
Methodology

- These are the findings of an Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) poll conducted from April 29 to May 10th, 2013.
- This online survey of 2,135 Canadian adults was conducted on INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national panel.
- The Canada 20/20 Panel is recruited from a wide variety of sources to reflect the age, gender and region characteristics of the country as a whole. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. This survey was weighted down to 1,084 to manage oversamples in British Columbia, Alberta and Ontario.
- INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey and panel members can only complete a particular survey once.
- Since the online survey was not a random, probability based sample, a margin of error could not be calculated. The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates with regard to most online panels.
- The margin of error for a probability-based random sample of 1,084 using a probability sample is ± 2.9 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.






Segmentation: Where did respondents come from?



Demographics: Respondent Profile




Canada's Energy Super Power: Over last 6 years, "bad idea" up at expense of "don't know"

Do you consider Canada's 'energy wealth' primarily as... (Rotate 1 & 2)







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








Good Neighbor: Canadians divided on whether we should provide the US with access to resources as good neighbour


Do you agree or disagree with the following statements: We have a responsibility as a good neighbor to the United States to provide reasonable access to natural resources once our own needs have been met.





Do you agree or disagree with the following statements: I am not interested in Canada becoming an energy superpower if it really just means becoming a really big supplier of oil and gas for the United States.







Energy Exports: Majority agree Canada has become too dependent on energy exports, particularly Albertans, NDP







Saving Energy for the Future: Majority agree we should save energy resources for the future








Sacrifices to Preserve Energy: Less support for saving resources for the future if it means sacrifice today






Prioritizing Energy: Importance of economy growing, now tied with environment



Which is the more important priority for you personally?







Environmental Concerns: Marginally more disagree that we ²² should not develop oil because of environmental impact


