### **Methodology & Demographics**



### Methodology

- These are the findings of an Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) poll conducted from May 29<sup>th</sup> to June 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017.
- This online survey of 1607 adult Canadians was conducted on INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel. The results following for Canada only are weighted to n=1,200 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.
- The Canada 20/20 Panel is recruited from a wide variety of sources to reflect the age, gender, region and language characteristics of the country as a whole. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.
- INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey, and panel members can only complete a particular survey once.
- This is a representative sample. We have set targets to ensure we properly reflect key regional and
  demographic distribution and then used weights to ensure we reflect the country properly. However, since the
  online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error can not be calculated. The
  Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements about margins of sampling error or
  population estimates with regard to most online panels.
- Tracking results from are from previous polls conducted on INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 panel: July 24<sup>th</sup> to July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2015 n=2,000, June 26<sup>th</sup> to July 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2014 n=2,332, June 25<sup>th</sup> to July 6<sup>th</sup>, 2009 n=2,507; May 7<sup>th</sup> to June 4<sup>th</sup>, 2008 n= 4,893, May 31<sup>st</sup> to June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2007 n=5,060.

**Note**: Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.






## **Party Identification**

Thinking about politics in CANADA, generally speaking do you think of yourself as a... [asked of all respondents]







How often would you say you personally have contact with Canada's Indigenous peoples? Would that be...? [asked of all respondents, 2017 n=1,200]






# **Ancestry:** 10% of respondents report having First Nations, Inuit or Métis ancestry




### Ancestry importance: Agreement dropped 5 points

Do you agree or disagree with the following statement: "My First Nations / Inuit / Métis heritage is an important part of who I am as a person"








# **Federal Government:** net approval up 9 points to -18%; plurality still disapprove (41%); 39% don't know or neutral.






Do you approve or disapprove of the job your PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT is doing managing Canada's Indigenous peoples' issues?

Do you approve or disapprove of the job your PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT is doing managing Canada's Indigenous peoples' issues?




## **Provincial Government:** net approval lowest in BC (-27%), Alberta net down 16 points since 2015




## **Read, seen, heard:** 43% have RSH about Indigenous peoples, with 34% citing the disappearance of First Nations women




### **2017:** Top Read, Seen, or Heard




## **Familiarity:** Only 19% of respondents familiar with the UNDRIP



# **Support:** Majority (56%) support implementing the UNDRIP, highest among NDP Supporters (84%)




Do you think fully adopting and implementing the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples is a good idea or a bad idea?






### Good or bad idea: 17% of UNDRIP supporters cite Indigenous<sup>3</sup> groups should have a say in issues that affect them














### Governments and Indigenous Groups: More Indigenous respondents approve of federal government management



Do you approve or disapprove of the job the FEDERAL **GOVERNMENT** is doing managing Canada's Indigenous peoples' issues?










## **UNDRIP:** Indigenous respondents much more aware of the UNDRIP; also more strongly support adopting it


