Methodology

- A series of online surveys conducted among approximately 7,000 current members of the Canada 20/20 panel.
- Anyone interested in participating in these surveys can join the Canada 20/20 panel by going to Canada2020.com and completing the enrolment survey. However, our base sample was recruited through a series of invitations emailed by Rogers Publishing and Canadians recruited through INNOVATIVE's telephone surveys. Our core analysis is based on those who respond to email invitations.
- The March wave included 3063 responses eligible for inclusion in our analysis. After weighting a sample of this size the aggregated results are considered accurate to within ±1.77 percentage points, 19 times out of 20, of what they would have been had a representative cross-section of Canadians eligible to vote been polled.
- The margin of error will be larger within each sub-grouping of the sample


Private Health Care: No longer the third rail

Party best on <u>Health</u> ... no clear leader



Why Harper is scary: Health not on the radar screen







Do you think the budget will leave the Canadian health care system better off, worse off, or will it make no difference?




The new politics of health care

Canadians tend to oppose private delivery if they have to pay, open if government pays


For each of the following statements, I'd like you to tell me if you strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree or strongly disagree?

It is wrong to allow companies to make a profit providing publicly funded health care services.


I don't care whether I go to a non-profit or a for-profit hospital, so long as the government pays the bill.




Emerging willingness to pay for insured services

Do you currently have any health insurance that allows you to access private health care in Canada or abroad if you or a family member are seriously ill and have to wait for care in Canada?






Two-fifths interested in access to private health

care




What it means for medical clinics

For each of the following statements, I'd like you to tell me if you strongly agree, somewhat agree, somewhat disagree or strongly disagree?


Government should focus on making the public health care system better so no one feels any need to pay for private health care.

Government should make private health clinics illegal




Private and public supporters draw on public debate



Canadians remain split after hearing about private 28 health care clinics



One-third disapproves of federal government's handling of private clinics issue


Do you approve or disapprove of the way the federal government is handling the issue of private health care clinics? And do you feel strongly or just somewhat strongly about that?

Do you approve or disapprove of the way your provincial government is handling the issue of private health care clinics? And do you feel strongly or just somewhat strongly about that?






Dark cloud on the horizon: Limits to physician choice



Two-thirds worry doctors will abandon public system for private system

I worry that if we allow a parallel private system, the best doctors will chose to work in the private system and not the public system.





Conclusions

- Privates advocates can take comfort in growing willingness to consider private options.
 - The right to spend your own money when government fails is key to private acceptability.
 - Remember that Canadians feel competing loyalties between equal access and right to spend money. Pragmatism also a complicating factor.
- Public advocates can take comfort in enduring support of a strong majority for equal access to care.
 - The public challenge to Medicare advocate is simple make the system work so they won't want to spend money on a quality service they can get for free.
 - Public advocates need to pump up their volume in public debate to increase pressure on government.
