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Methodology

- Results come from five waves of INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 panel. Four waves were conducted during the 2011 federal election and a final wave was conducted in May following the election.
- A total of 4,617 panelists responded to one or more waves.
- The Canada 20/20 Panel is recruited from a wide variety of sources to be representative of the known distribution of Canadians by age, gender, region and language.
- Results are weighted according to Census data and RDD telephone results to ensure that the sample is representative of the age, gender, region and party identification breakdown of the Canadian population to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.
- Each panelist is provided with a unique URL in their invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete any specific survey. Each URL can only be used to complete one survey.

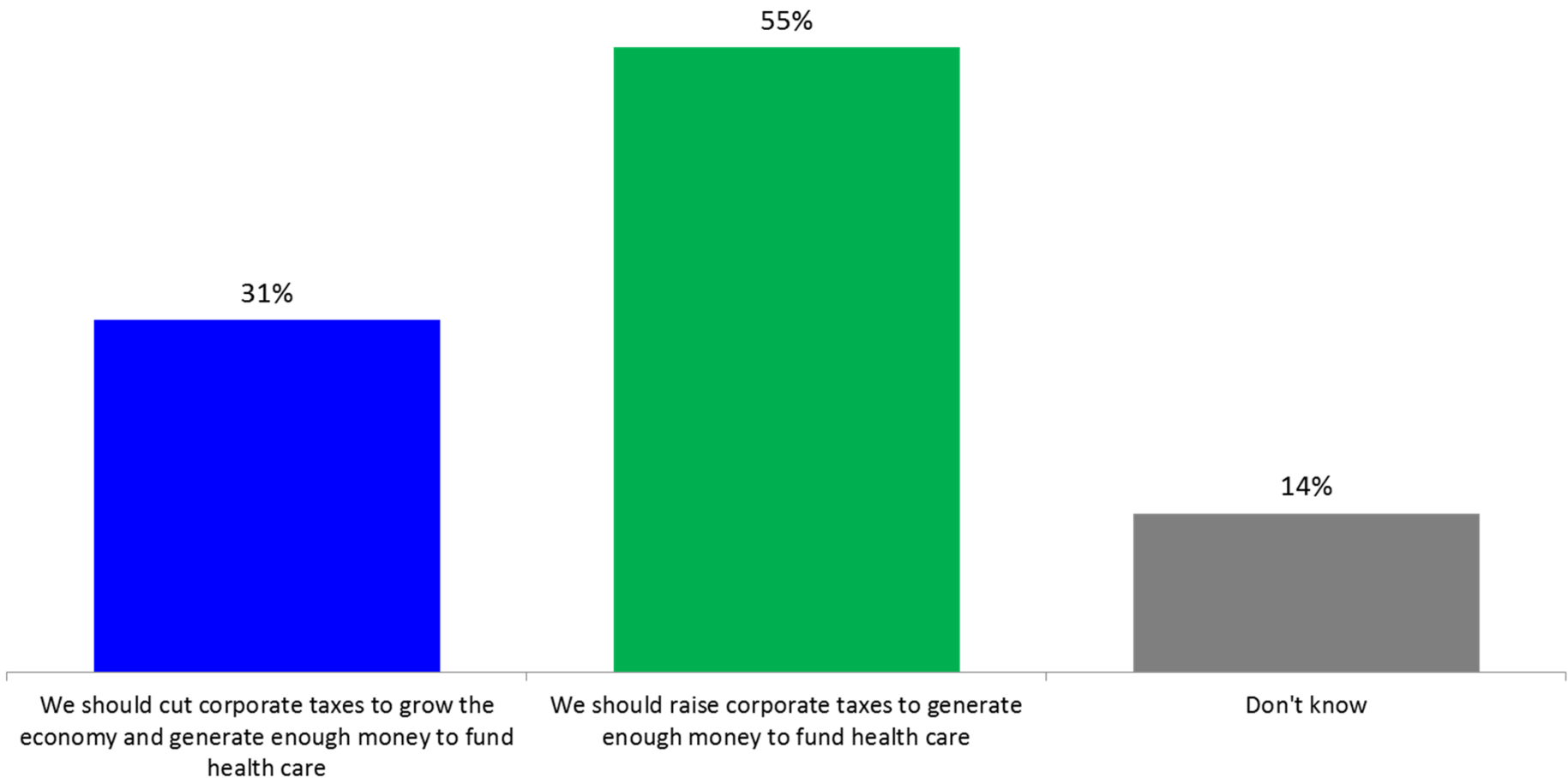

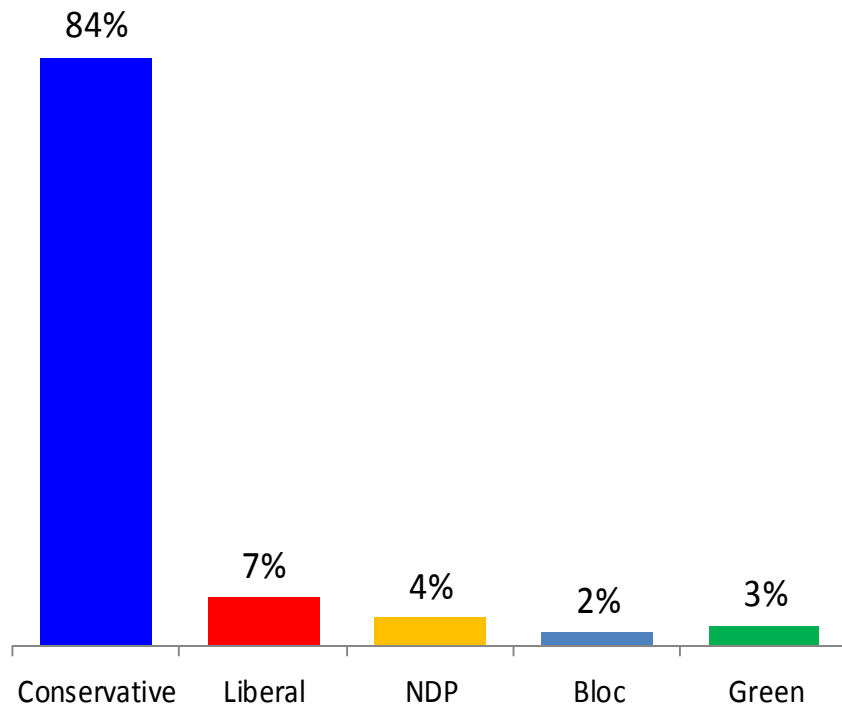


Almost all who support Conservative corporate tax position will vote Conservative; opponents split

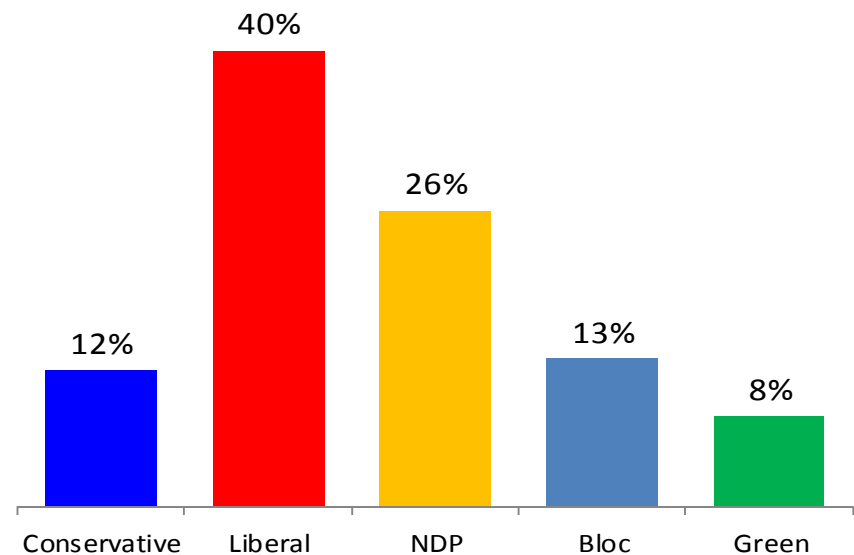

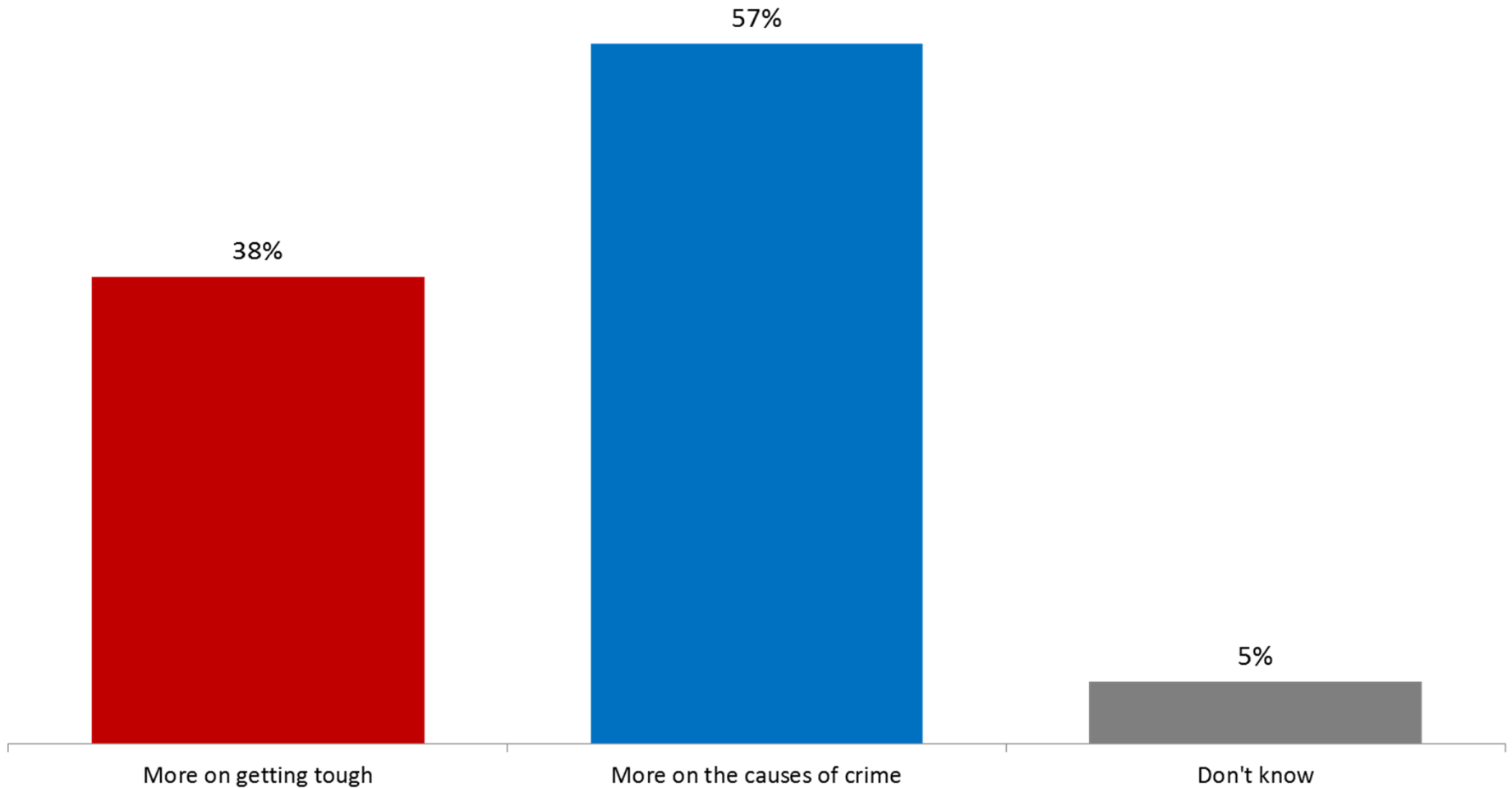

If the government introduces new policies to deal with crime, should it focus more on getting tougher on crime or should it focus more on dealing with the causes of crime?

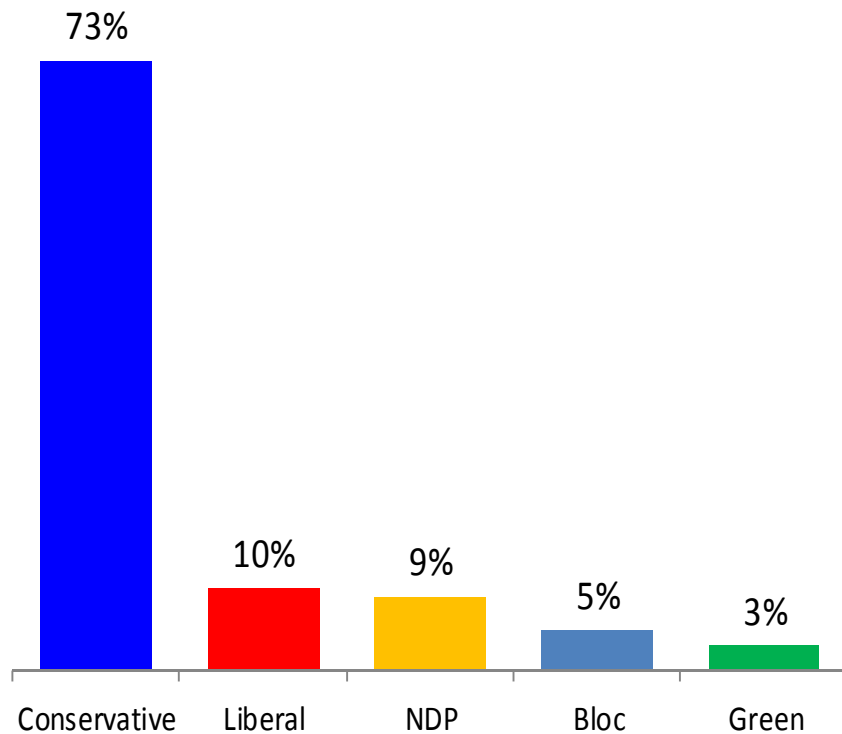


Tough on crime supporters vote Conservative, those who want to deal with causes split between opposition parties

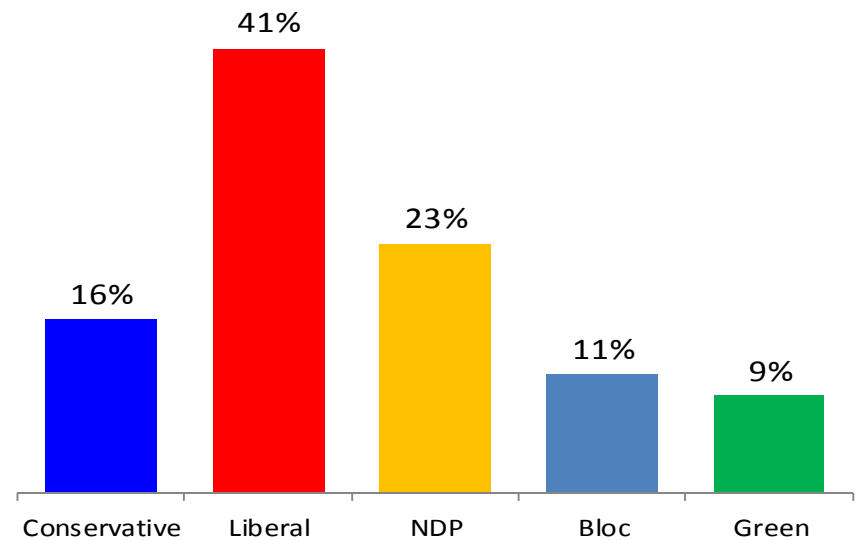


If the government introduces new policies to deal with crime, should it focus more on getting tougher on crime or should it focus more on dealing with the causes of crime?

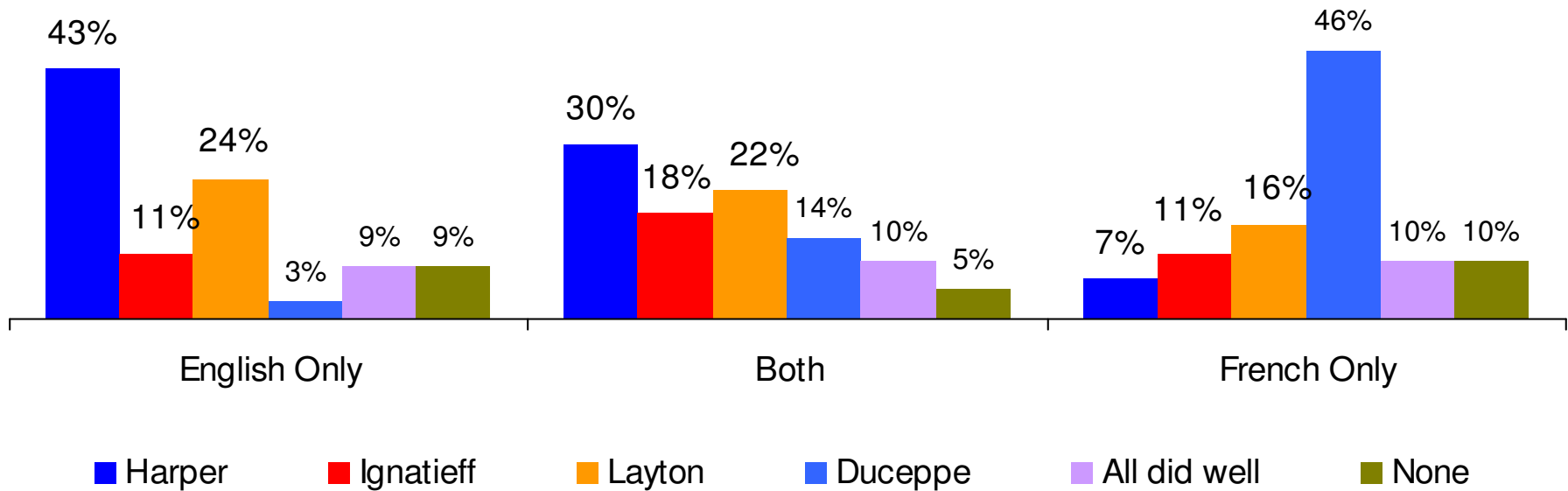

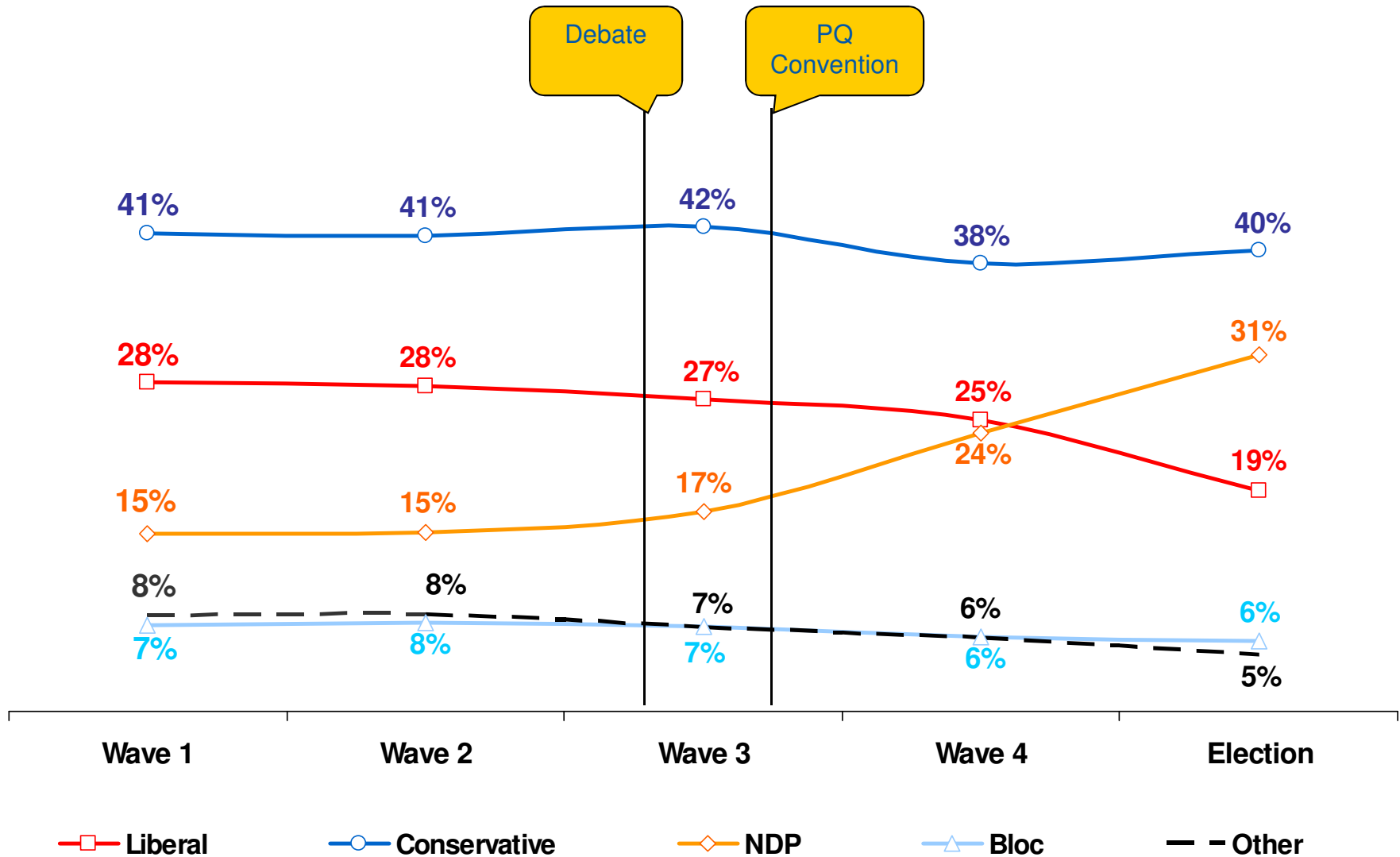

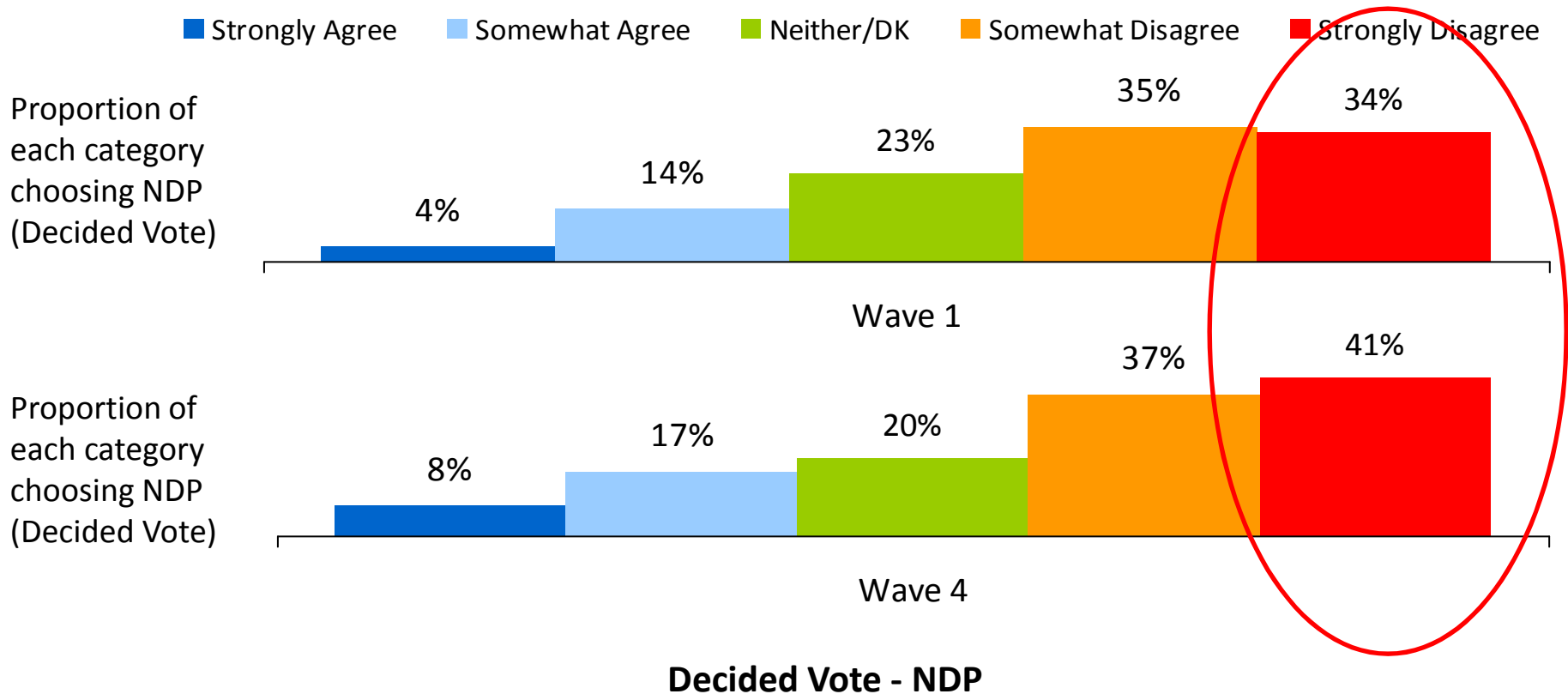

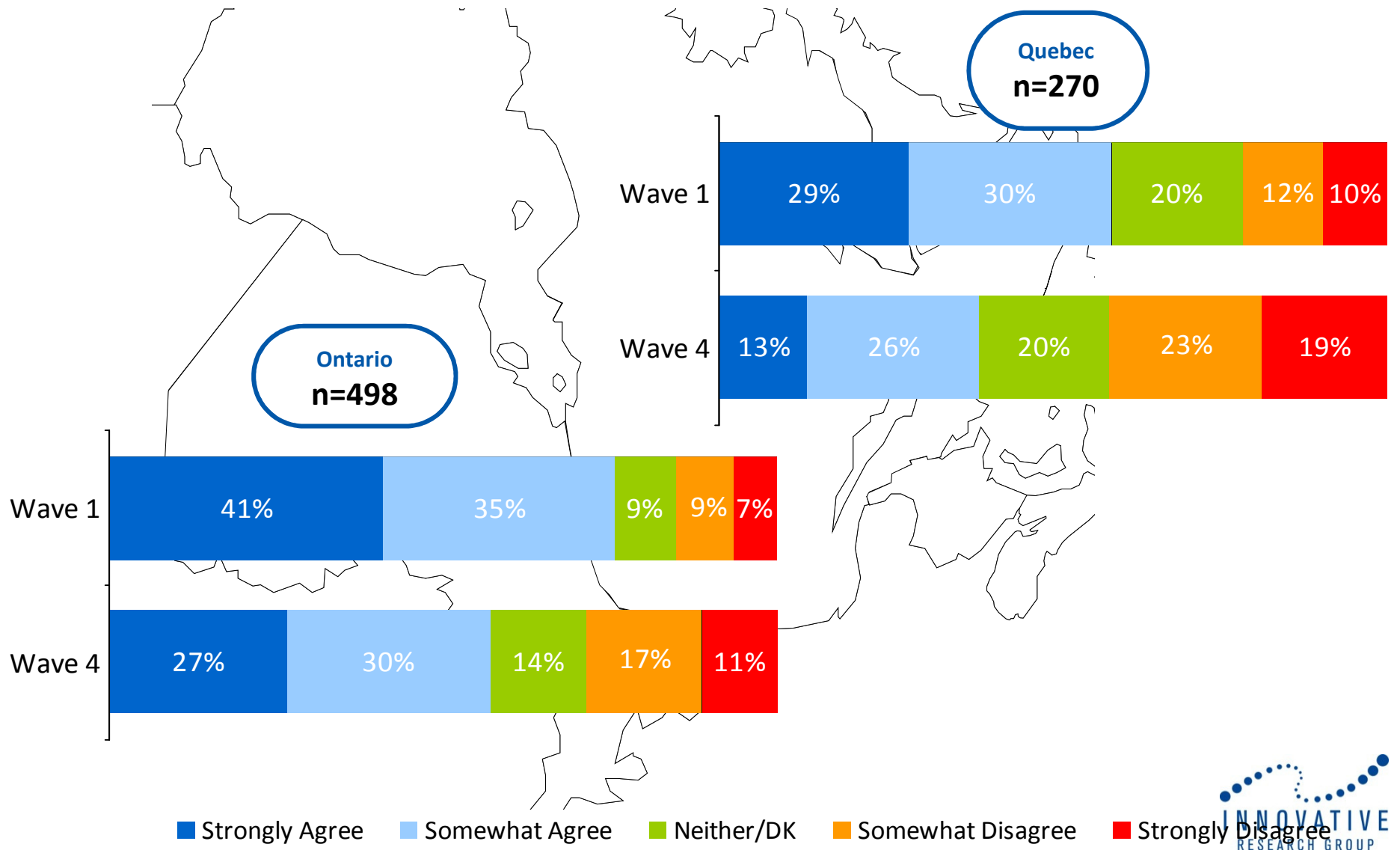

2011 Federal Election Tracking

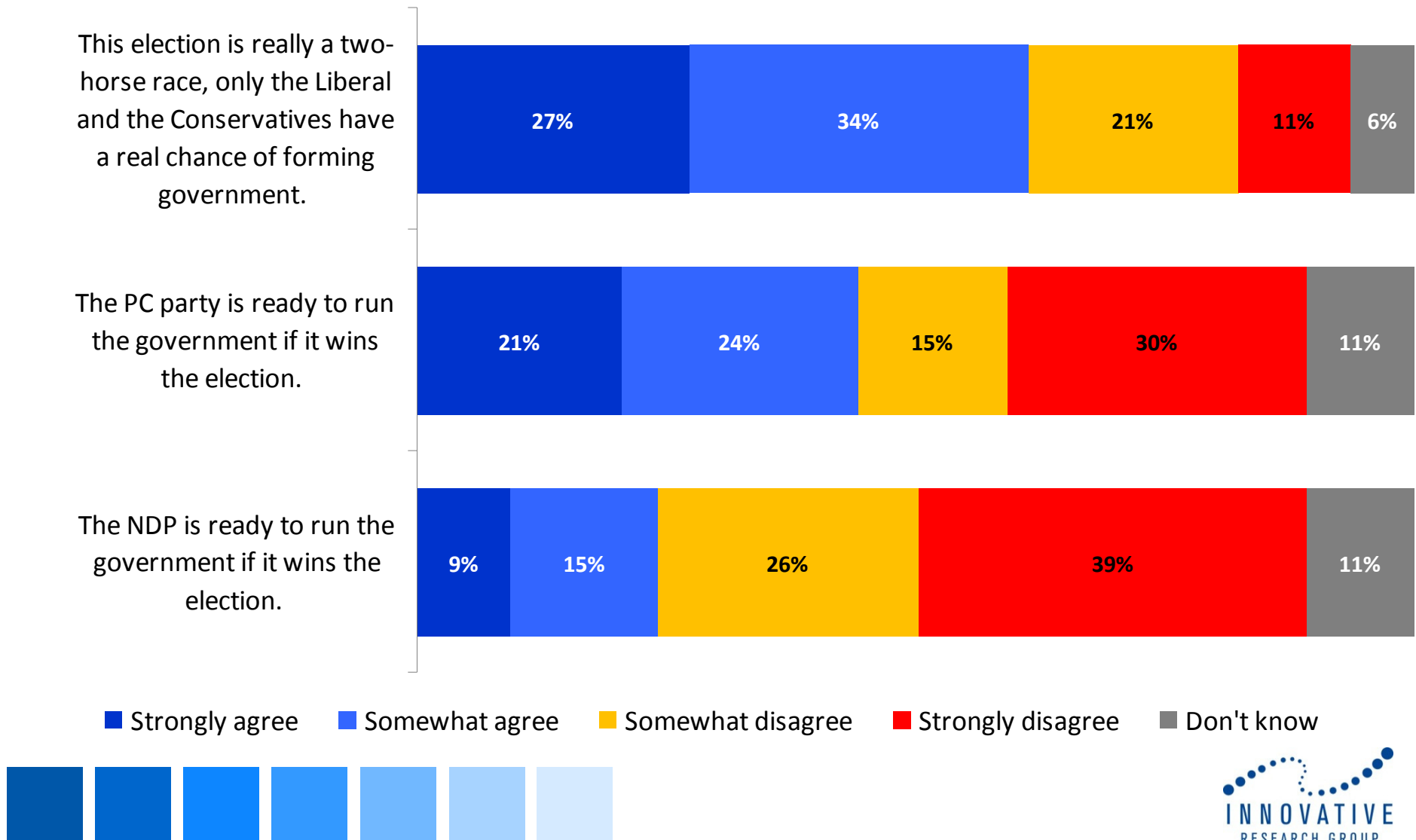

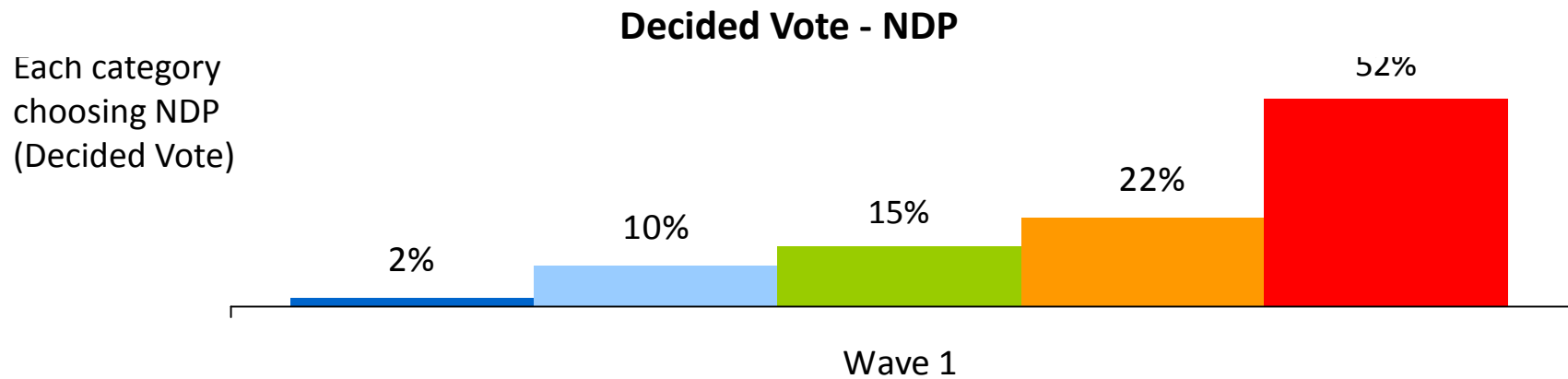

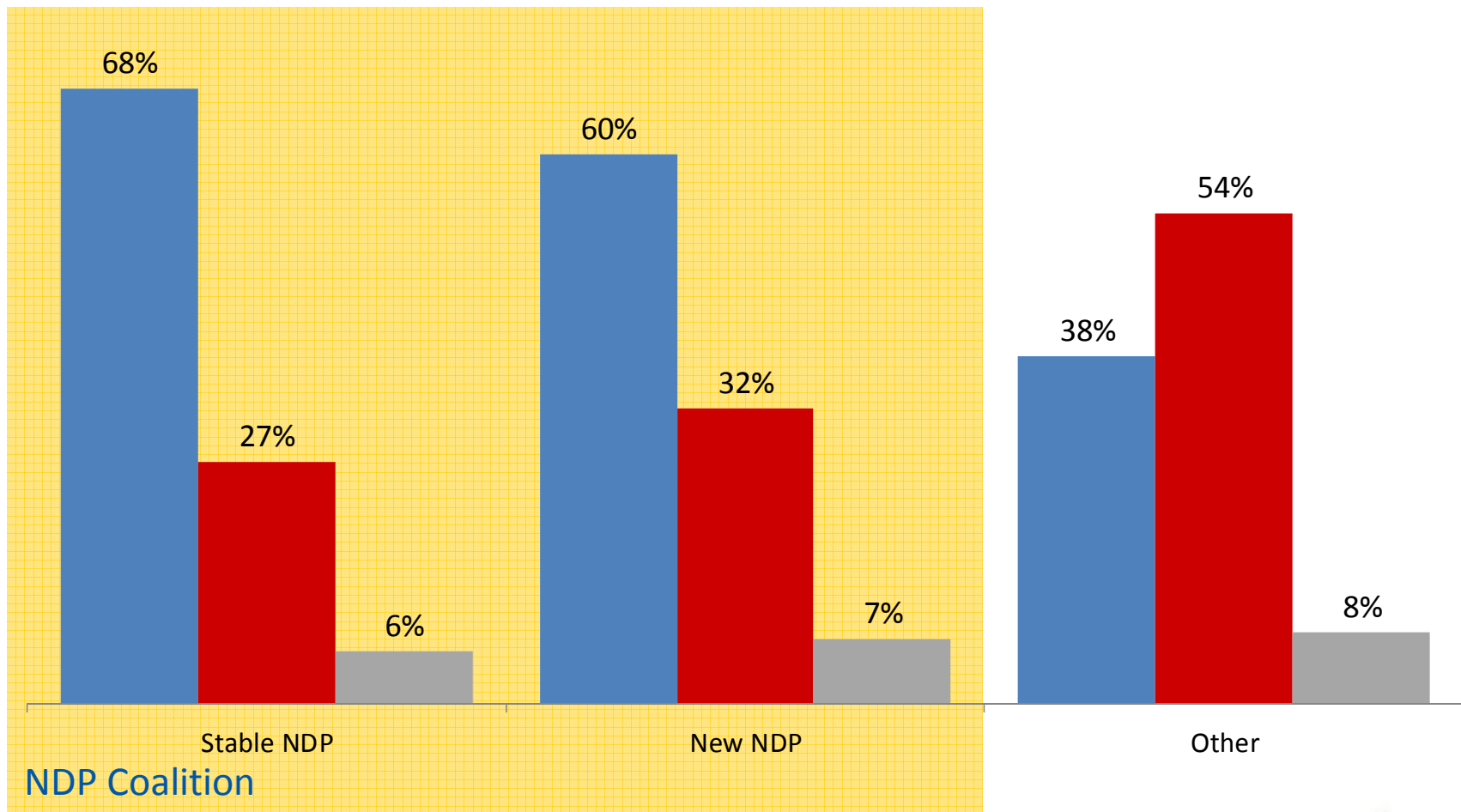

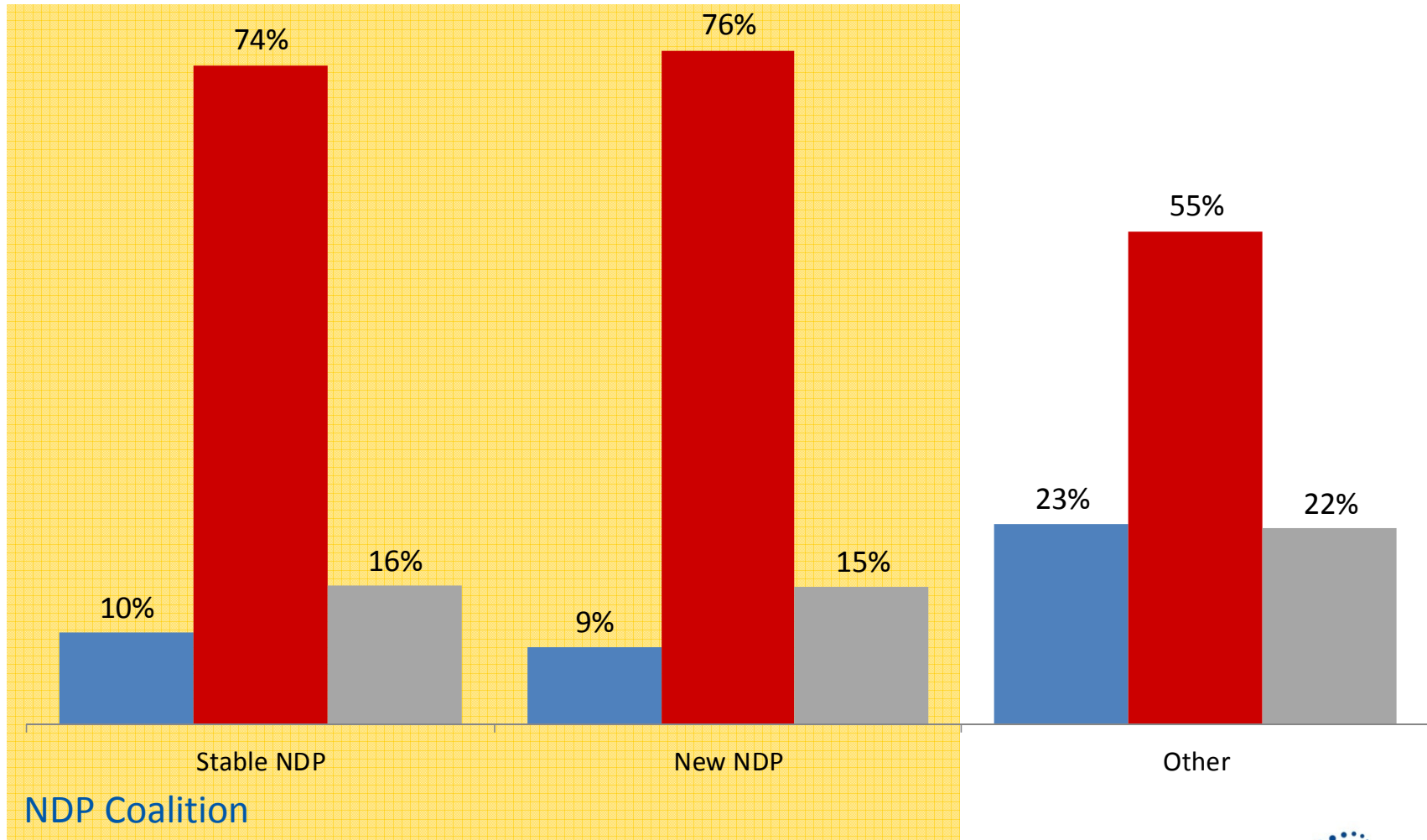

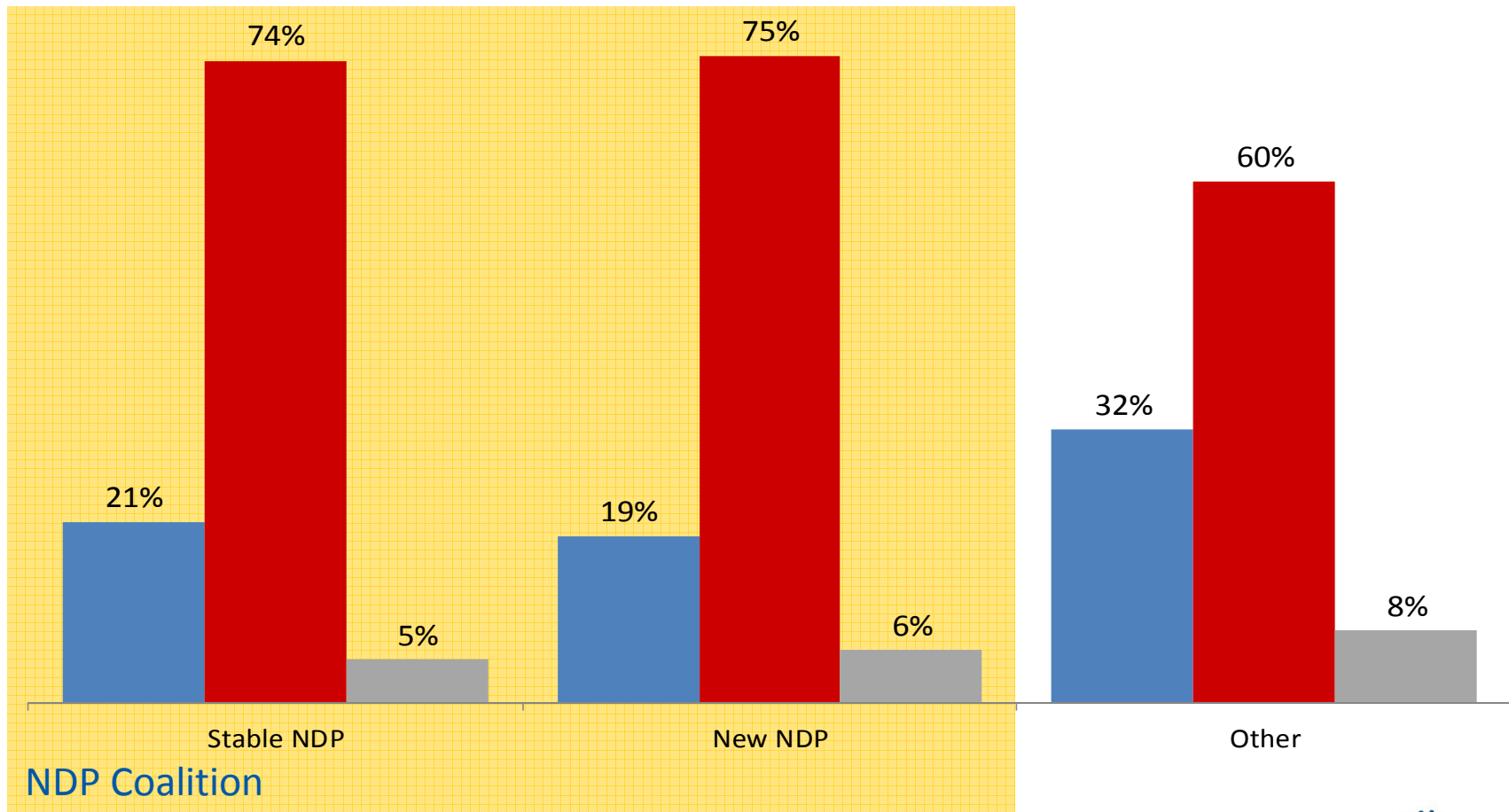

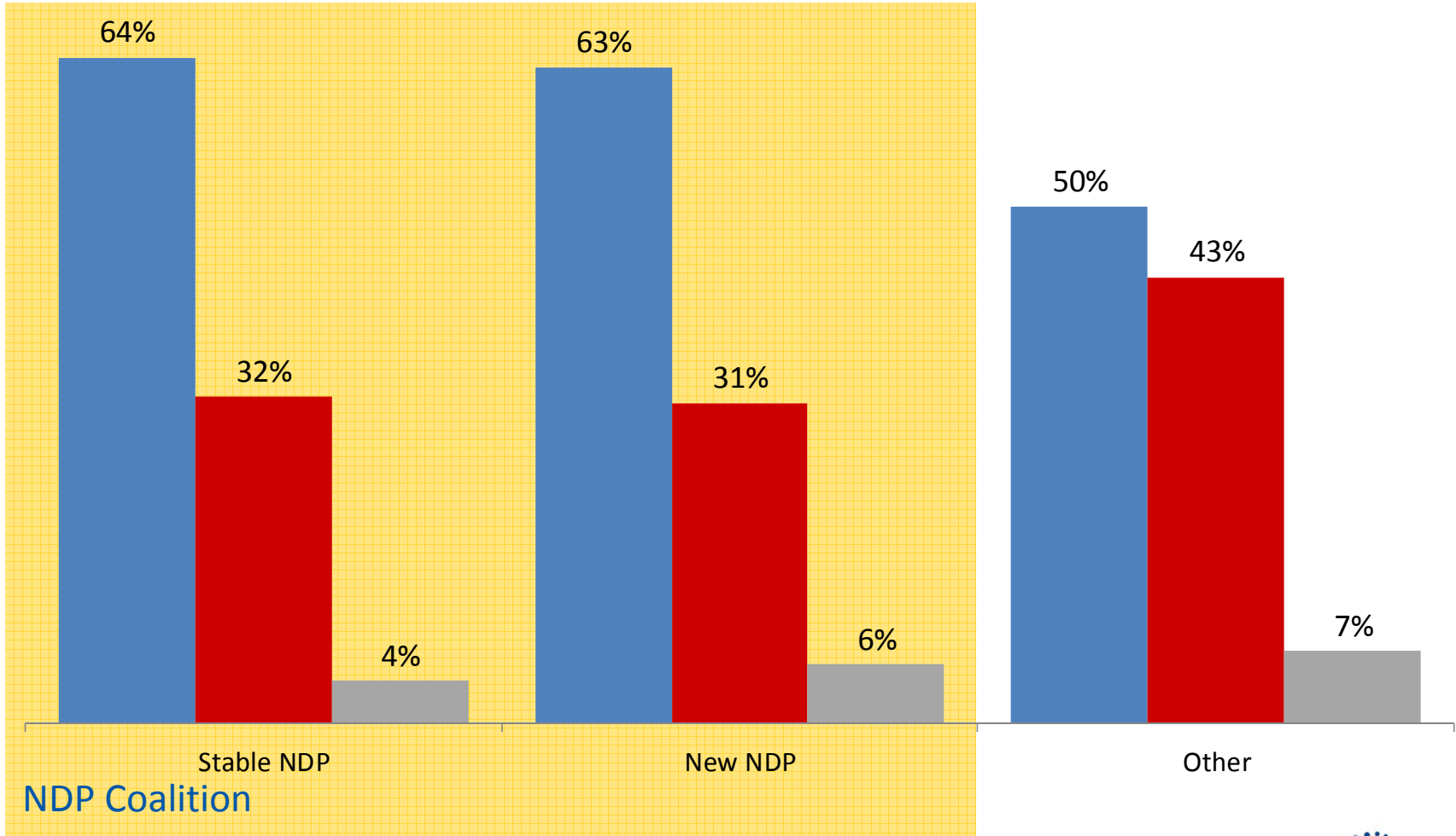

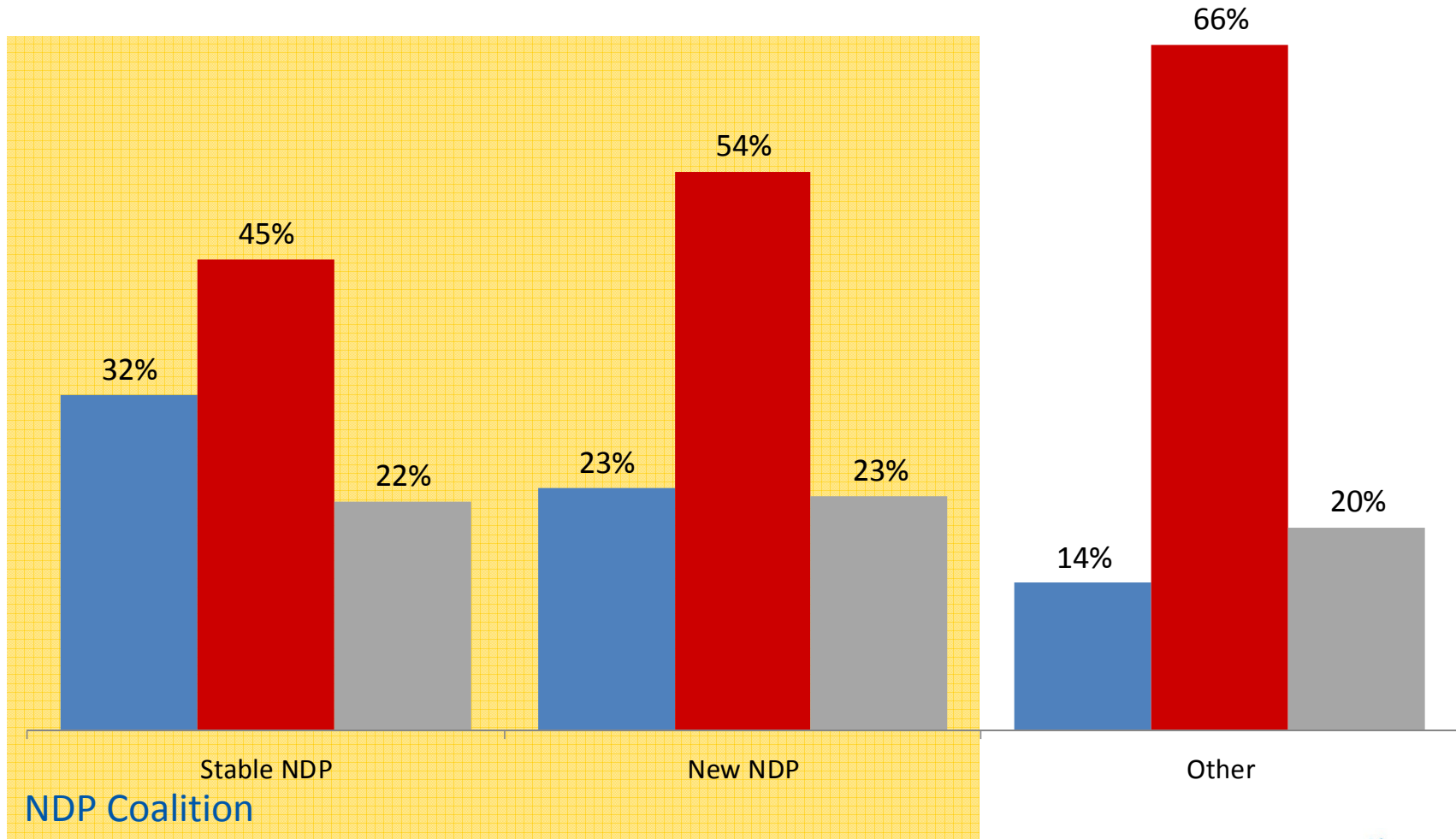


New Additions a Little Less Alienated

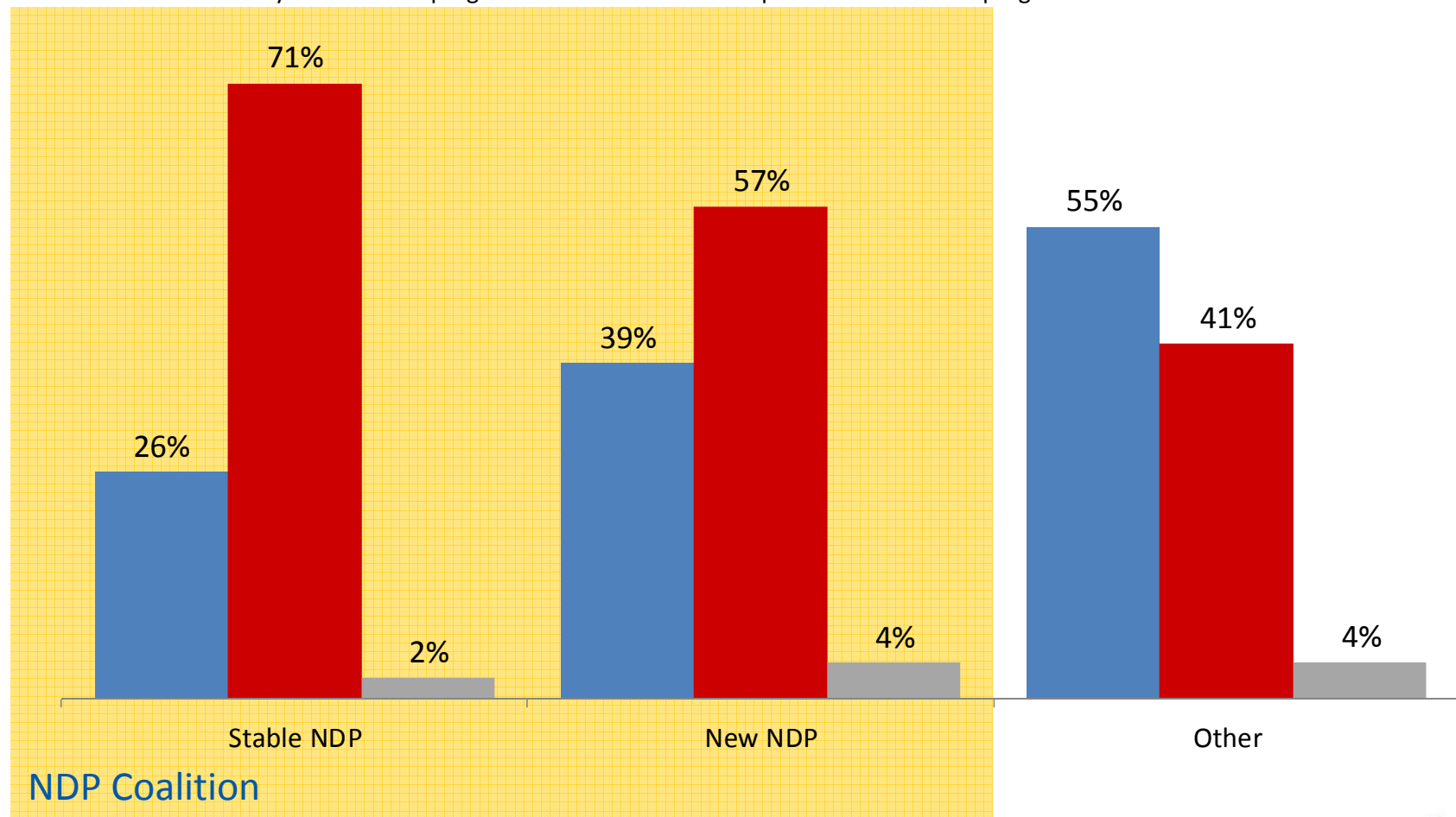


New Additions More Fiscally Conservative

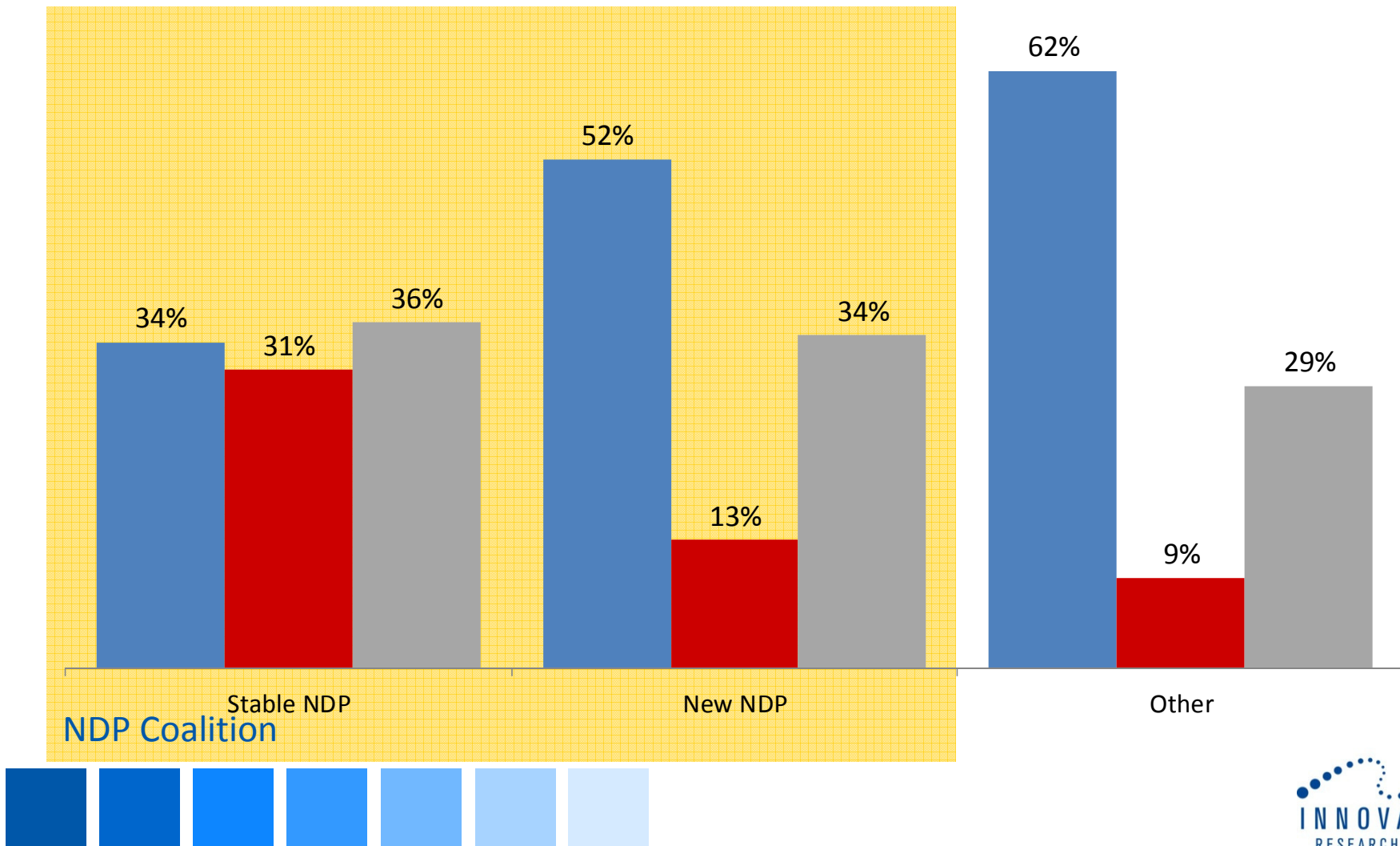


New Additions More Economically Populist



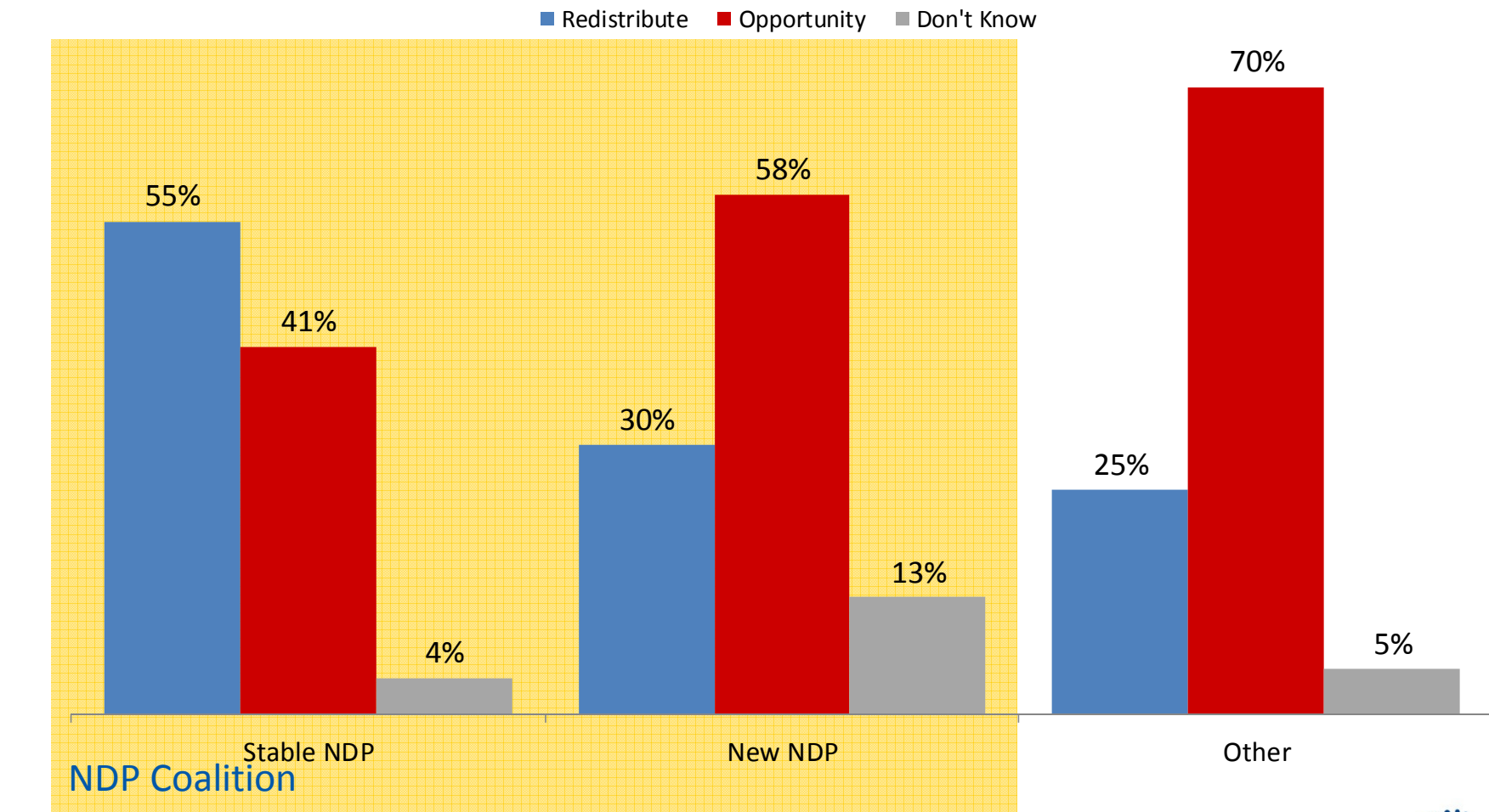
Generally, do you think people who don't get ahead in life should blame:

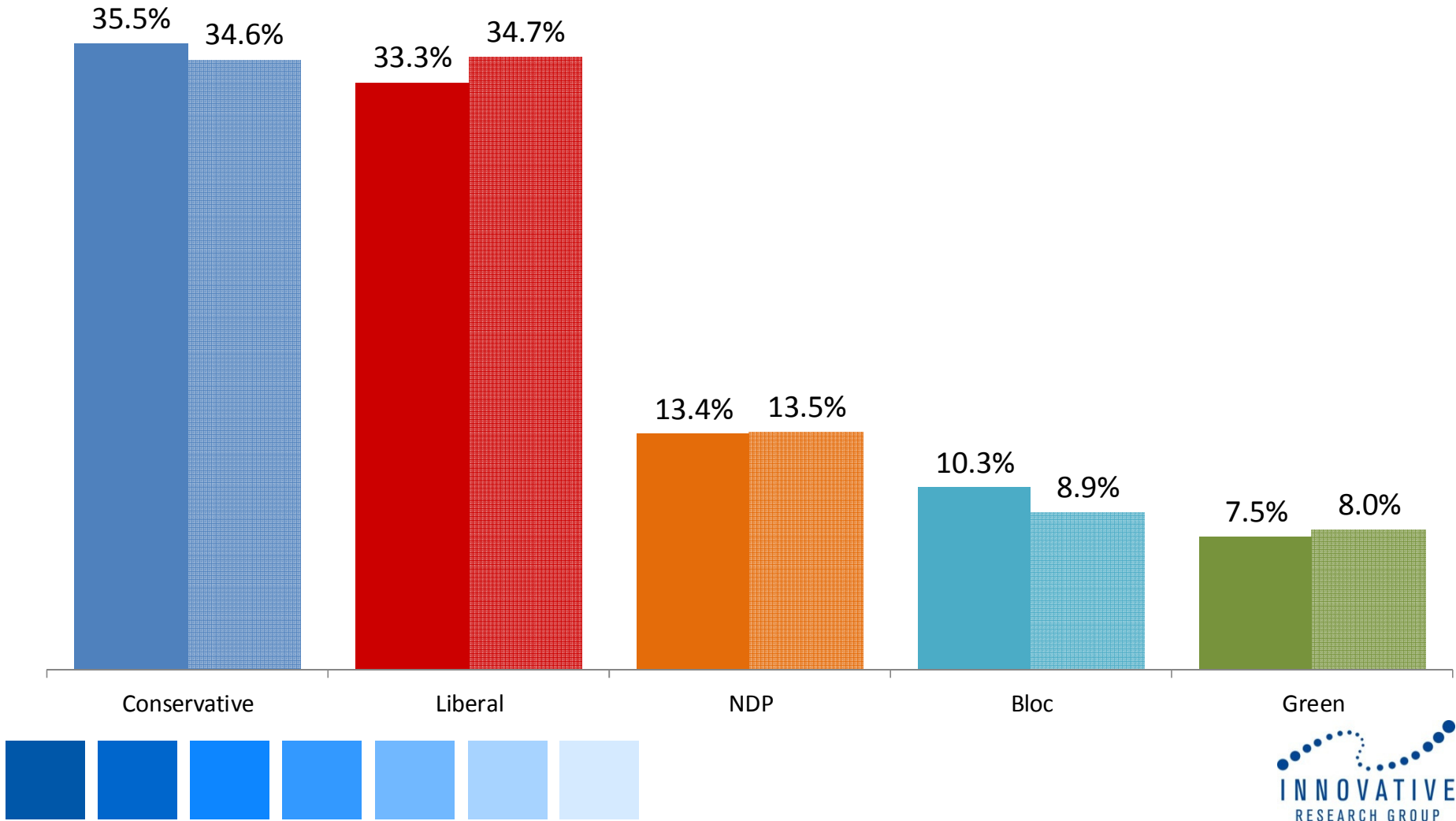


Decided Vote Looks the Same Regardless of How You Measure It

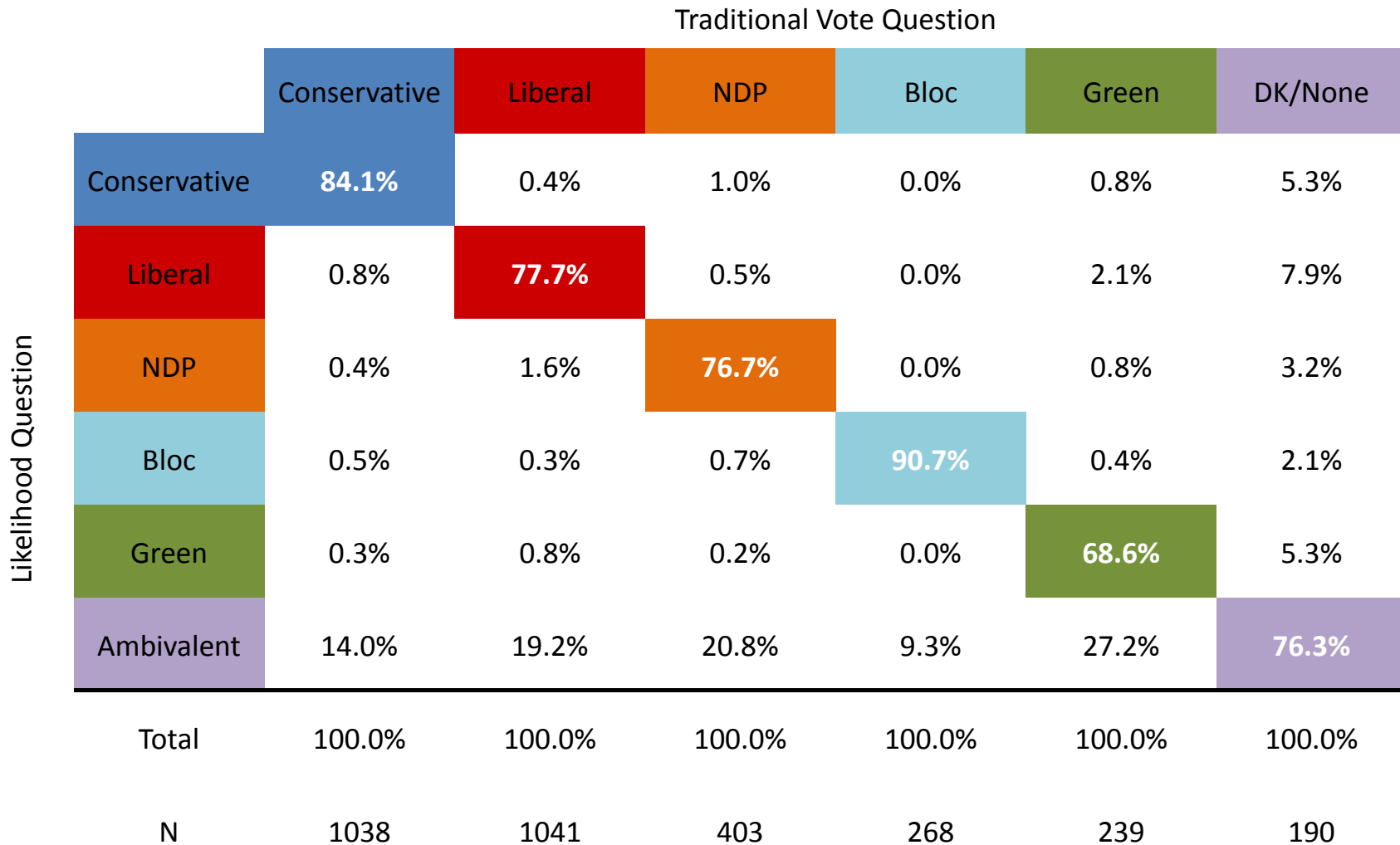


Traditional, “If an election were held today which party would you vote for?” versus, “In general, how likely are you to vote for each of the following parties?” January 2007

Five Things To Remember

1. You can win a majority government advocating a minority view.
2. The NDP should thank the PQ for creating the moment that pushed them into the consideration set.
3. There is a strong 'progressive' consensus underpinning the new NDP coalition.
4. Economic values are more problematic for the NDP
5. There is more than one way to ask the vote question.





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
