Methodology

Methodology

- Poll conducted among 1000 adults 18 years-of-age and older, drawn from a proportionate random sample from across Canada from June 13 to June 17, 2005.
- Margin of error +/- 3.1% 19 times out of 20.
- Note: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data.
- Sums are added before rounding numbers.





Most Canadians know 8 of 20 answers


On average, Canadians answer 8 of 20 answers correctly.





Few Canadians get top scores


One in five Canadians answered 4 questions or less correct. Only 3 per cent of Canadians answered 15 or more questions correct.





Levels of knowledge vary by region


Average scores vary by region.





Levels of knowledge vary by age


Average scores vary by age.





Levels of knowledge vary by education


Average scores vary by level of education.

We just asked you 20 questions about Canadian history. How many do you think you got right?



















































How important do you think it is for Canadians to know the history of their country?





How interested are you in learning more about the history of Canada?


