

### Ontario Politics on the Eve of the Election Summary of Key Results



#### Methodology:

- This summary is based on the results from a series of monthly telephone and online surveys.
- For the core voting information, we rely on our monthly province-wide telephone surveys. These surveys sample randomly-selected Ontario residents, 18 years of age and older. Only one respondent per household was eligible to complete each survey. The final sample includes both landline and cell phone respondents, so that individuals who don't have a landline are represented.



All phone samples were weighted (n=600) by age, gender and region using the latest available Census data to reflect the actual demographic composition of the population. The margin of error for a sample of n=600 is approximately +4.0.

For benchmarking, the 2014 study was completed between March 14<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>, 2014 (unweighted n=608). The 2018 study was completed between March 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018 (unweighted n=603).

• All additional results come from a series of national online surveys. The most recent was conducted from April 2<sup>nd</sup> to April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2018 among 920 adult Ontarians.



Respondents qualified to complete the surveys if they are above the age of 18 and currently residing in Canada. The results are weighted to n= 600 based on Census data from Stats Can.

This is a representative sample. However, since online surveys are not a random probability based sample, a margin of error can not be calculated. The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates with regard to most online panels.

**Note**: Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.




### Provincial Decided Vote: More than 4-in-10 decided would vote PC (44%), 1-in-4 (26%) Liberal, 22% NDP


### **Provincial Vote:** PCs (36%) 15 points ahead of Liberals (21%); 18% would vote NDP with 12% undecided






### **Provincial Vote:** With an 11-point gain since 2014, PCs now have a 15-point advantage over the Liberals








### **Party ID:** Partisanship up significantly overall, with a 10-point gain for the PCs specifically





### Time for Change Segmentation: Core Liberals are down 50%, along with a 12-point gain in Hostile






### **Leader Favourability:** Very unfavourable view of Wynne has more than doubled; Ford fares better than Hudak

#### **Net Favourability**





Which of the following leaders would make the best Premier of Ontario?










### **Economic Values Tracking:** Drop in perception that every year seems more difficult, that people can't get ahead




Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?






No matter how hard I work, every year it seems more difficult to get by



### Economic Alienation Segmentation: Almost half are either

#### **Ambivalent or Alienated**

Based on the two economic alienation questions – Agree/Disagree "Here in Ontario, you can be anything if you are willing to work for it" and "No matter how hard I work, every year it seems more difficult to get by" – we group respondents who share common sets of values to better understand the motivations and needs of voters.




### **Familiar with hashish story:** 43% familiar with the story; Liberal identifiers, Torontonians and feminists most familiar








### Credibility of story: Nearly half (47%) believe the story; most <sup>25</sup> credible among Liberals, NDP and feminist groups




In your opinion is the report by the Globe and Mail that Doug Ford sold hashish likely true or false?

"...likely true or false?" BY PC Voter Pool (Collapsed)




### **Reported Impact:** For most (57%), the hashish story makes not difference on their vote in the upcoming election




Does the report by the Globe and Mail that Doug Ford sold hashish for several years in the 1980s leave you more or less likely to vote PC in the upcoming election?

### Ontario Government Tracking: recall is up month-to-month and reaction turns sharply negative






### **RSH and Impact:** most RSH about budget, childcare, promises, most negative impact items were budget, election promises

### **RSH Budget Tracking:** 59% have RSH about the provincial budget; PCs are more likely to recall it than Liberals




Have you read, seen or heard anything about the recent provincial budget that was presented in the Legislature on March 28, 2018?


Did it leave you feeling a lot more favourable, somewhat more favourable, somewhat less favourable, or a lot less favourable towards the provincial Liberal government?



#### Budget Satisfaction Tracking: 32% are satisfied with the budget, but "very dissatisfied" is at its highest point since '06




In general, how satisfied are you with the provincial budget?

#### Doug Ford's PCs are in the driver's seat

1.

Anger at the Liberals appears to have solidified this winter, leaving the Liberals with a much smaller voter pool compared to the last election with a much more unpopular leader.

2.

Ford is polarising, but that still leaves him in a stronger position than Hudak before the 100,000 jobs issue - and a much better position than Wynne.

3.

The NDP have lots of second choice support and Horwath has a positive image, but they need the other two parties to fail before voters look to them.



### Appendices



#### **Online Methodology**

- These are the findings of an Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) poll conducted from April 2<sup>nd</sup> to April 9<sup>th</sup>, 2018 with tracking drawn for our monthly omnibus.
- This online survey of 920 adult Ontarians is drawn from a larger monthly omnibus survey of 2,474 adult Canadians using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Survey Sampling International (SSI), a leading provider of online sample. The Ontario results shown are weighted to n=600 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.
- The Canada 20/20 Panel is recruited from a wide variety of sources to reflect the age, gender, region and language characteristics of the country as a whole. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.
- INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey, and panel members can only complete a particular survey once.
- This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error can not be calculated. The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates with regard to most online panels.

### Online - April CTM Ontario Weights: Region, age, gender

Results for Ontario are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported below.
