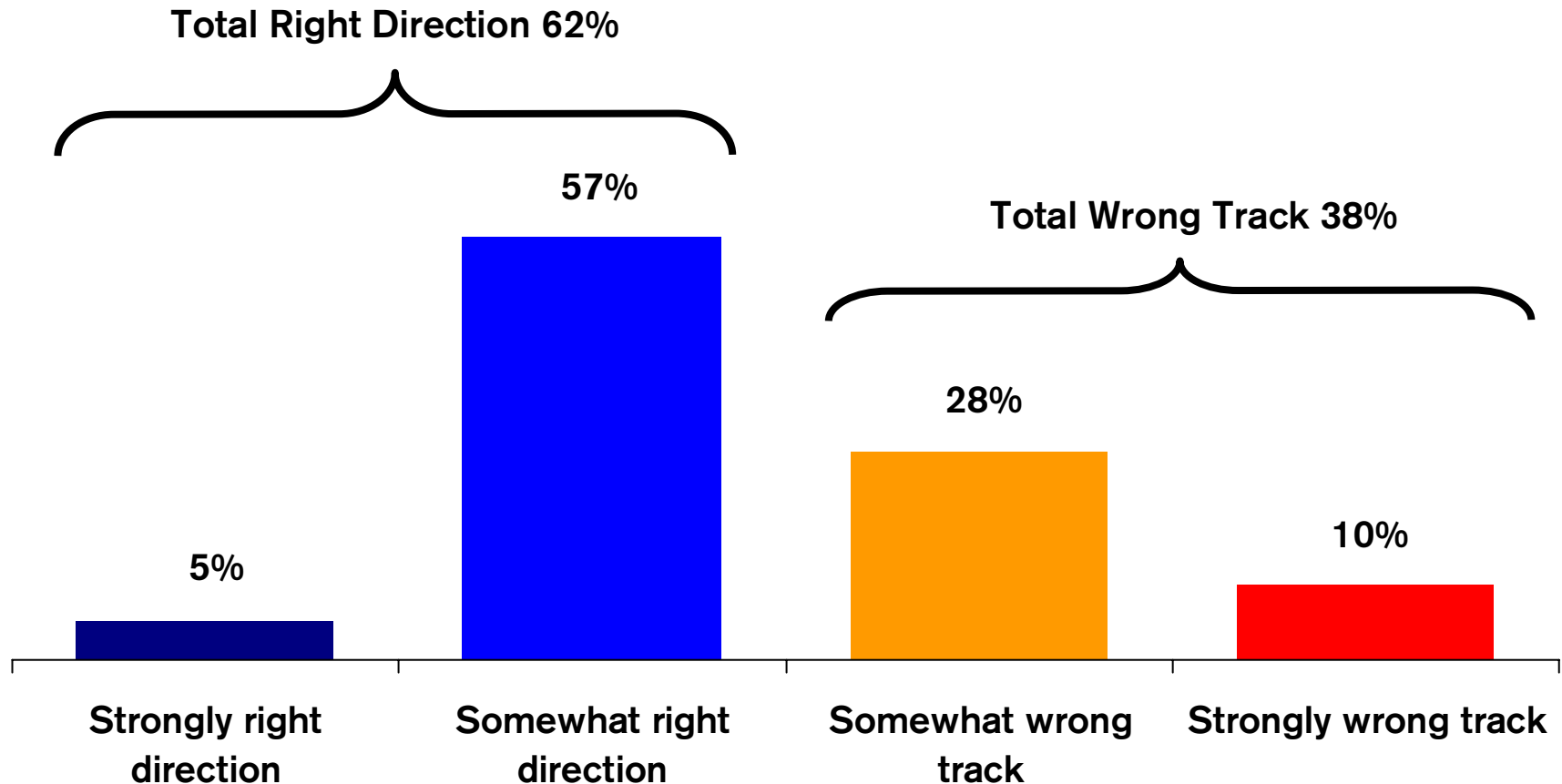

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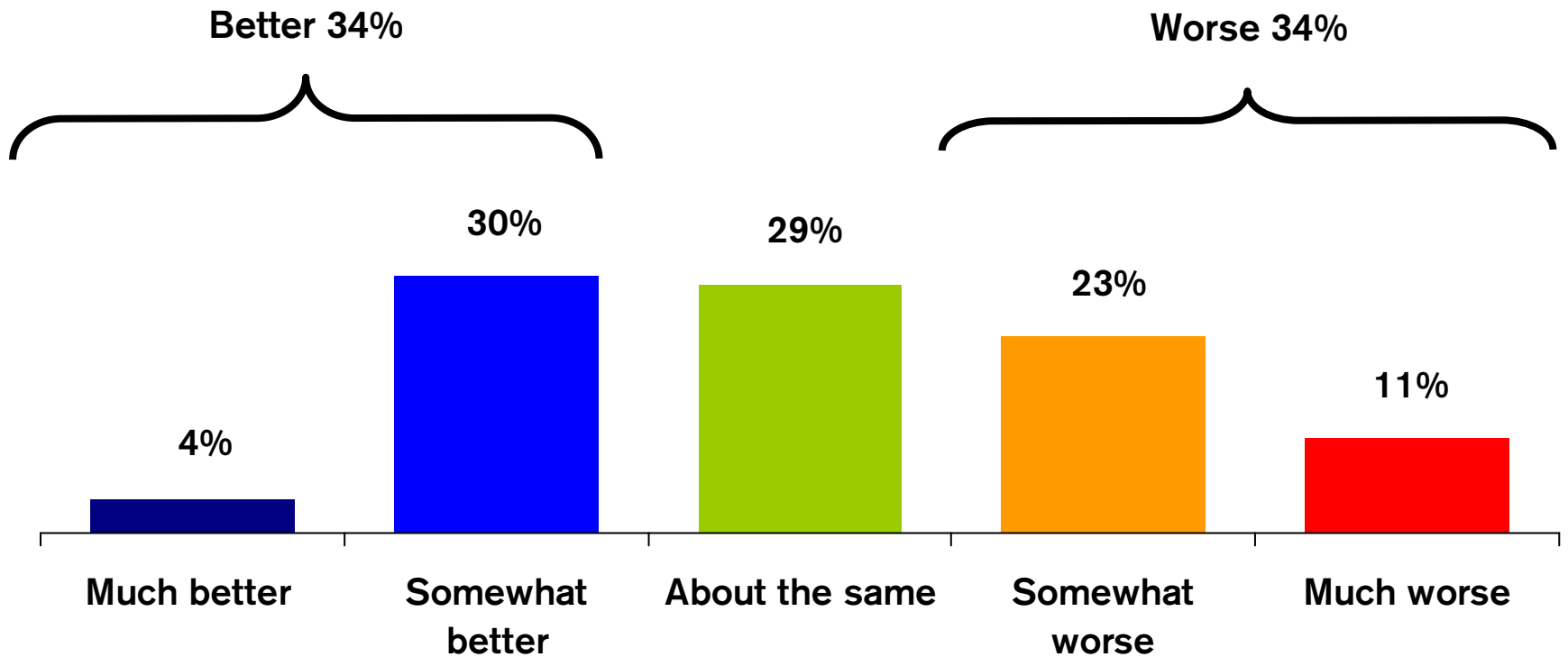
# Two-thirds feel province is on right track

# Ontarians split as to whether Liberal policies have <sup>12</sup> made Ontario better or worse

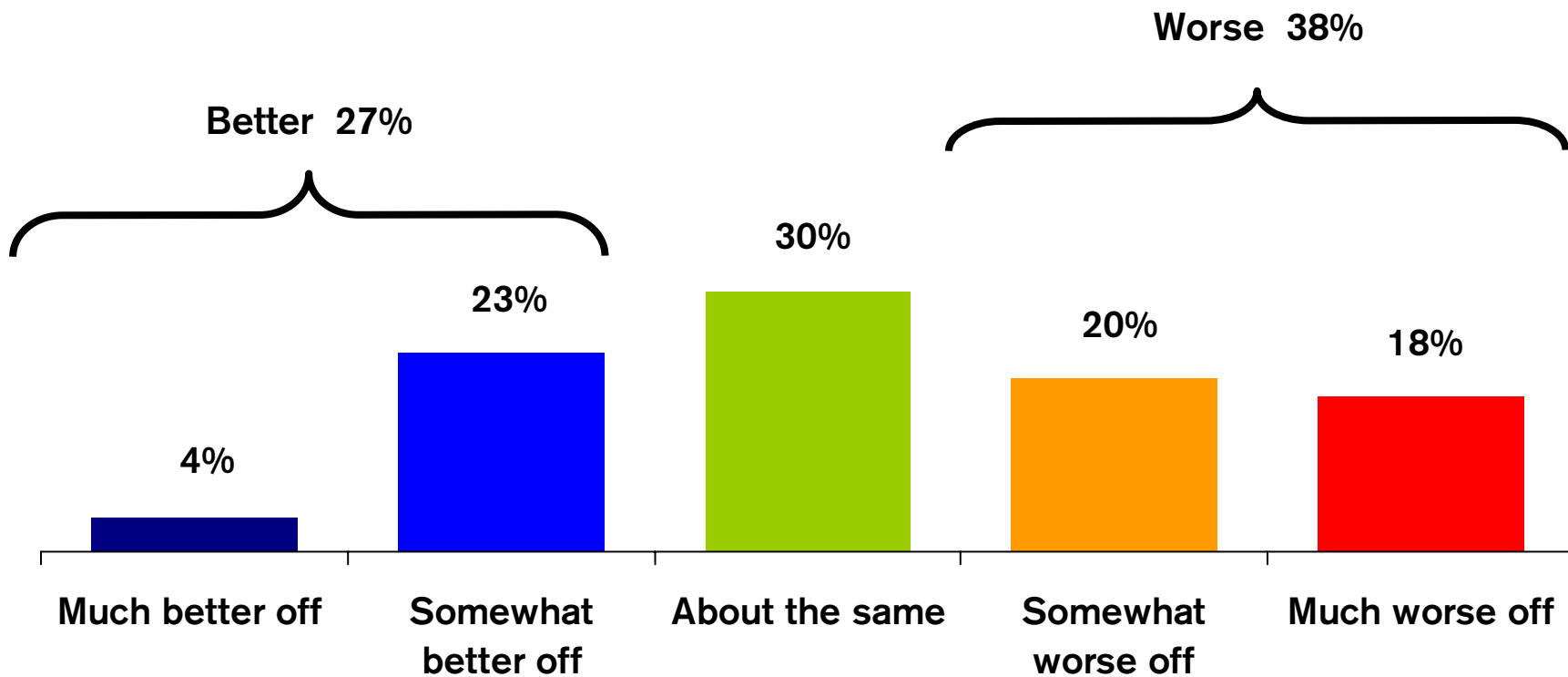
Do you feel that the policies implemented by the current Liberal provincial government since it was first elected in 2003 have made Ontario better or worse overall?

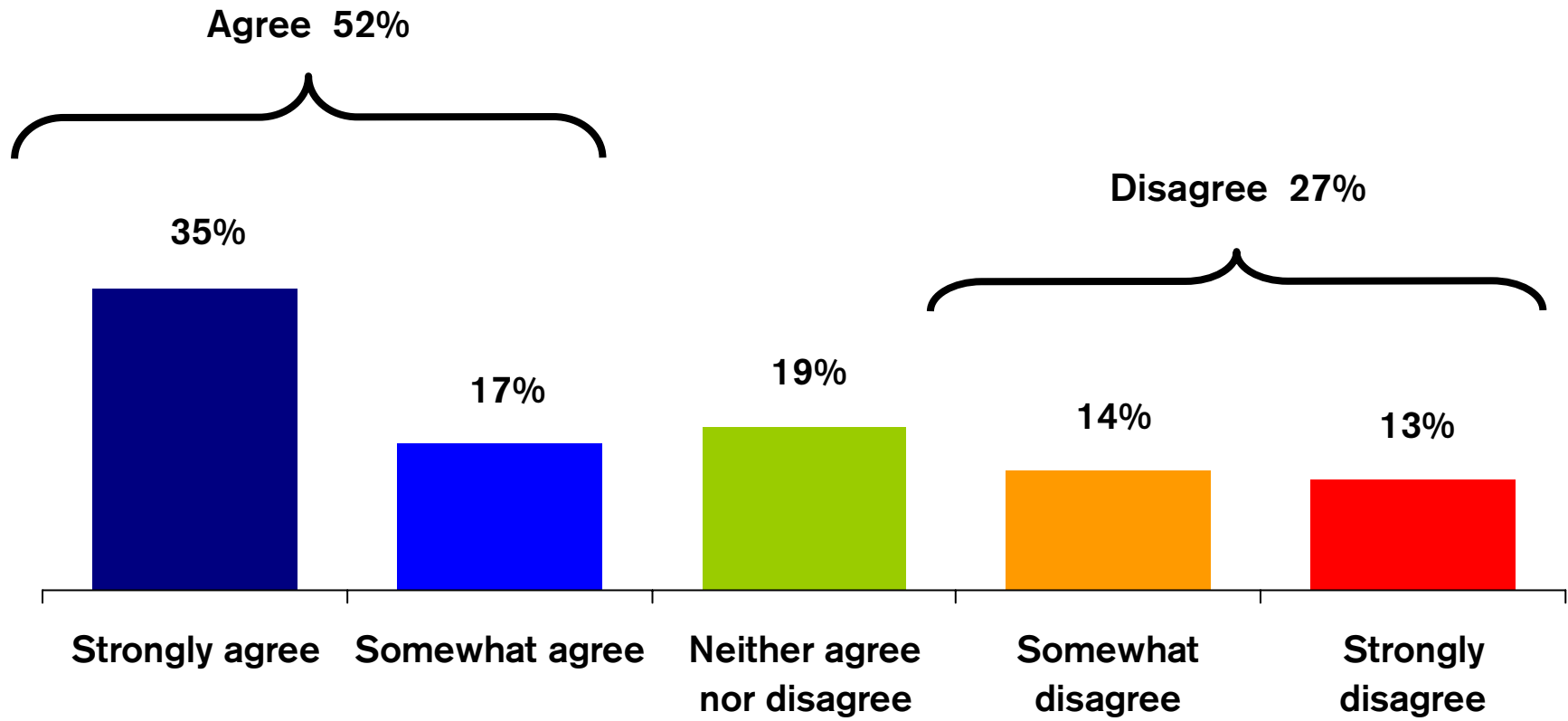
In your opinion, if the current provincial government is re-elected and continues its policies, do you think Ontario will be better off or worse off in five years time, that is, in 2012, than it is today?

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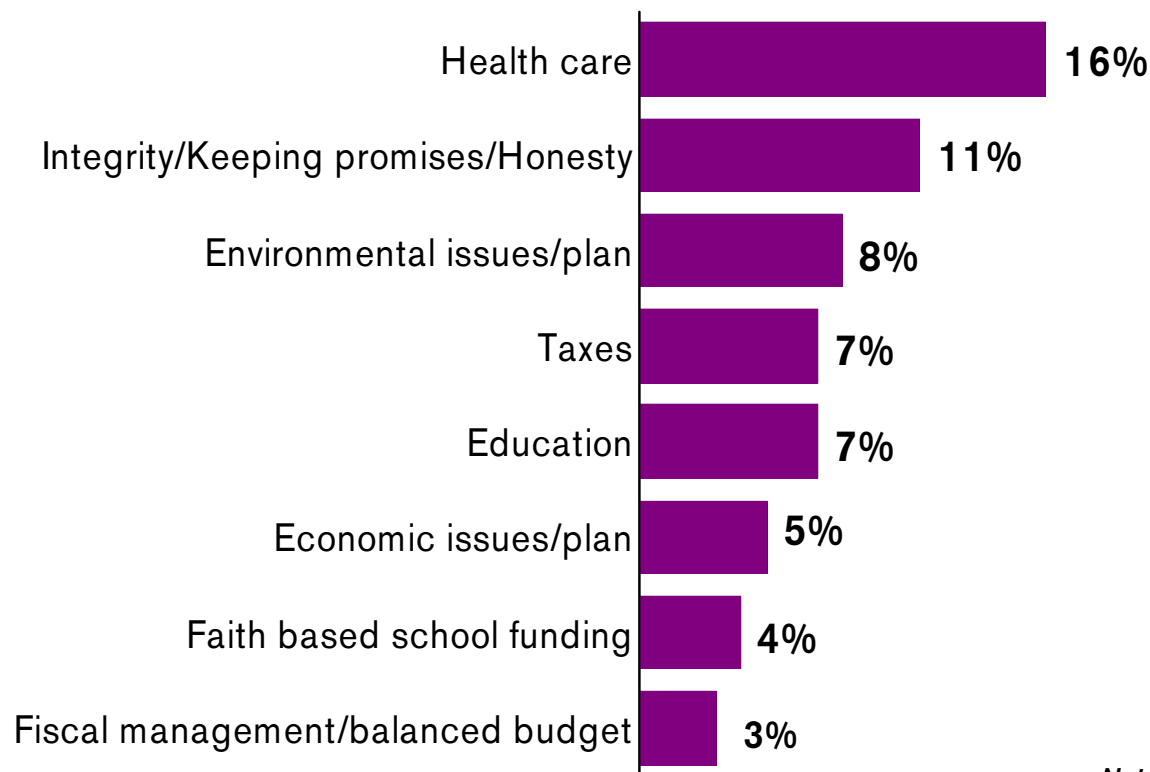

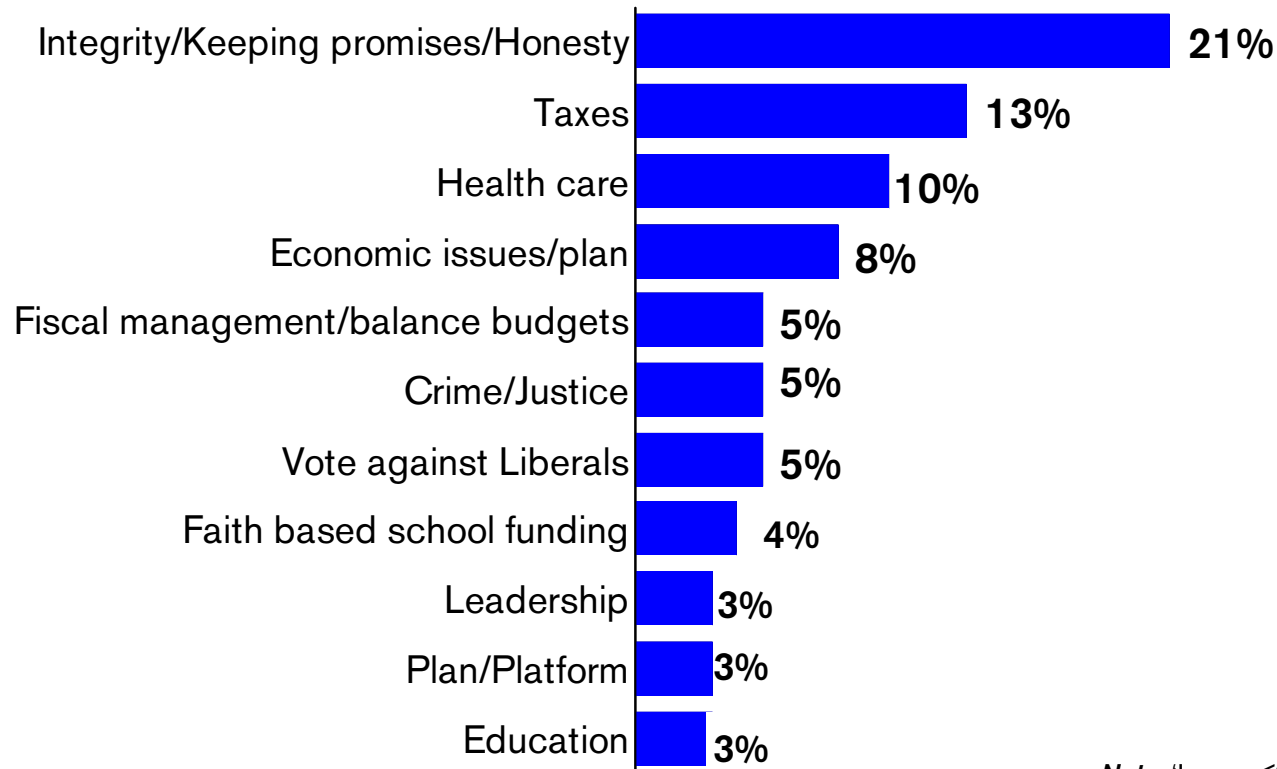

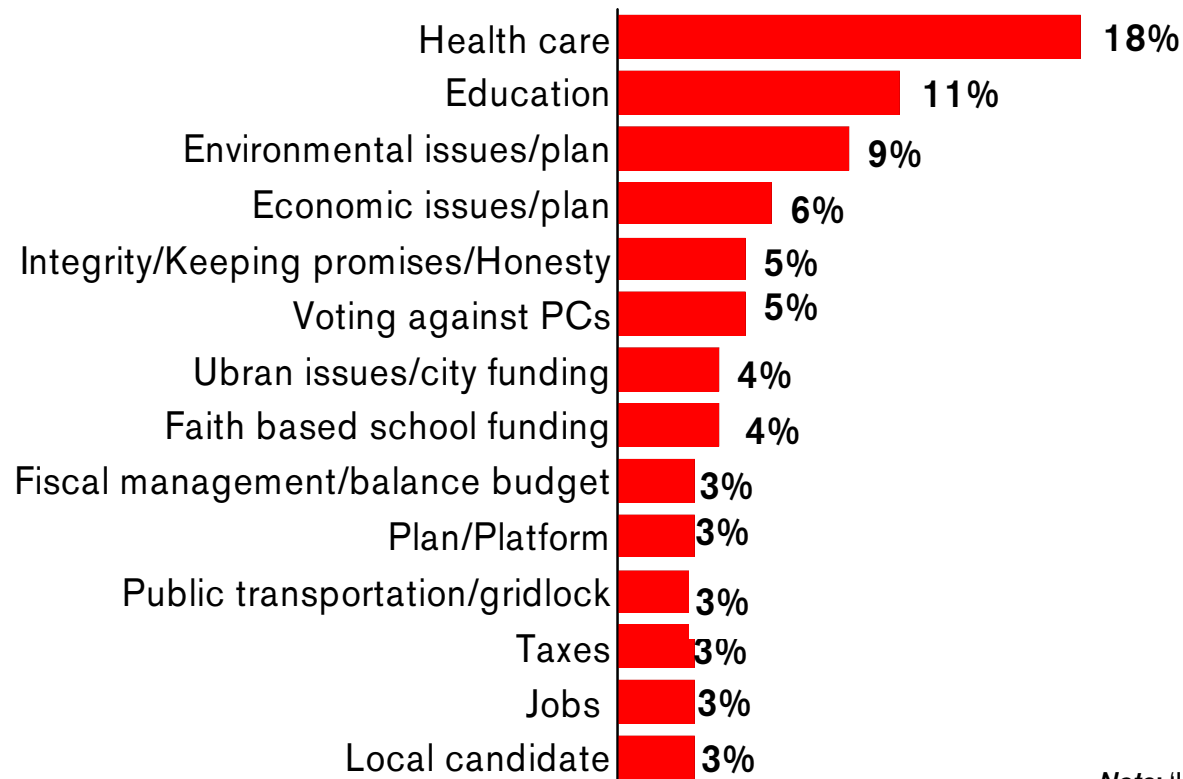

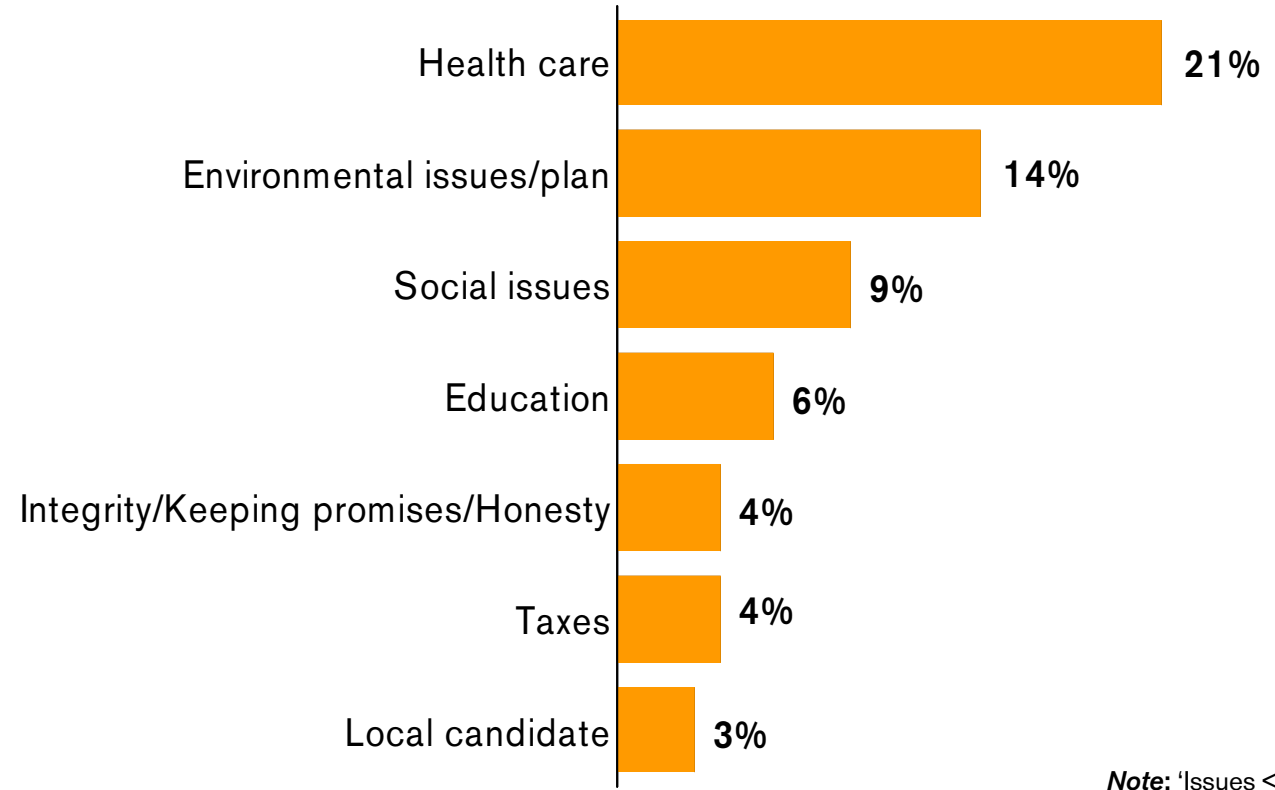

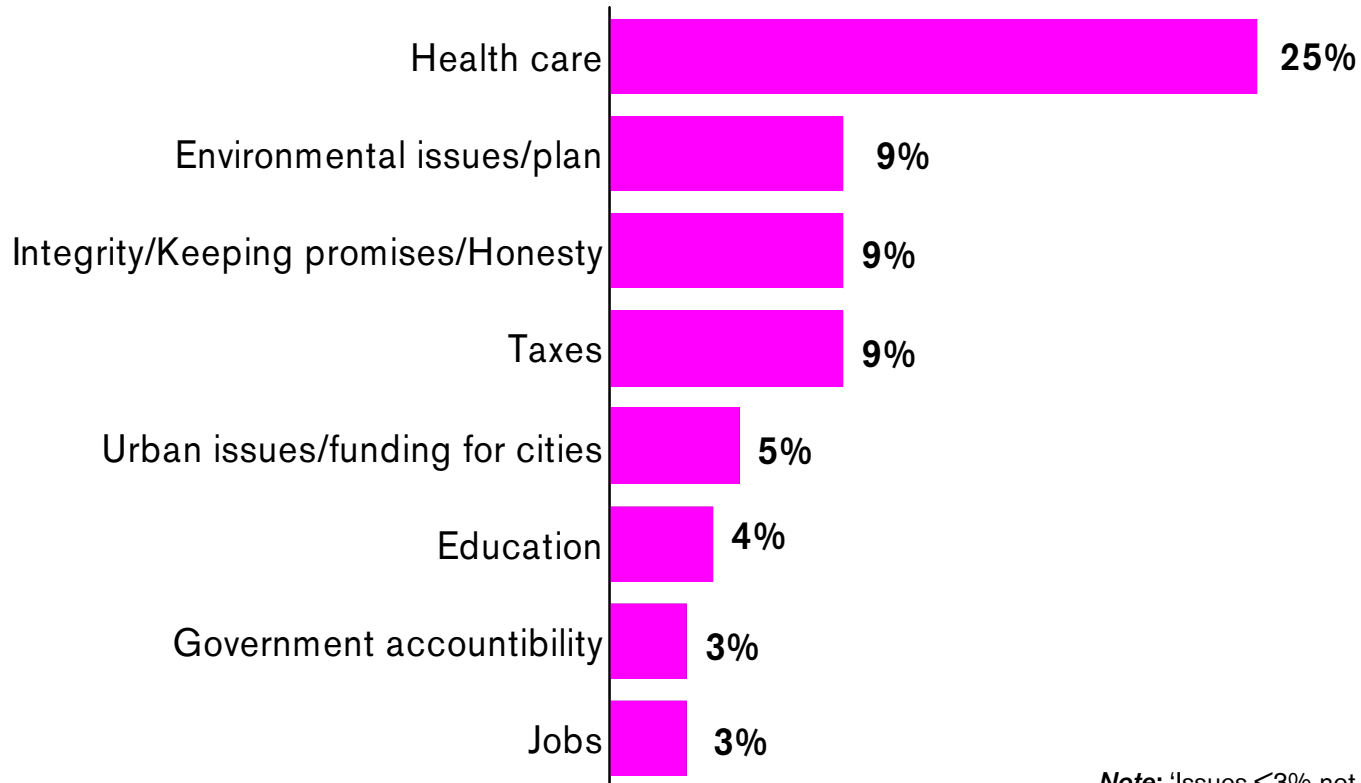

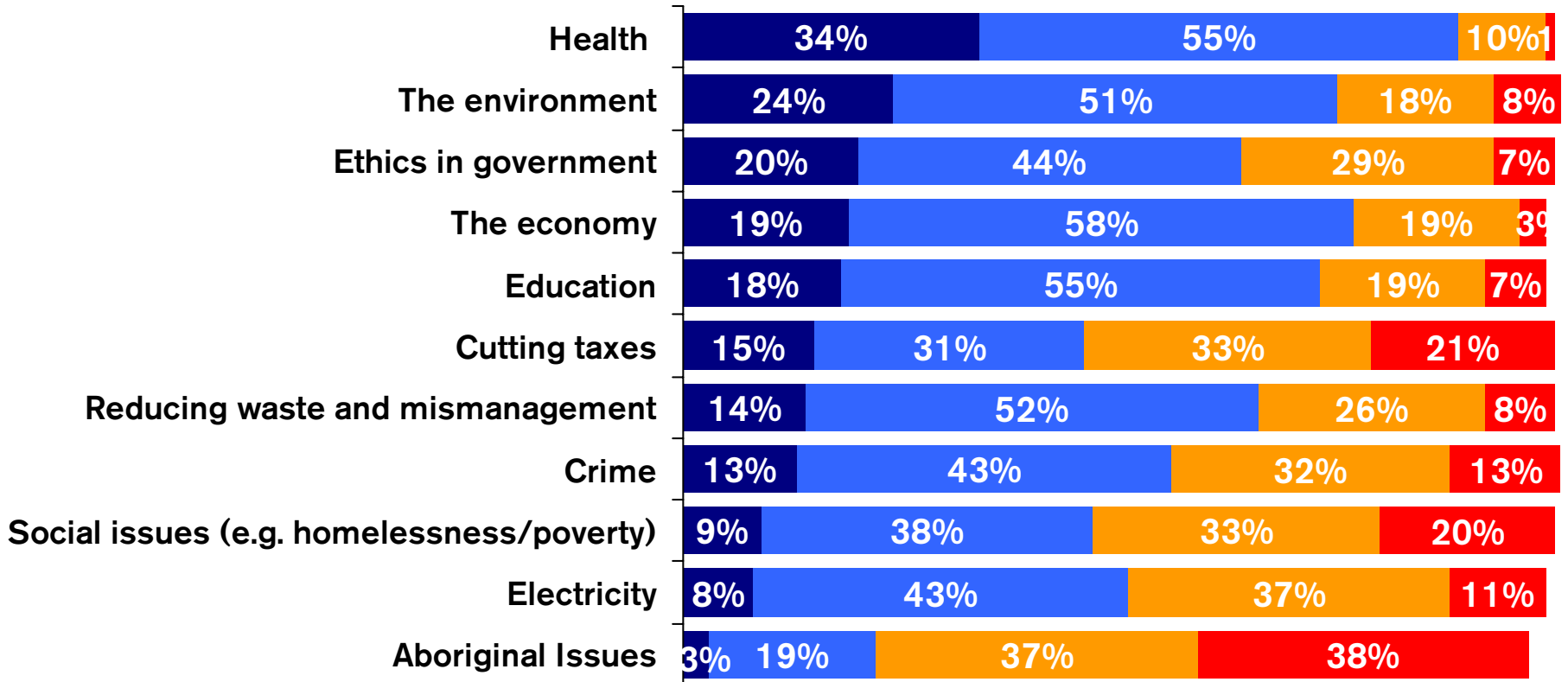

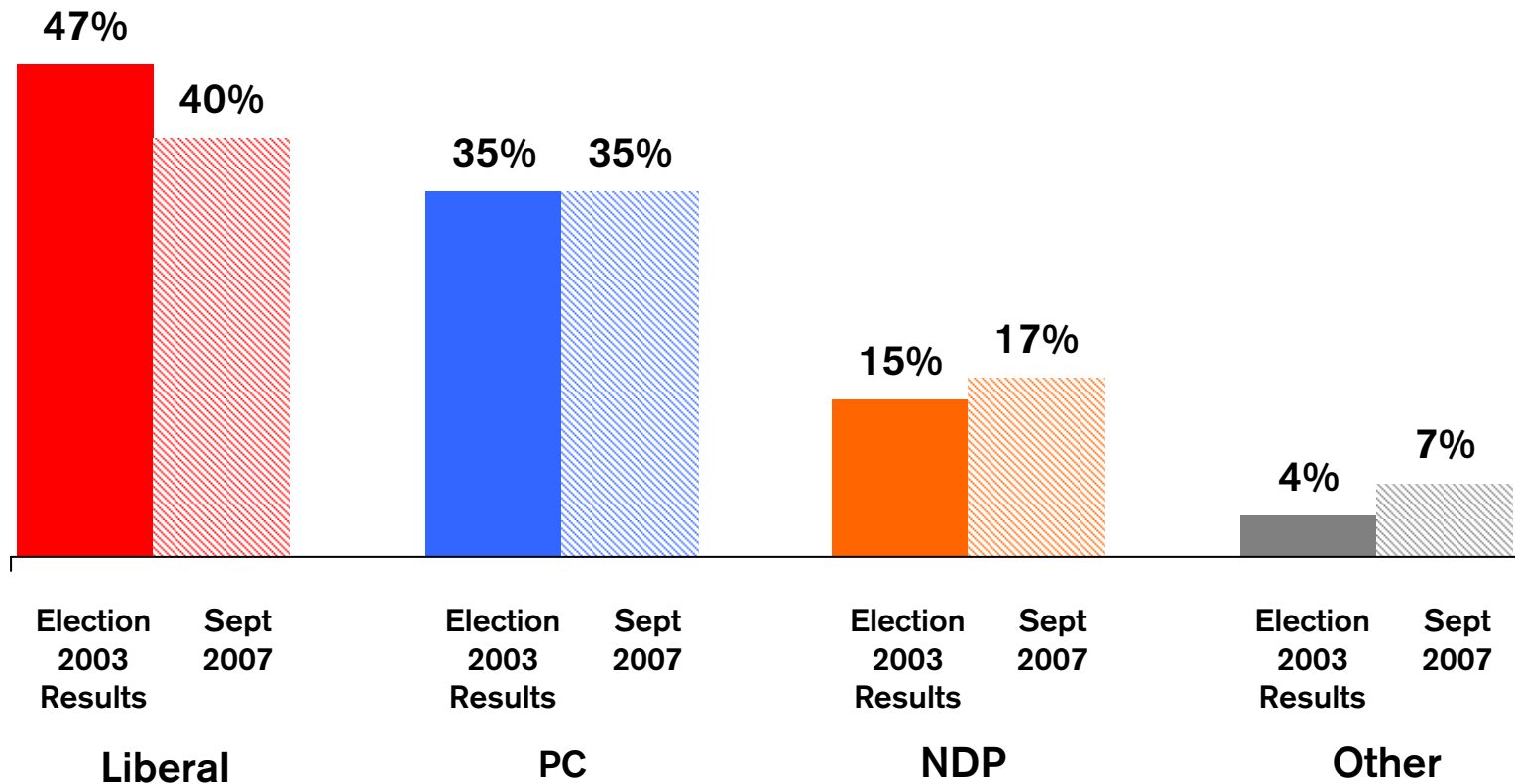

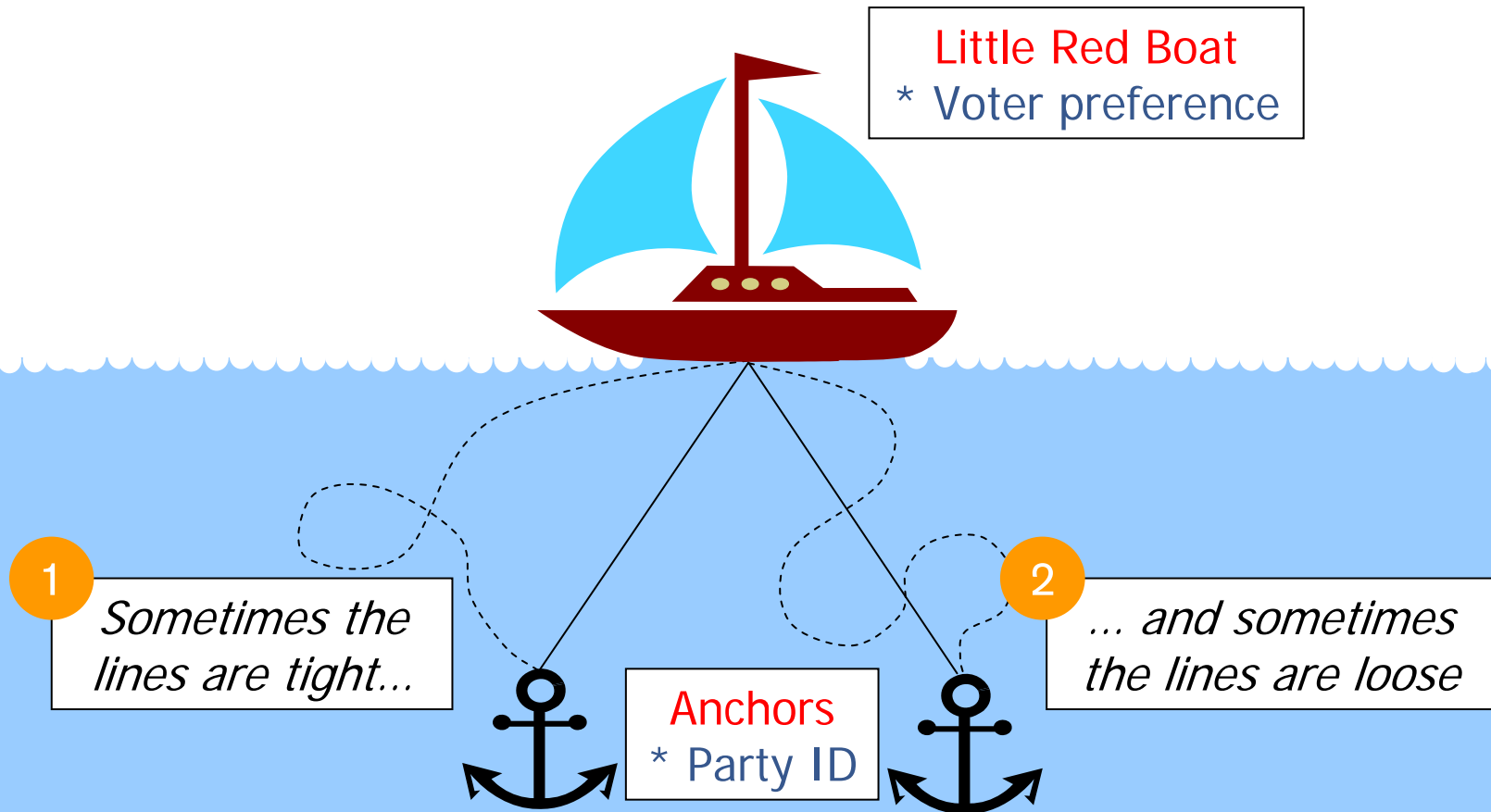

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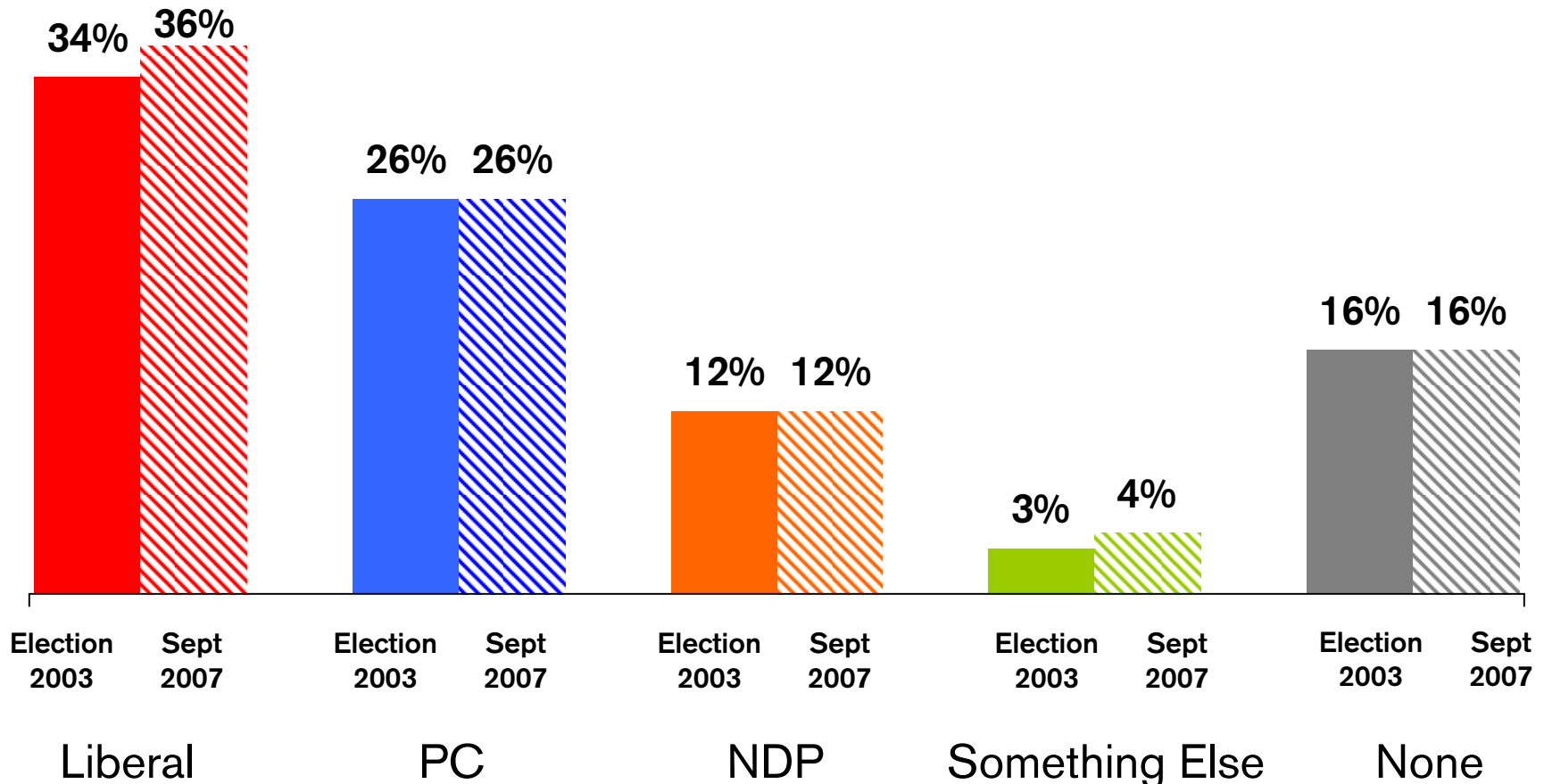

# Identification with parties on par with 2003 election

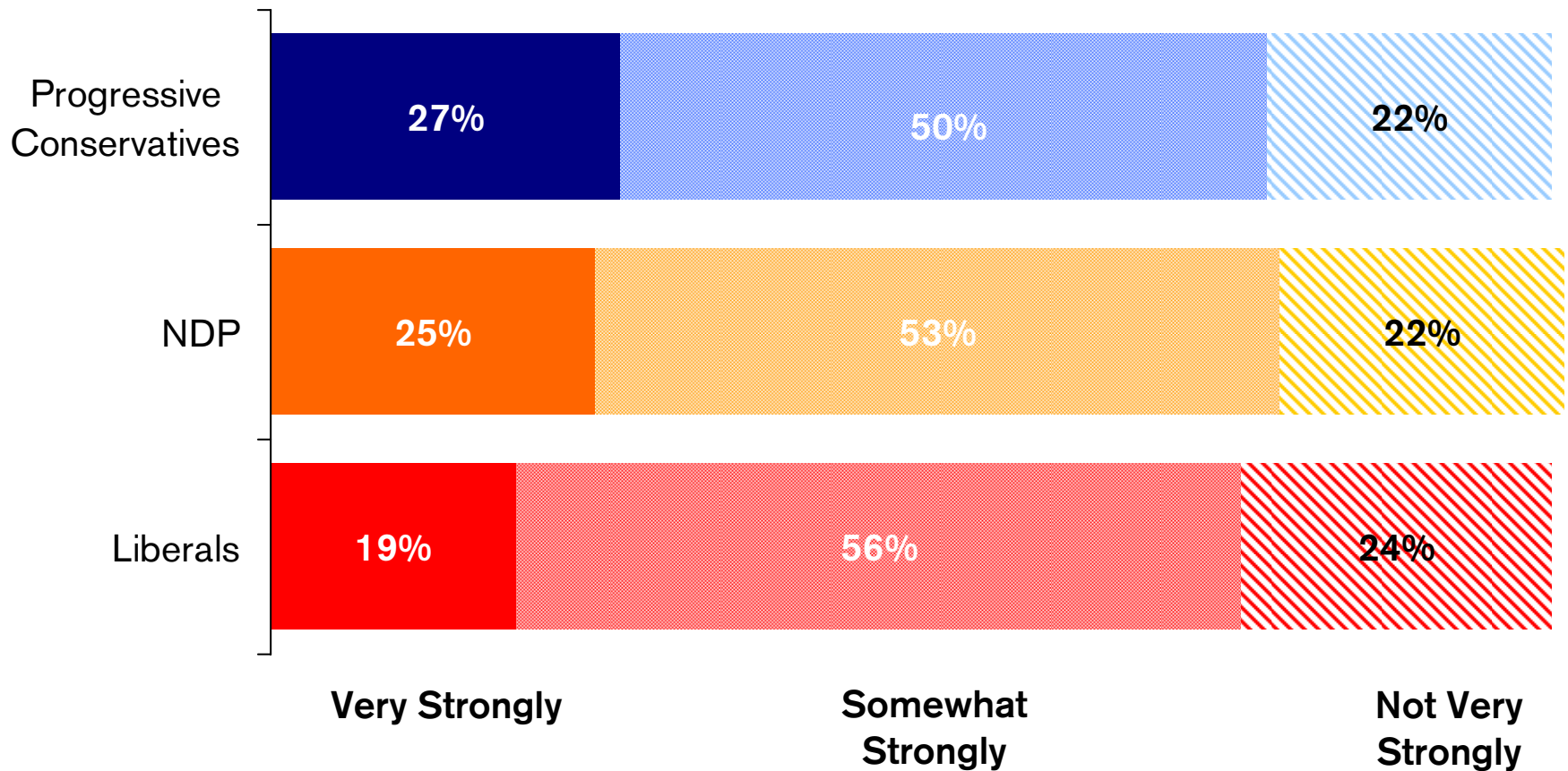
Thinking about politics in ONTARIO, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a Progressive Conservative, Liberal, New Democrat, something else or none of these?

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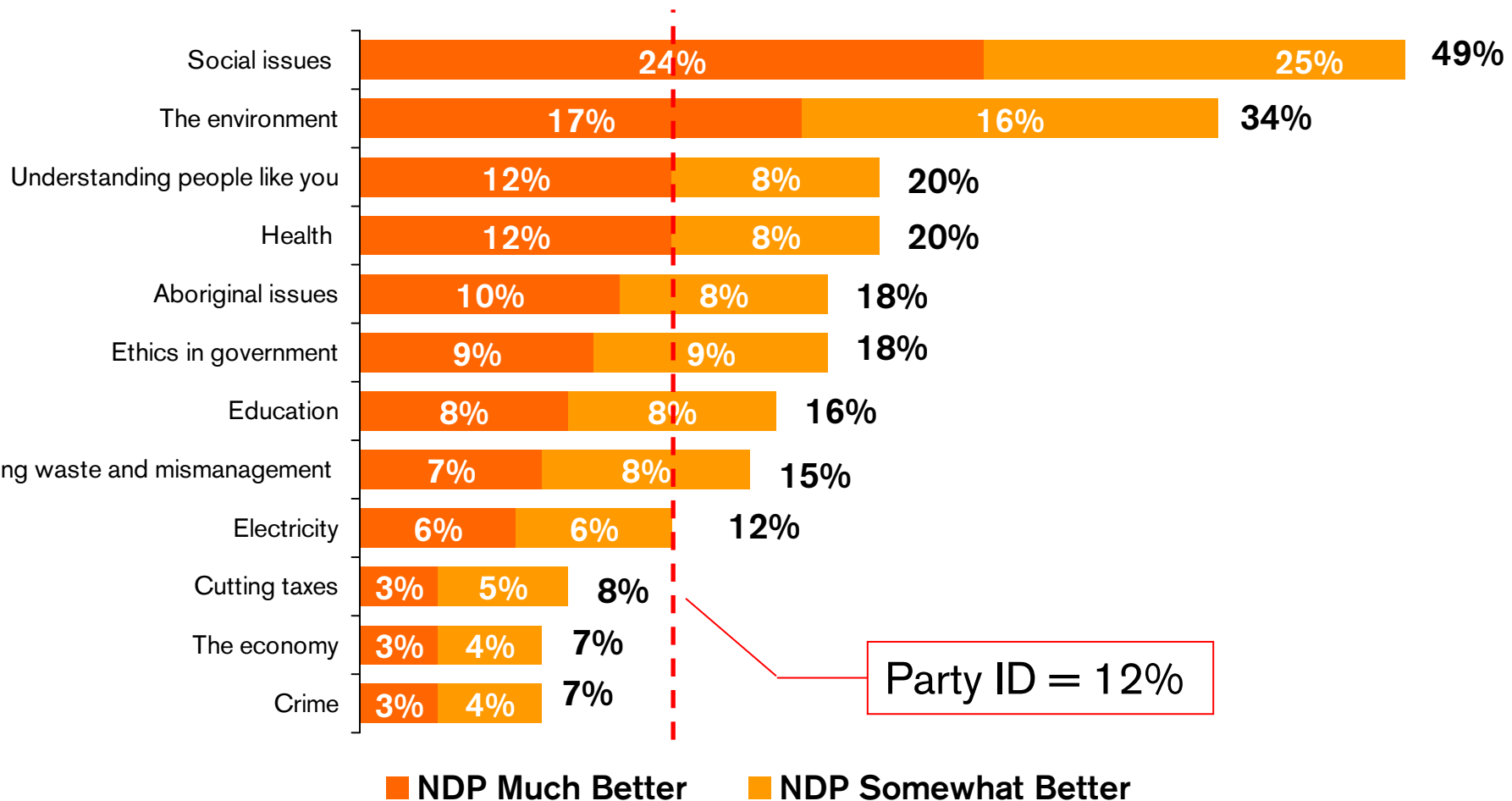

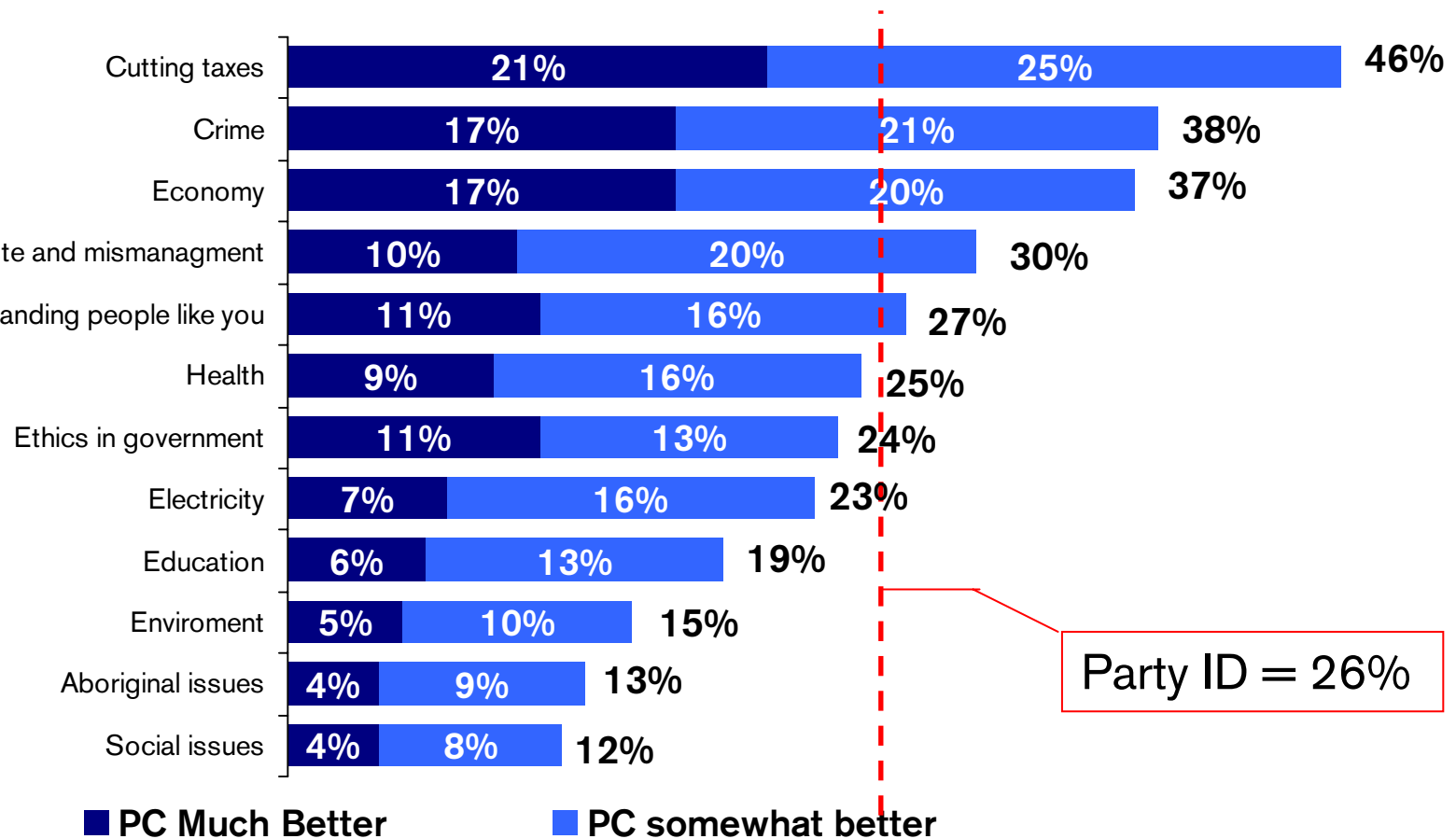

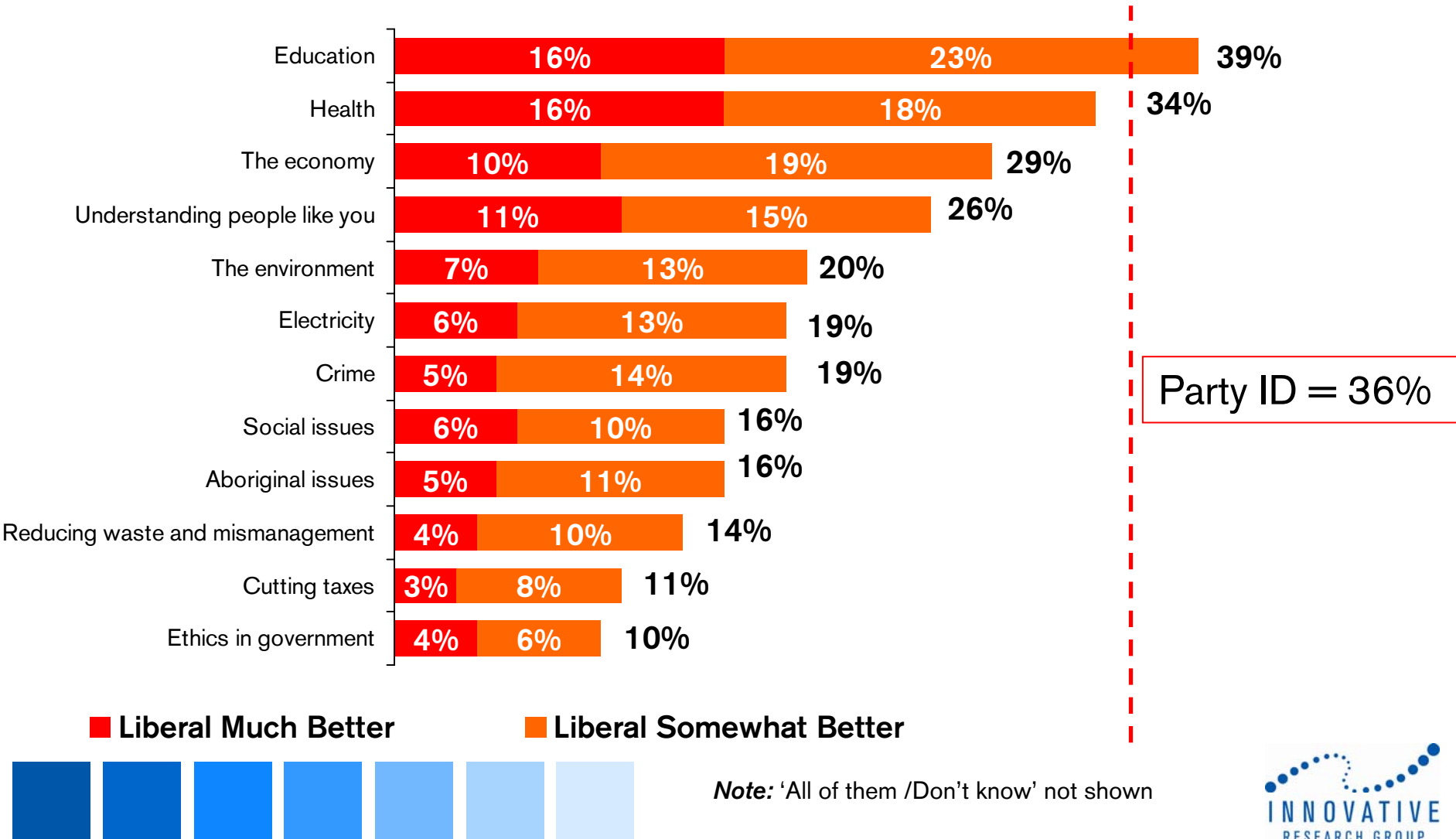

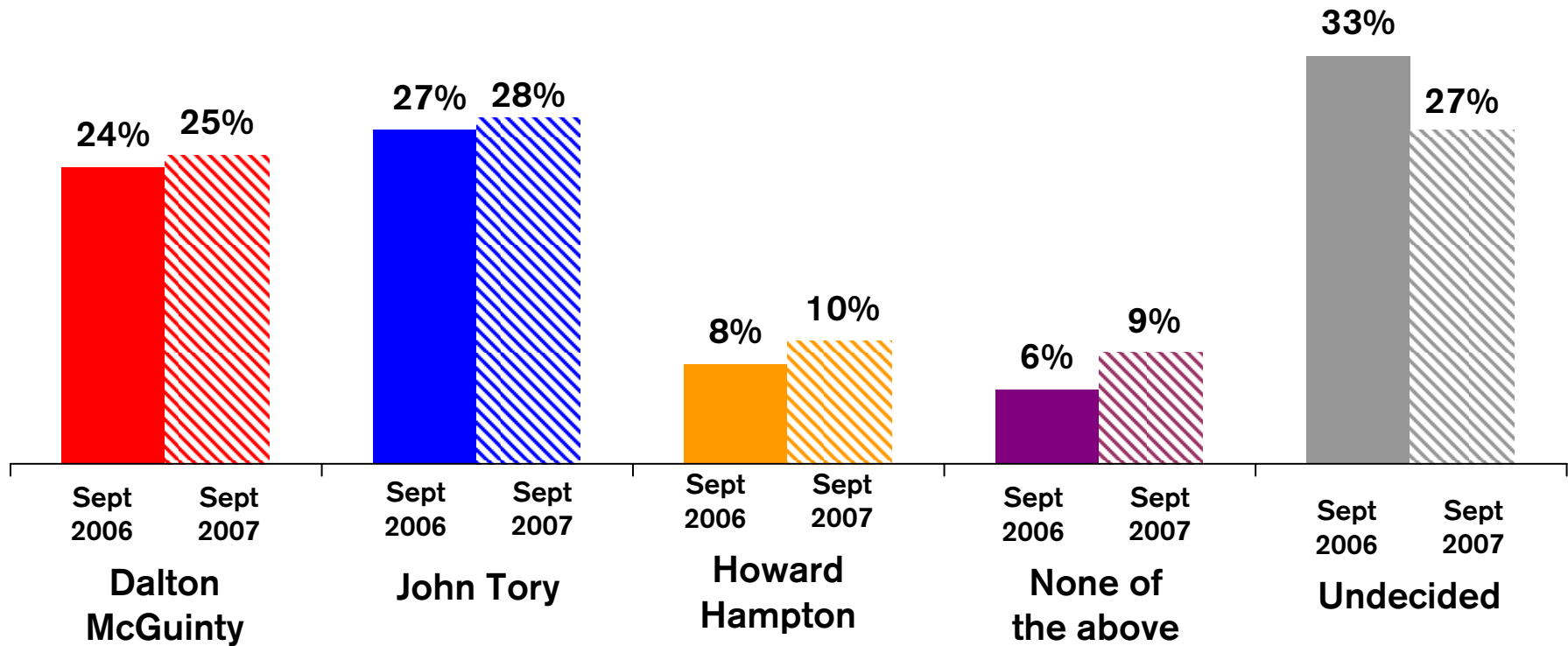

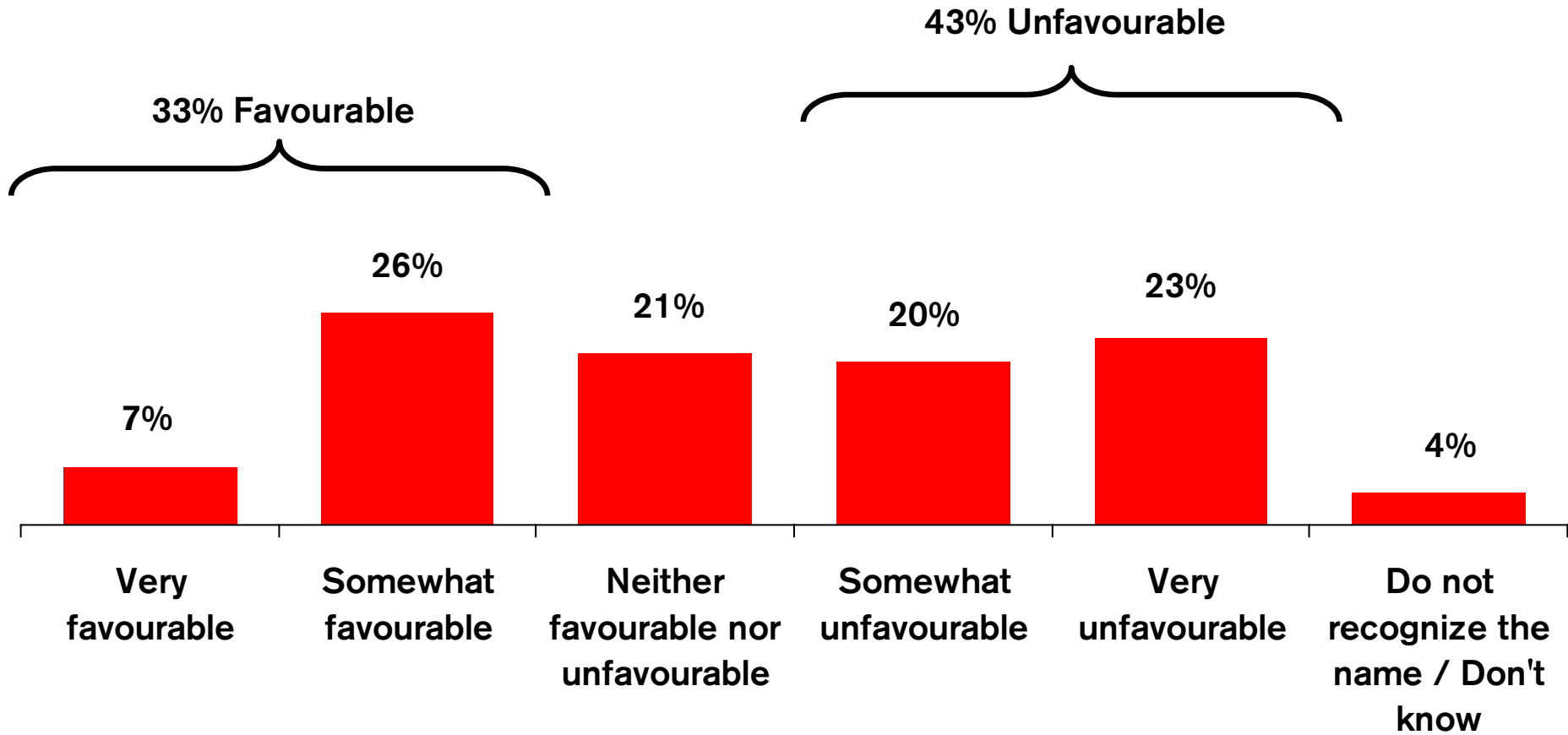
Which of the following leaders would make the best Premier of Ontario?

What is your impression of Dalton McGuinty?

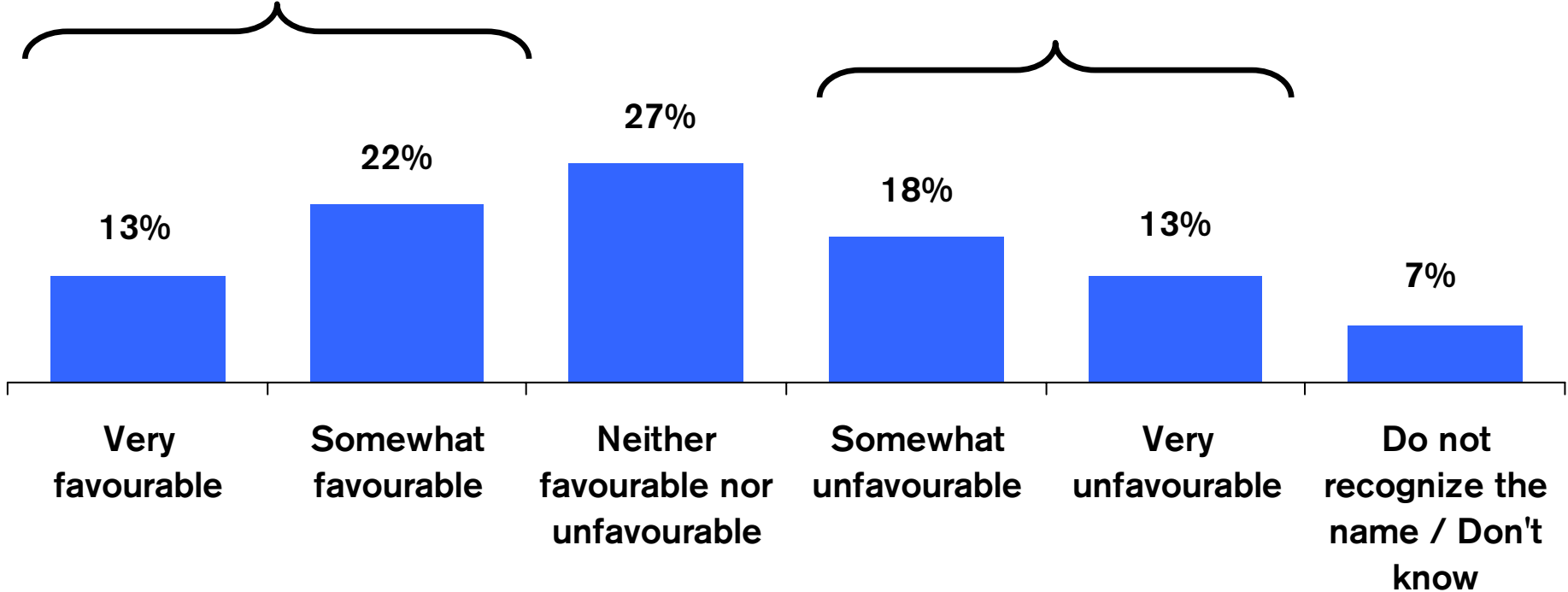


# One-third have favourable impression of Tory

What is your impression of John Tory?

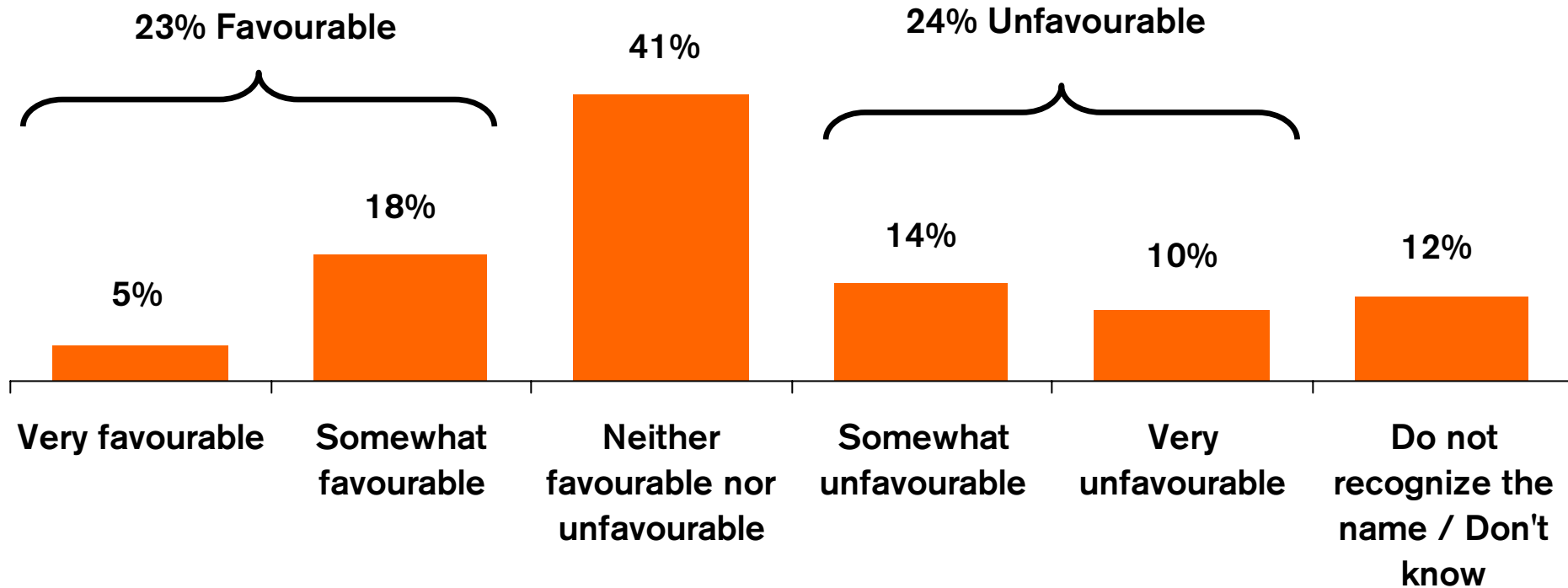

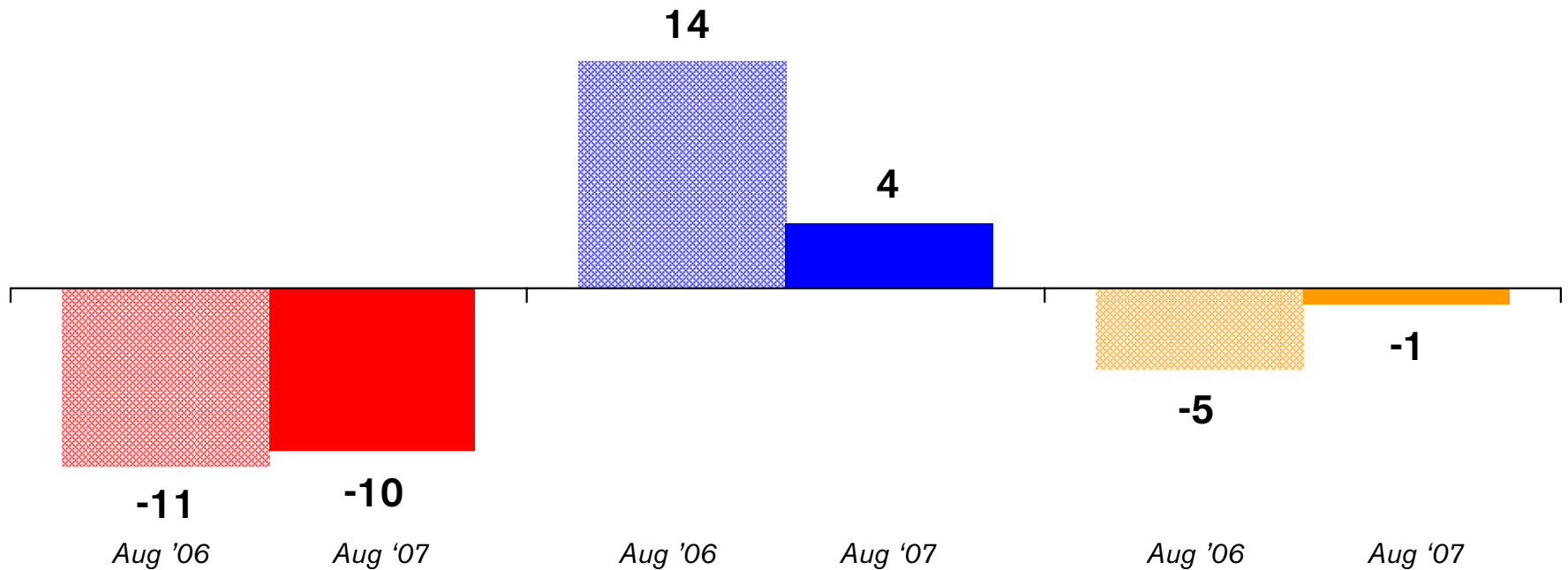
What is your impression of Howard Hampton?

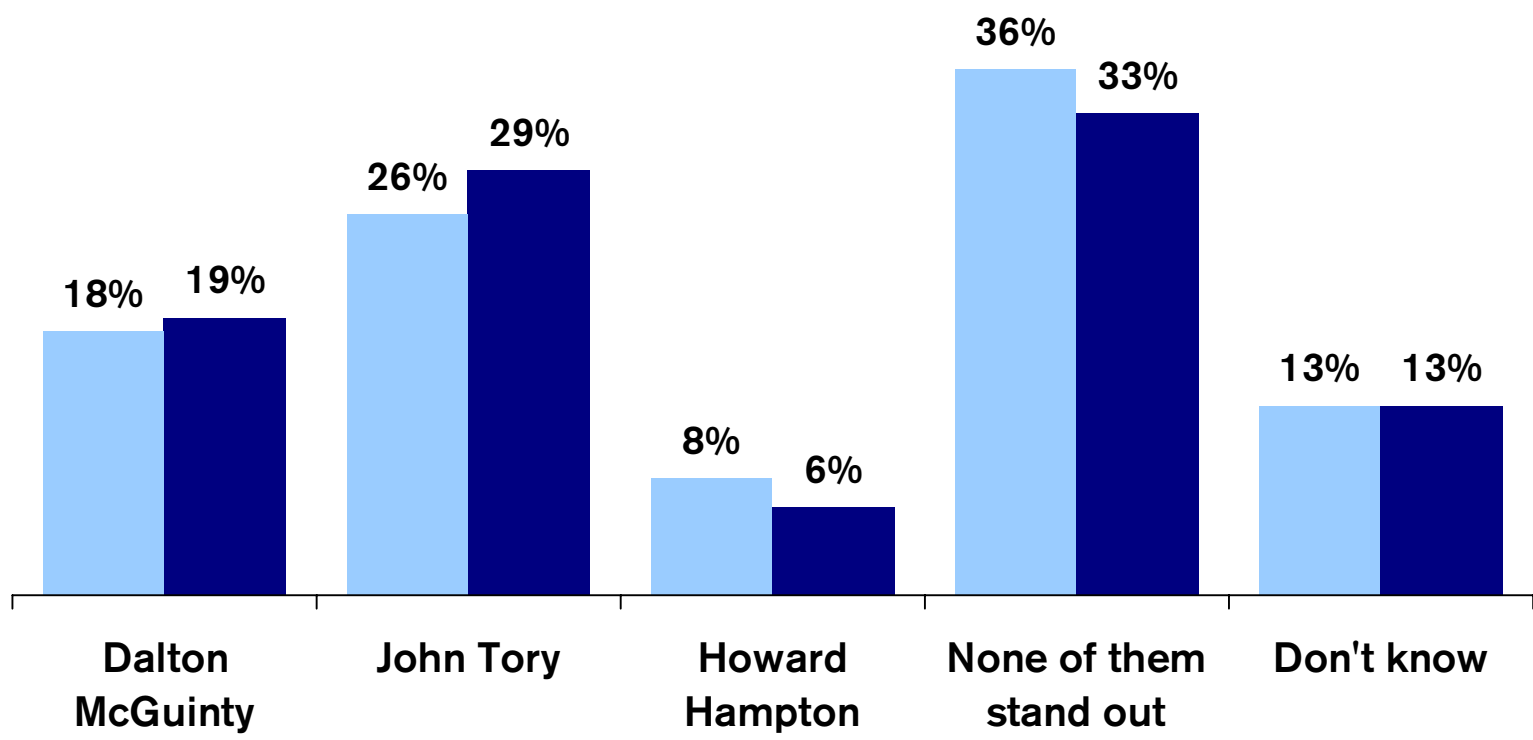

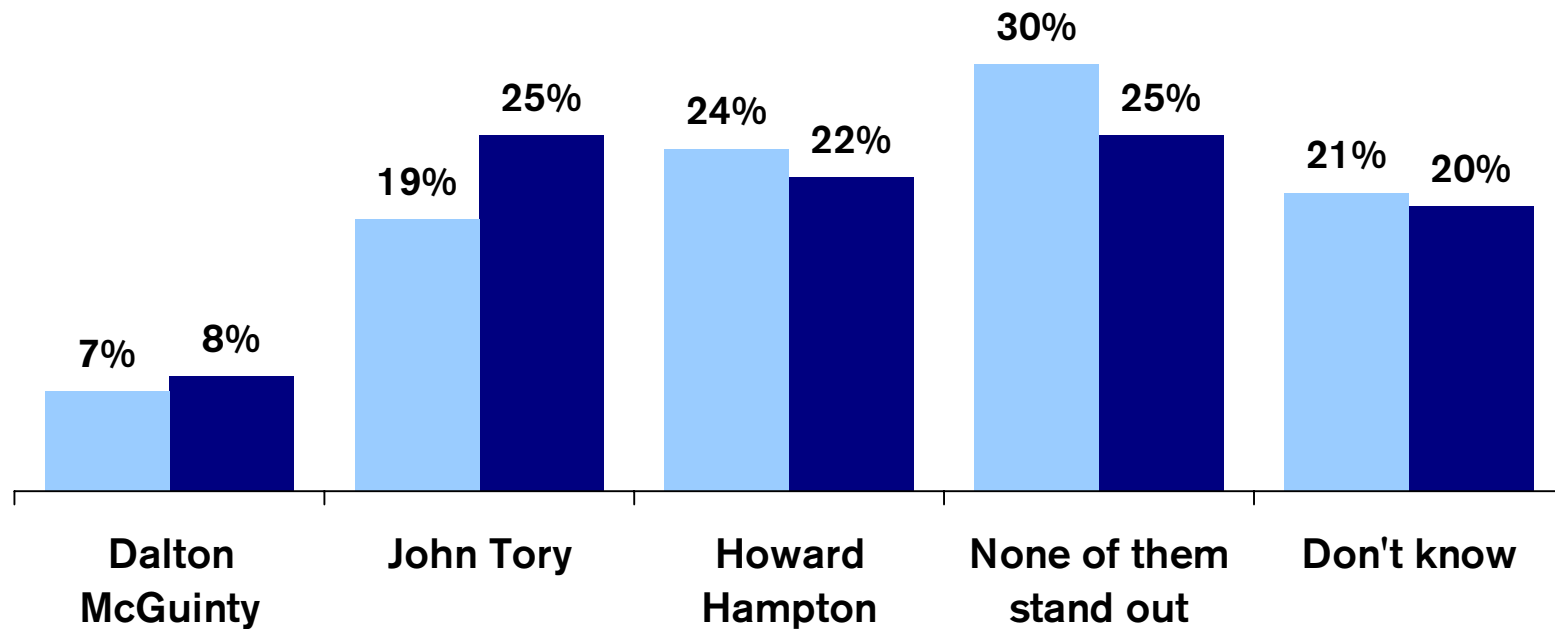

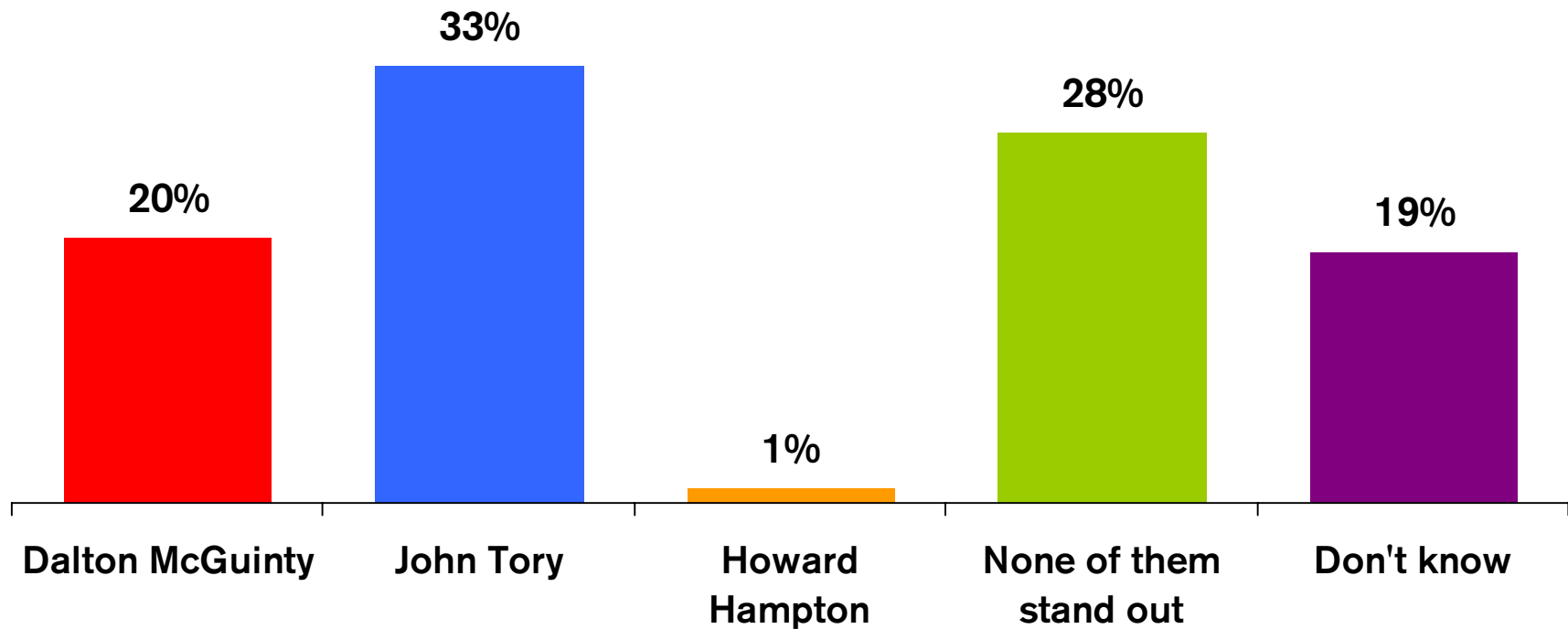

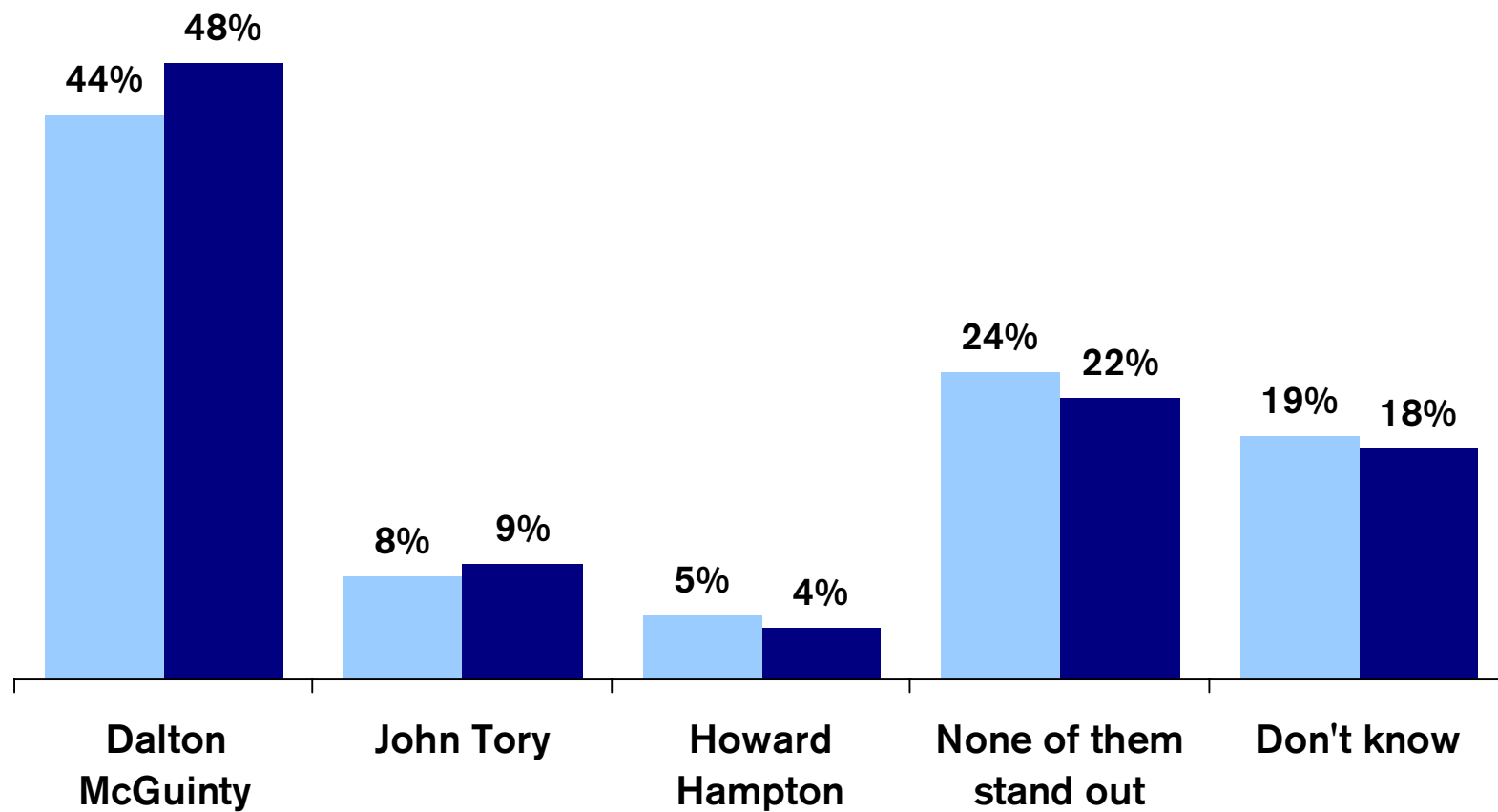

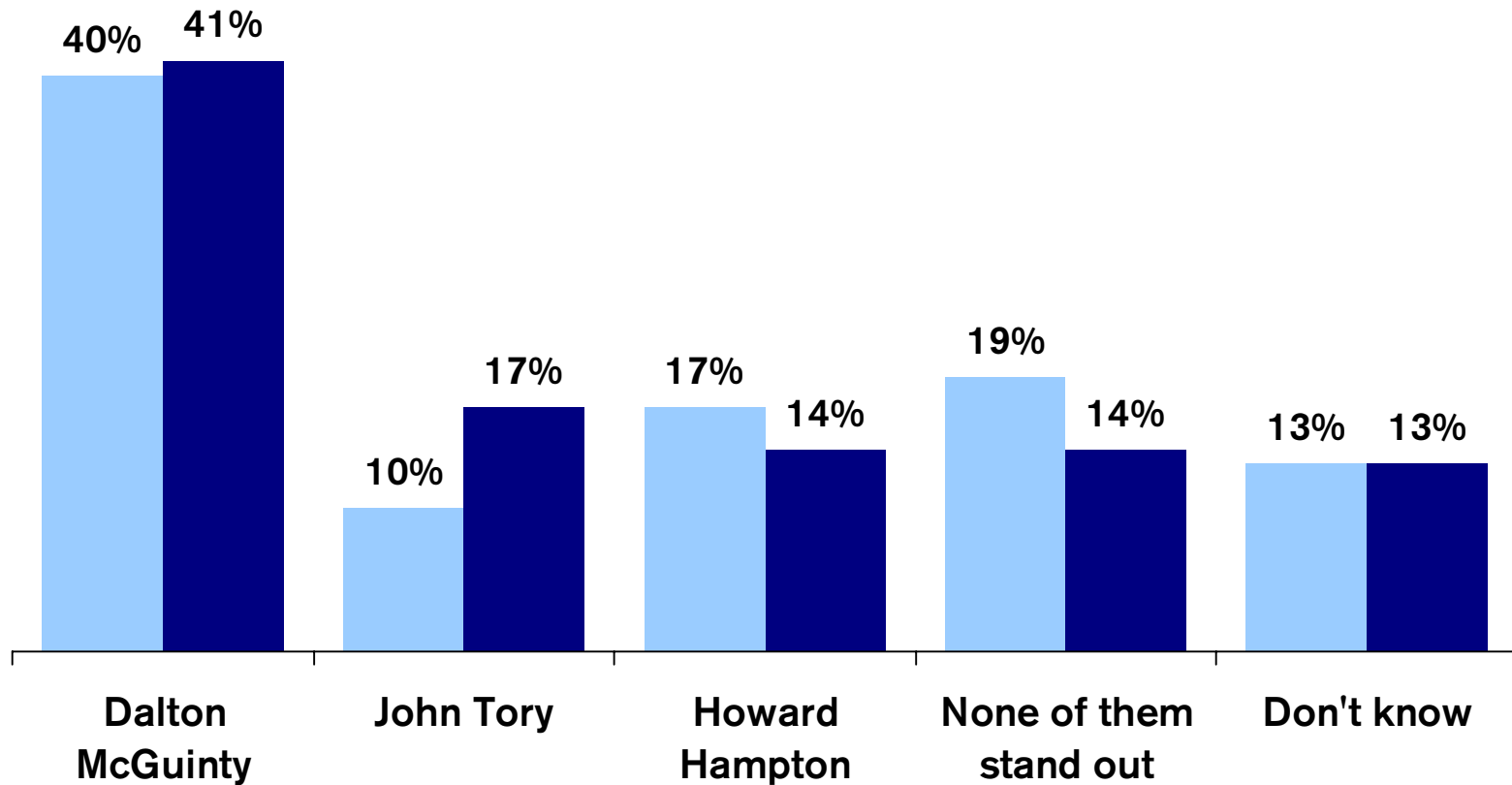

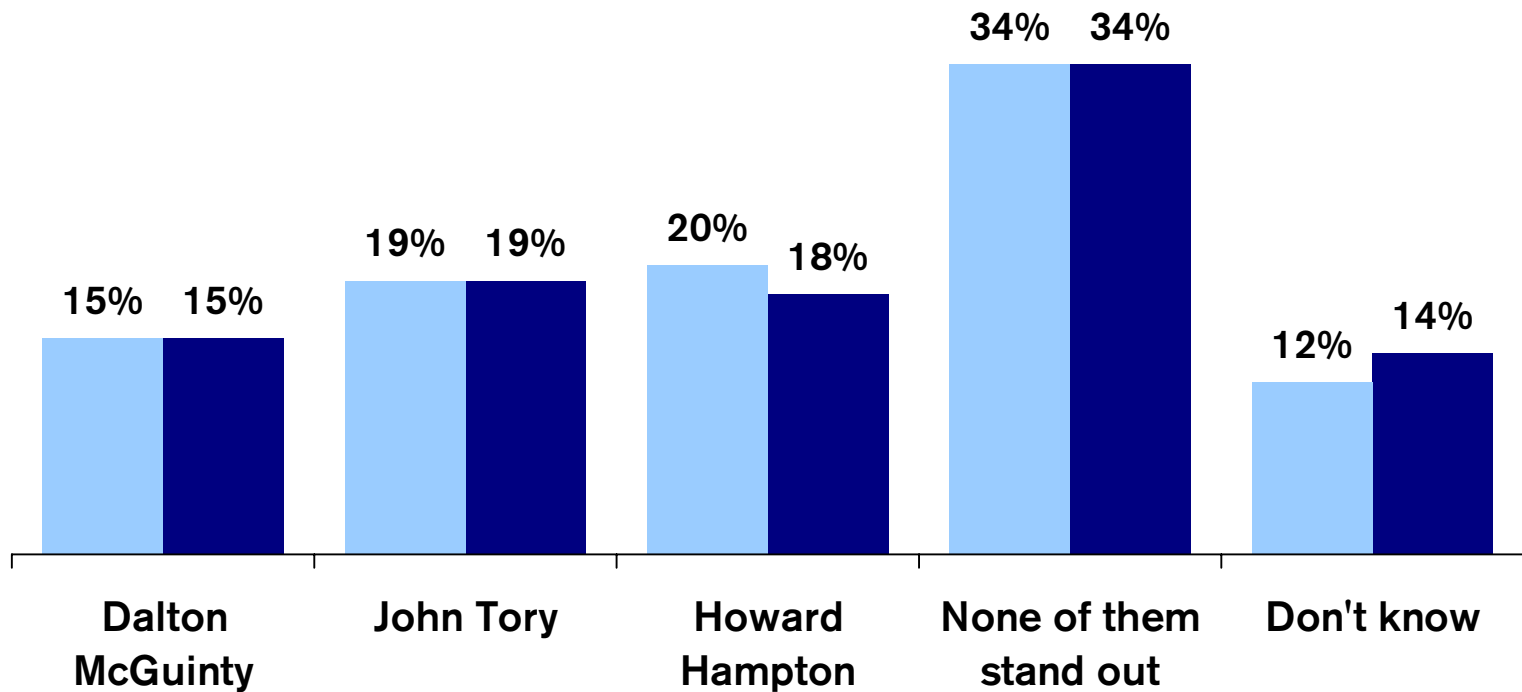

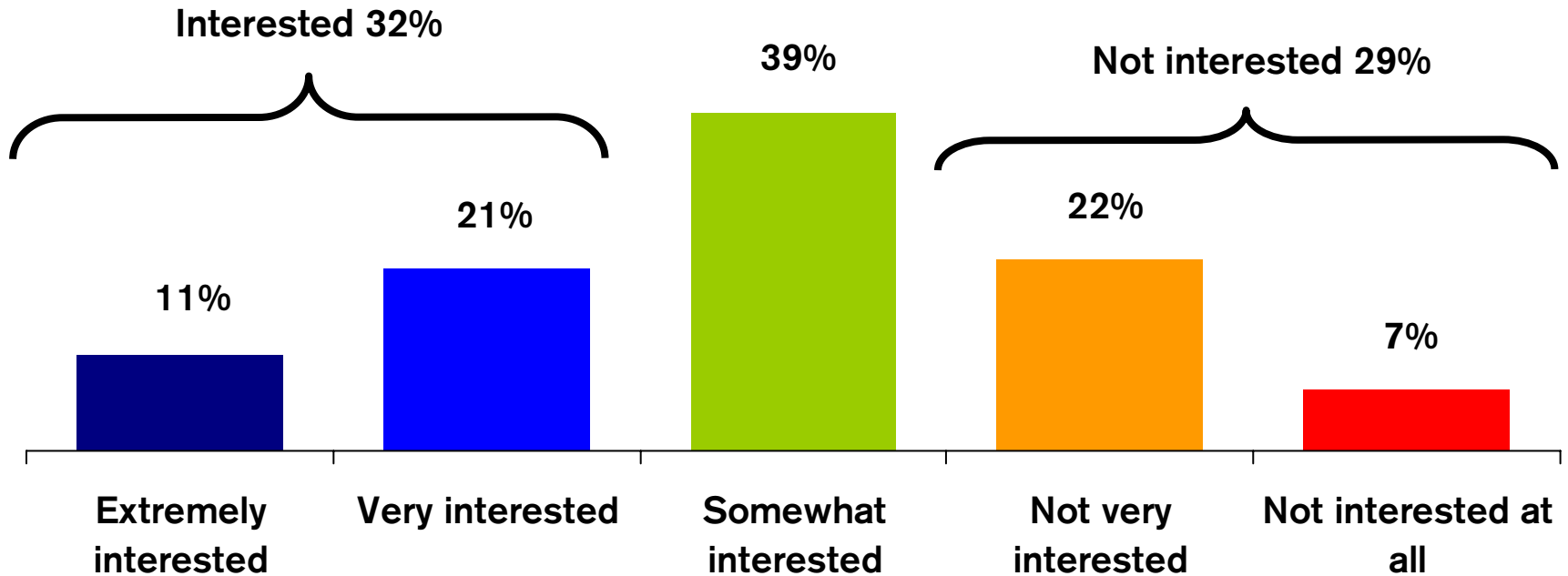

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# One-third say they are extremely or very interested<sup>51</sup> in upcoming election

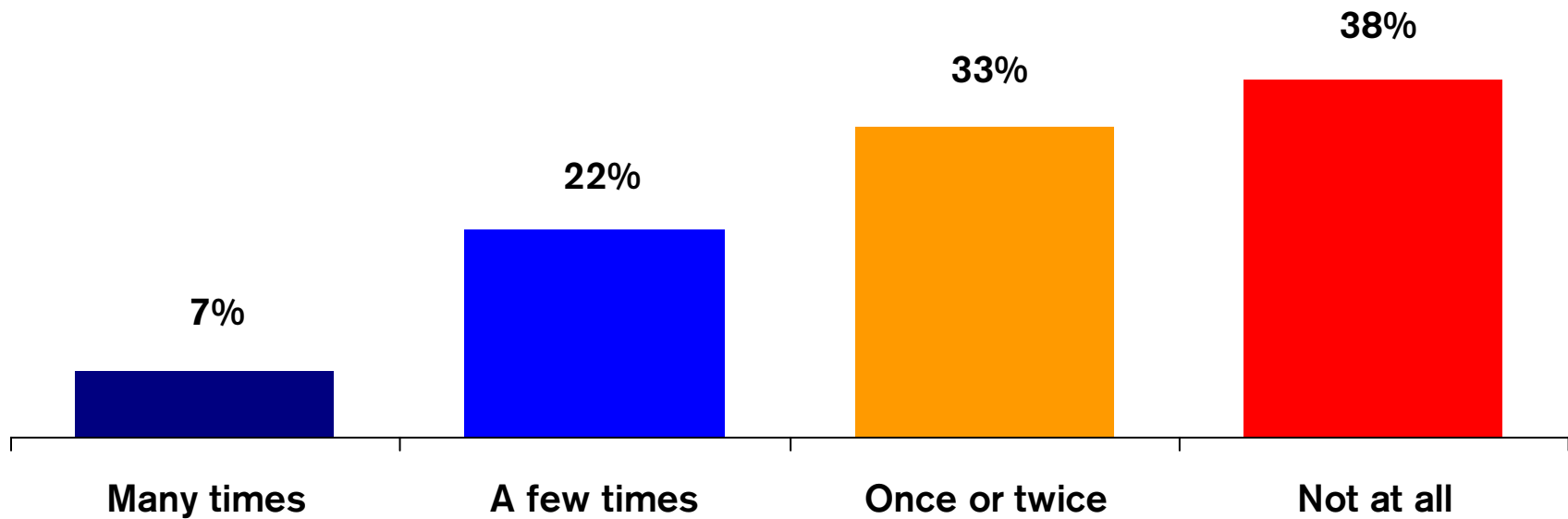

# Three-in-ten have discussed upcoming election in the past week at least a few times

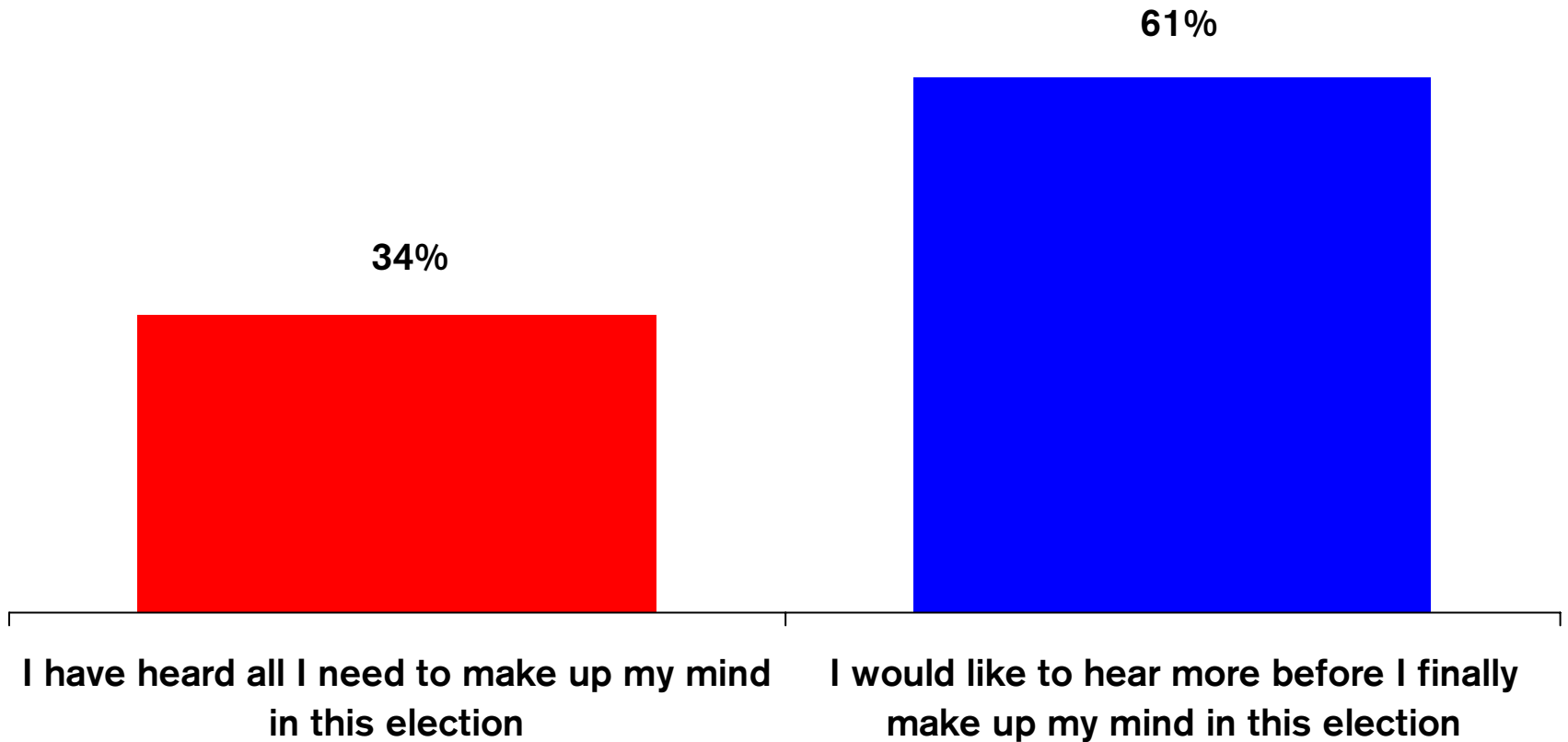
Over the past week, how often would you say you have discussed the upcoming provincial election?

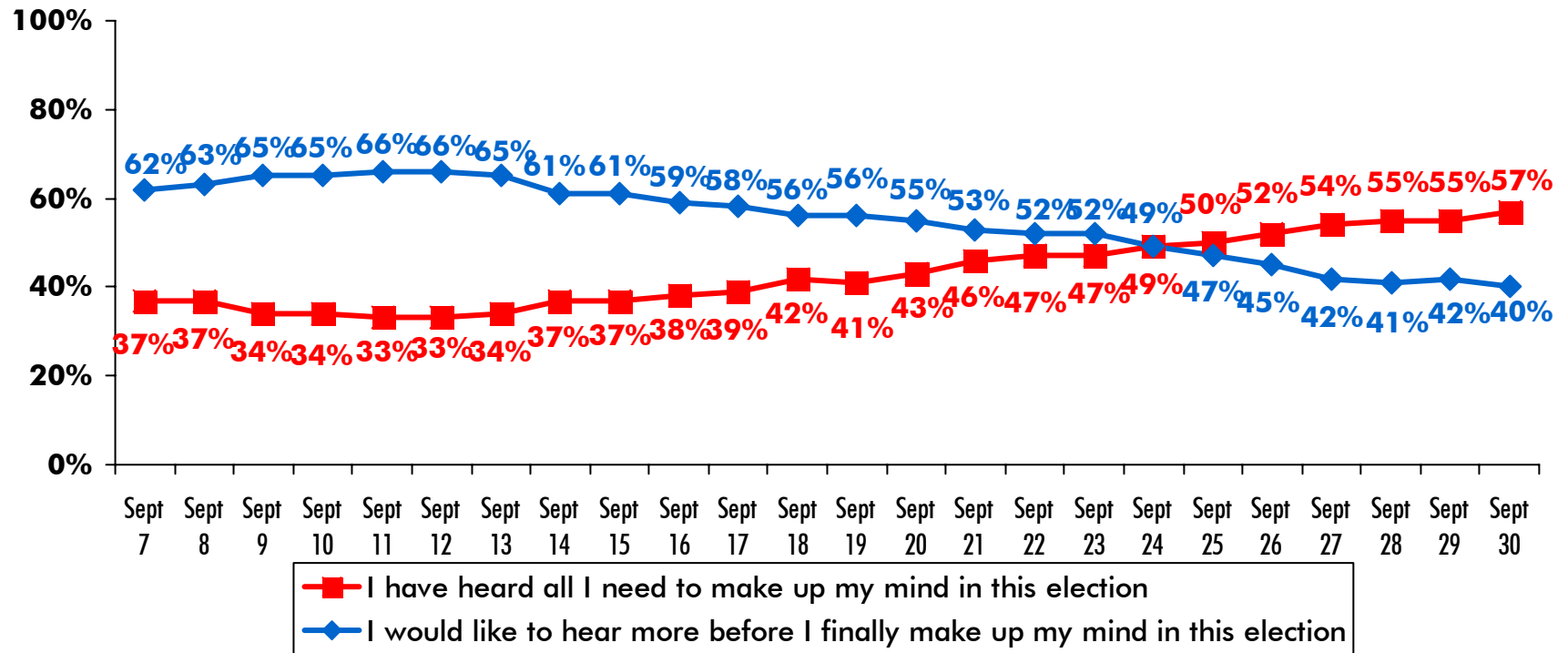
Which statement is closest to your view?

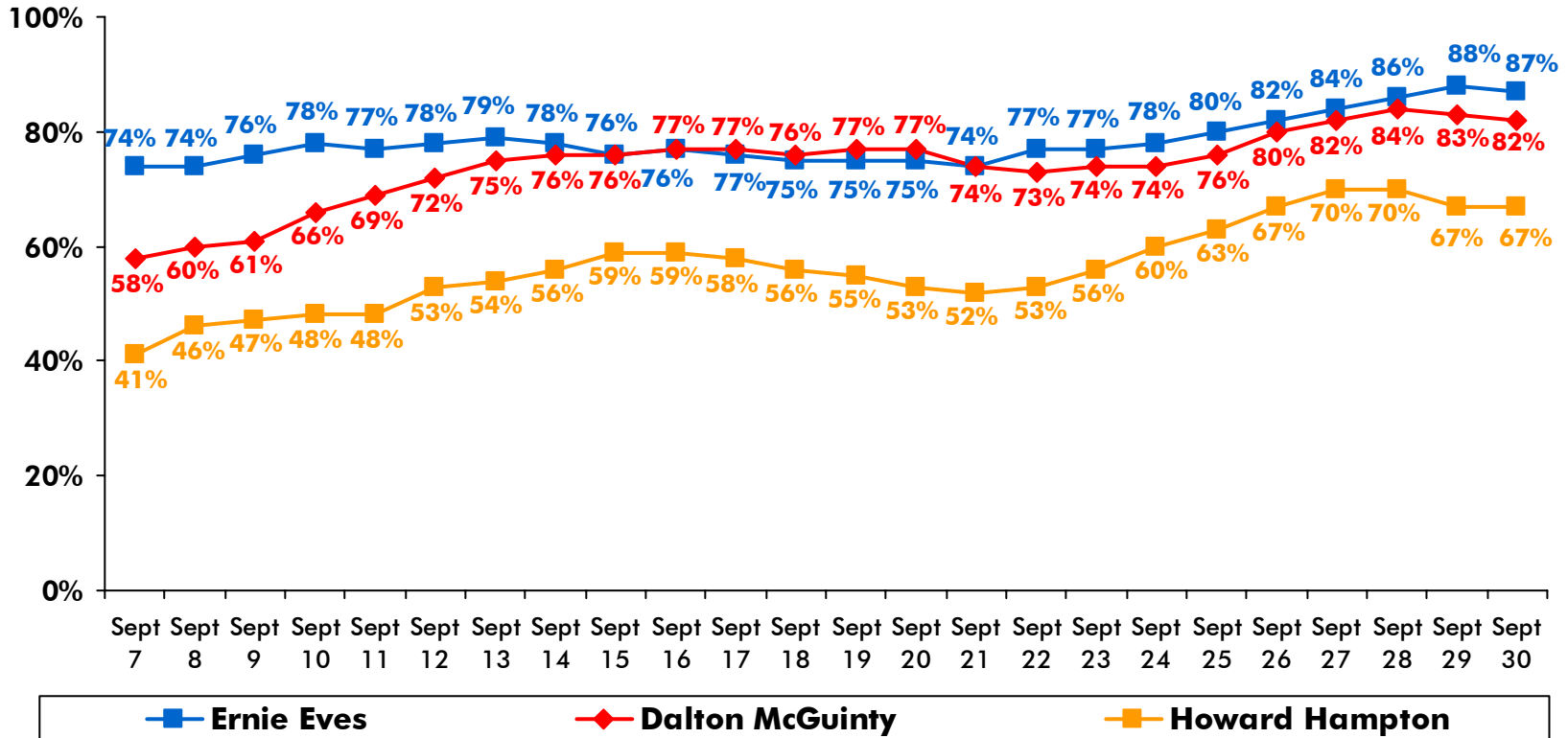

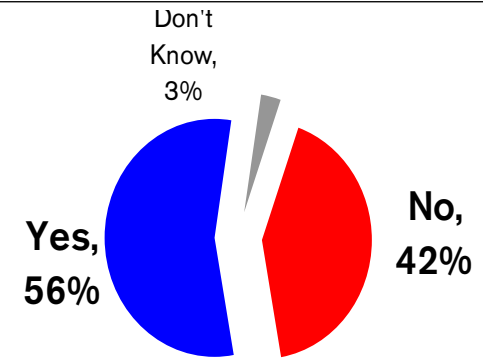

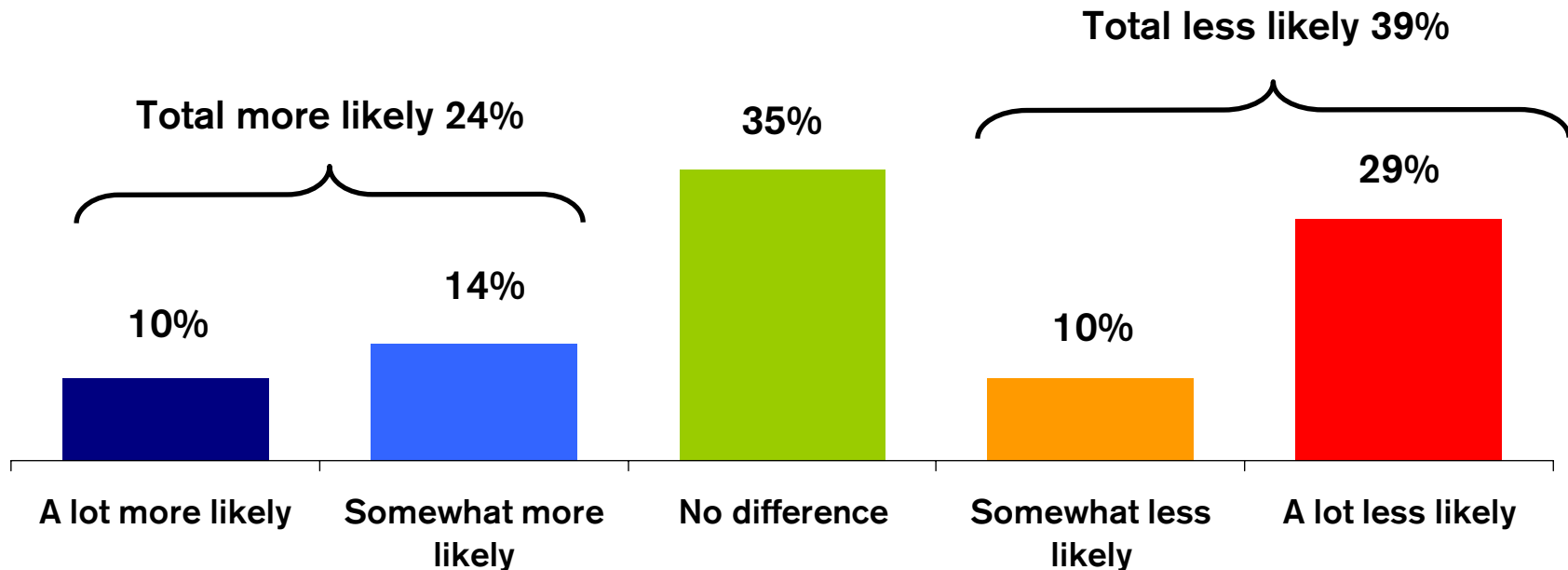


# Net negative likelihood to vote Tory based on recall

Have you read, seen or heard anything about John Tory and the PC Party in the last few days?



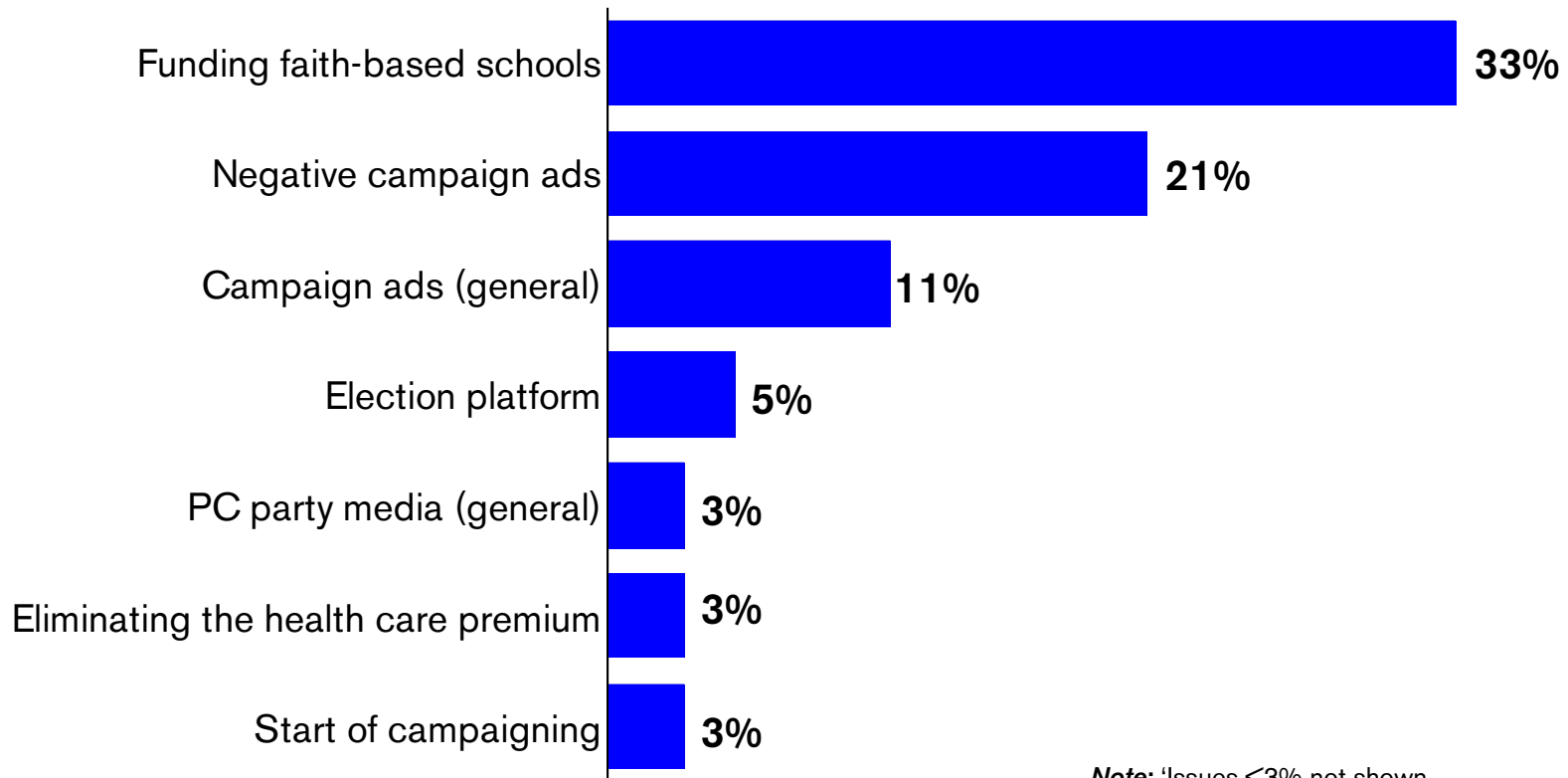
Did what you read, saw or heard leave you feeling more or less likely to vote PC? (n=799)

# Funding faith-based schools top mention for Tories

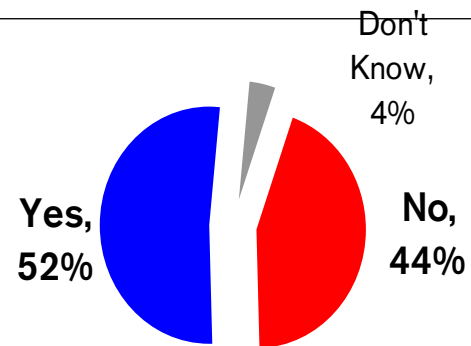
What was the last thing, you have read, seen or heard about John Tory and the PC Party?



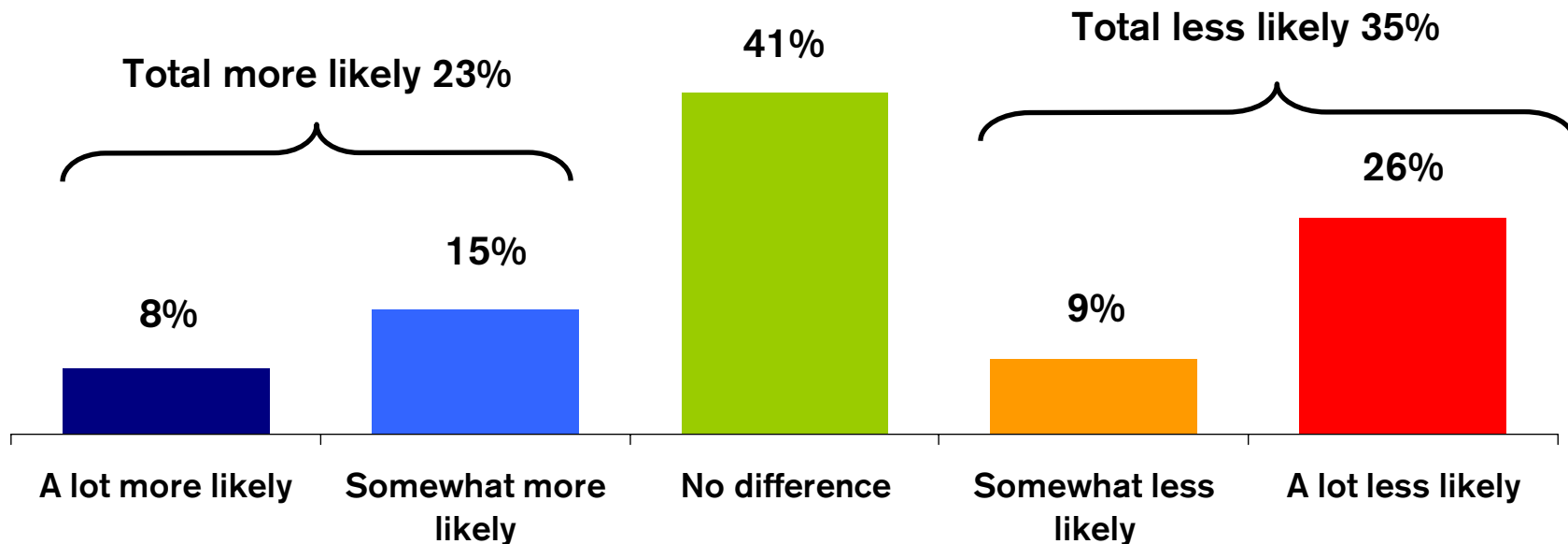

Have you read, seen or heard anything about Dalton McGuinty and the Liberal Party in the last few days?



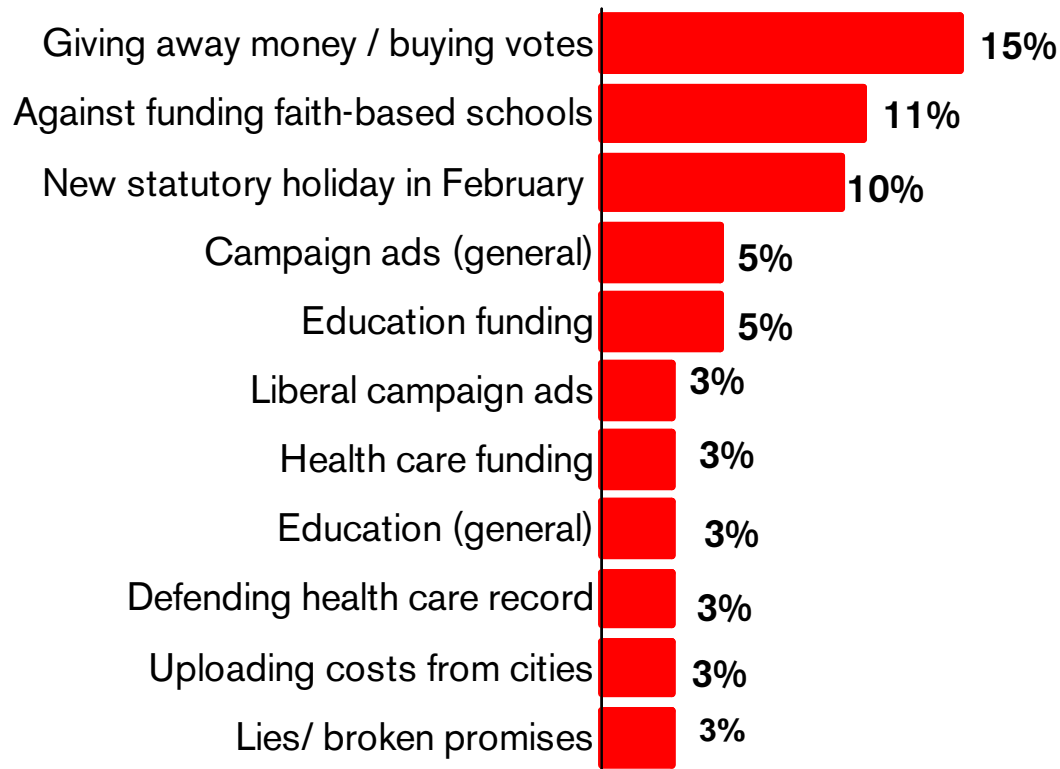
Did what you read, saw or heard leave you feeling more or less likely to vote Liberal? (n=777)

What was the last thing, you have read, seen or heard about Dalton McGuinty and the Liberal Party?

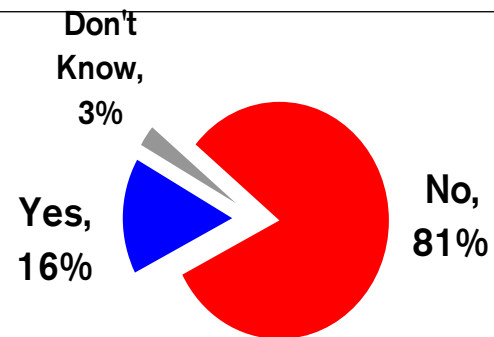

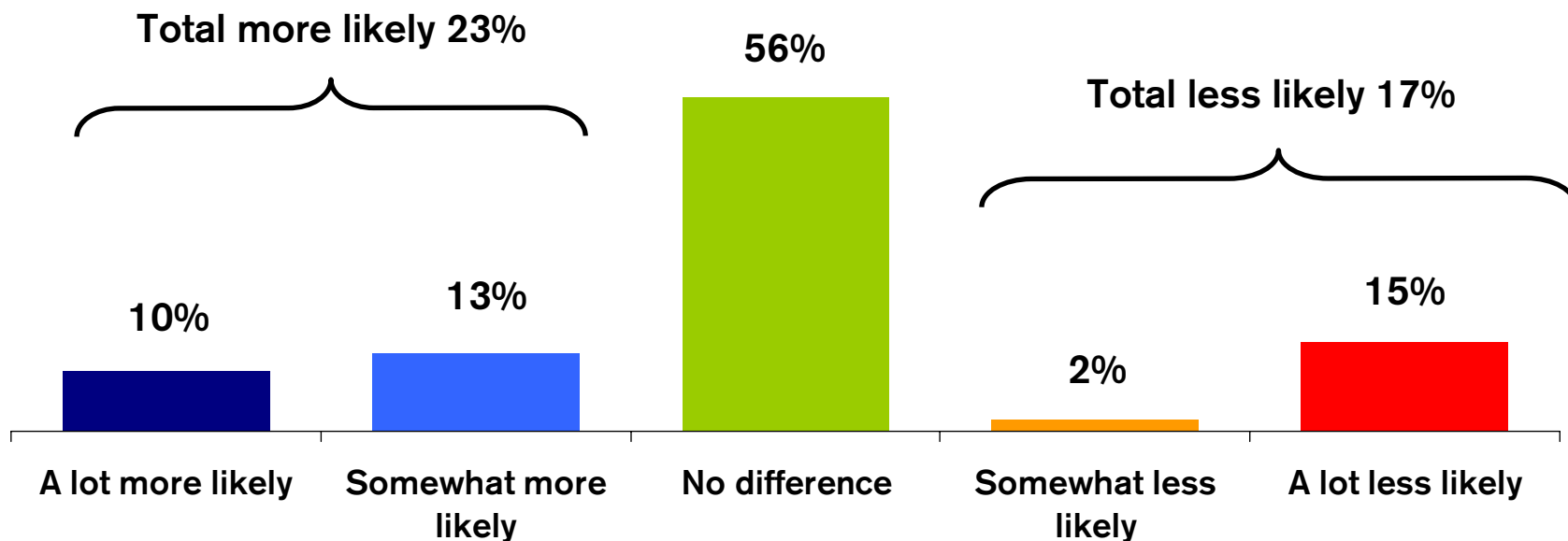

Have you read, seen or heard anything about Howard Hampton and the NDP in the last few days?



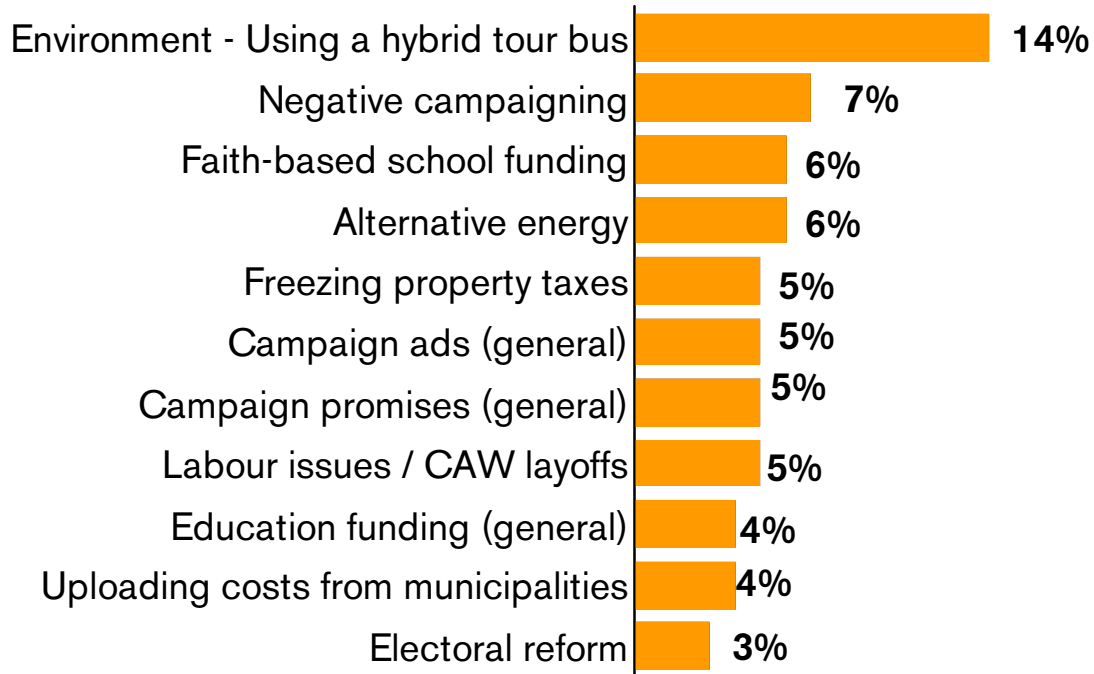
Did what you read, saw or heard leave you feeling more or less likely to vote NDP? (n=233)

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# What do the Liberals have to do?

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- This poll suggests the Liberals are on the right track
  - Introducing newly awakening swing voters to John Tory on the defensive is critical to minimizing the potential of the leadership wedge.
  - Doing it on health and education primes their best issues on the issue matrix
- The Liberal's greatest challenge is to shut down the threat from the left
- The Liberal's key campaign imperative is to keep 'time for a change' from growing by quickly shutting down any new controversies over the government's record



# What does the NDP have to do?

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- This poll shows the NDP has an opportunity to prove York South-Weston was not a fluke
- Their number one priority is to focus the campaign on the environment and social issues
- Their single biggest challenge is to break into the media
  - Fair play guidelines in the media will level the playing field over the course of the campaign
  - Their record in the last campaign shows they know how to do this
- The decision to exclude the Green Party from the debate is a tremendous boon to the NDP

# What do the Tories need to do?

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- The first priority must be to introduce their leader to those who don't know him in a favourable light
- Build more positive momentum:
  - Change the channel from faith-based funding at the macro level
  - In the short run, move to taxes, crime and jobs
- Find out why they don't own ethics and reducing waste and mismanagement.
  - These issues appear to motivate their base but not the swing vote
  - If the PCs can own those issues, they can change the channel to them

# This election starts as the Liberal's to lose

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- The Liberals come into this race with three things going for them:
  - A strong lead in party brand
  - An issue matrix that favours them
  - No great desire for a change
- The three most likely scenarios that would lead to a Liberal defeat include:
  - The Tories succeed in building their leader's favourables and effectively use leadership as a wedge
  - The NDP change channels to social justice and environmental issues and generate a minority government
  - The media breaks one or more significant controversies regarding the government and builds time for a change sentiment
- The public is only now becoming engaged and many will remain open to new information right up to election day



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
