Methodology

- This online survey of 1,017 Ontario adults was conducted from April 24th to April 26th, 2015.
- Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel sample and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. After weighting, the final sample size is 1,000.
- INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey and panel members can only complete a particular survey once.
- Since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error could not be calculated. The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates with regard to most online panels.

Note: Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.




Provincial Vote








Satisfaction with Budget



Perceived Impact of Budget






Impact on Personal Situation






Do you think the budget will result in you paying [ROTATE MORE OR






Impact on Education


Impact on Health




Concern Over Deficit





Cap-and-Trade System




Familiarity with Cap-and-Trade System


Impression of Cap-and-Trade System


