## **Trans-Mountain Pipeline**

Field Dates: May 7th to May 14th, 2018

Sample Size: n=1,500

# Methodology

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- These are the findings of an Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) poll conducted from May 7th to May 14th, 2018.
- This online survey of 2,327 Canadian adults was conducted on INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national panel.
- The Canada 20/20 Panel is recruited from a wide variety of sources to reflect the age, gender, region and language characteristics of the country as a whole. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to n=1,500 to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.
- INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey and panel members can only complete a particular survey once.
- Since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error can not be calculated. The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates with regard to most online panels.

**Note:** *Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.*

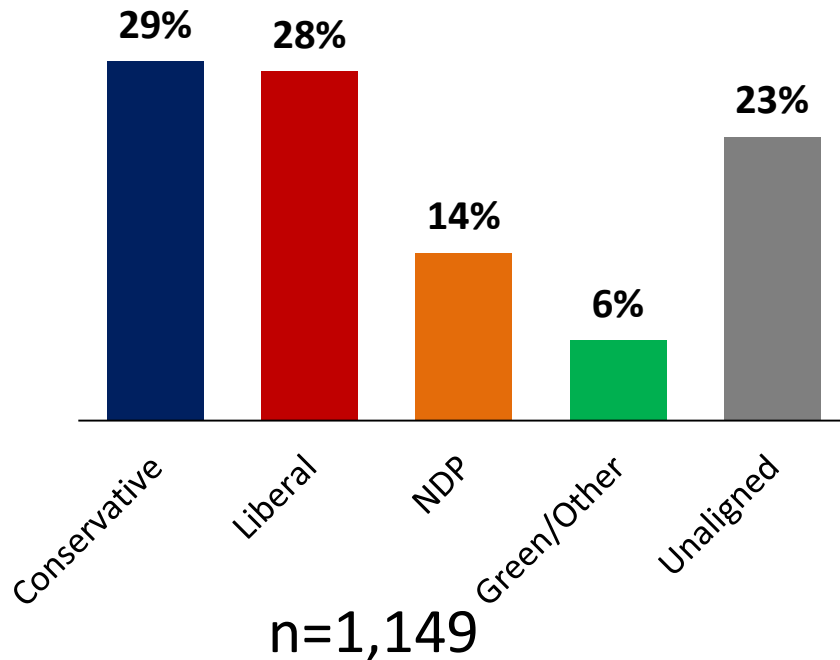

# Federal Party ID: 3-in-10 in Rest of Canada identify as Conservative (29%) and Liberal (28%) with 23% unaligned

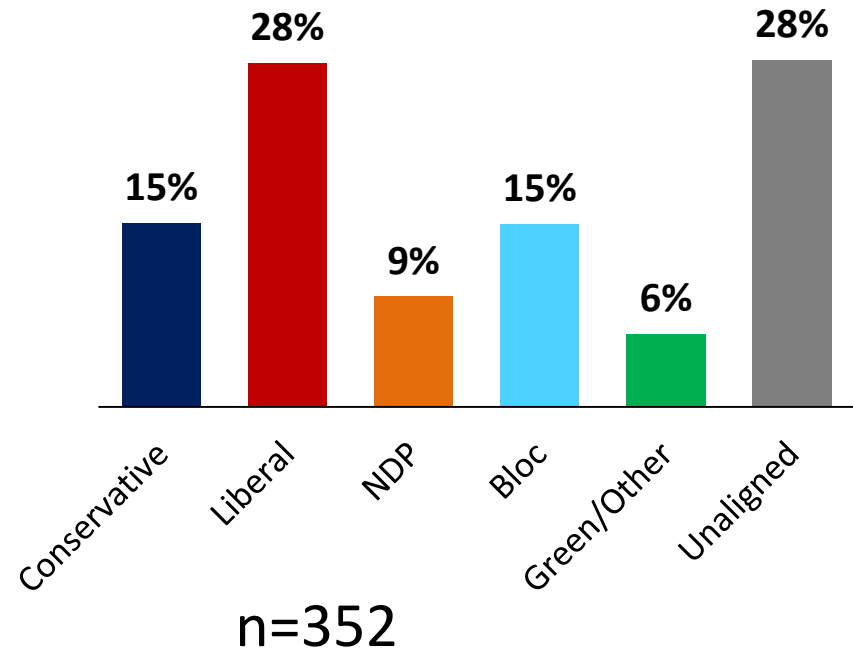

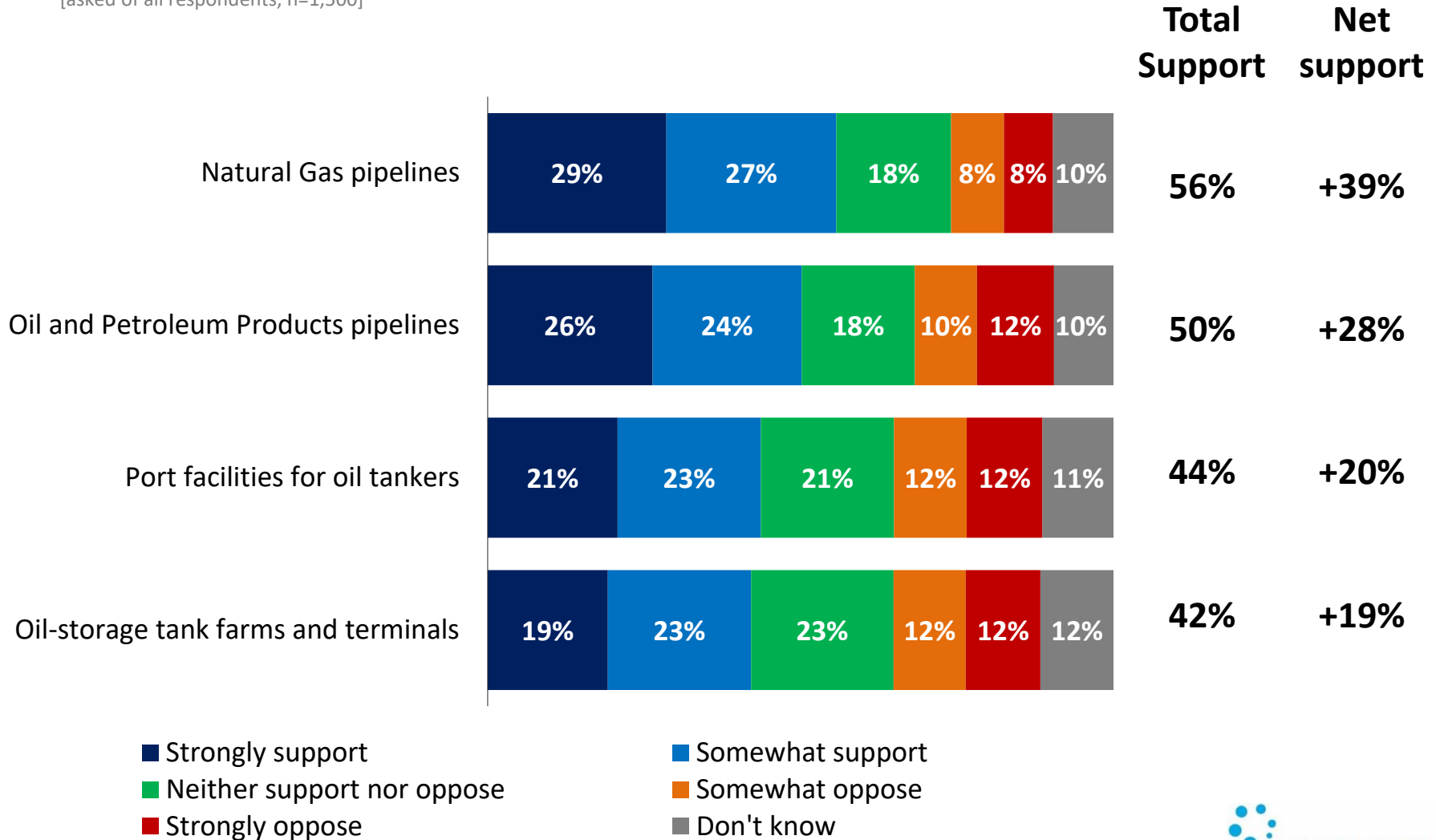
# Support for Various Oil & Gas Projects

# General Support: Support for pipelines higher than for other<sup>7</sup> projects; NG (56%) higher than oil/petroleum products (50%)

Generally speaking, would your initial reaction be to support or oppose a proposal to build each of the following projects?

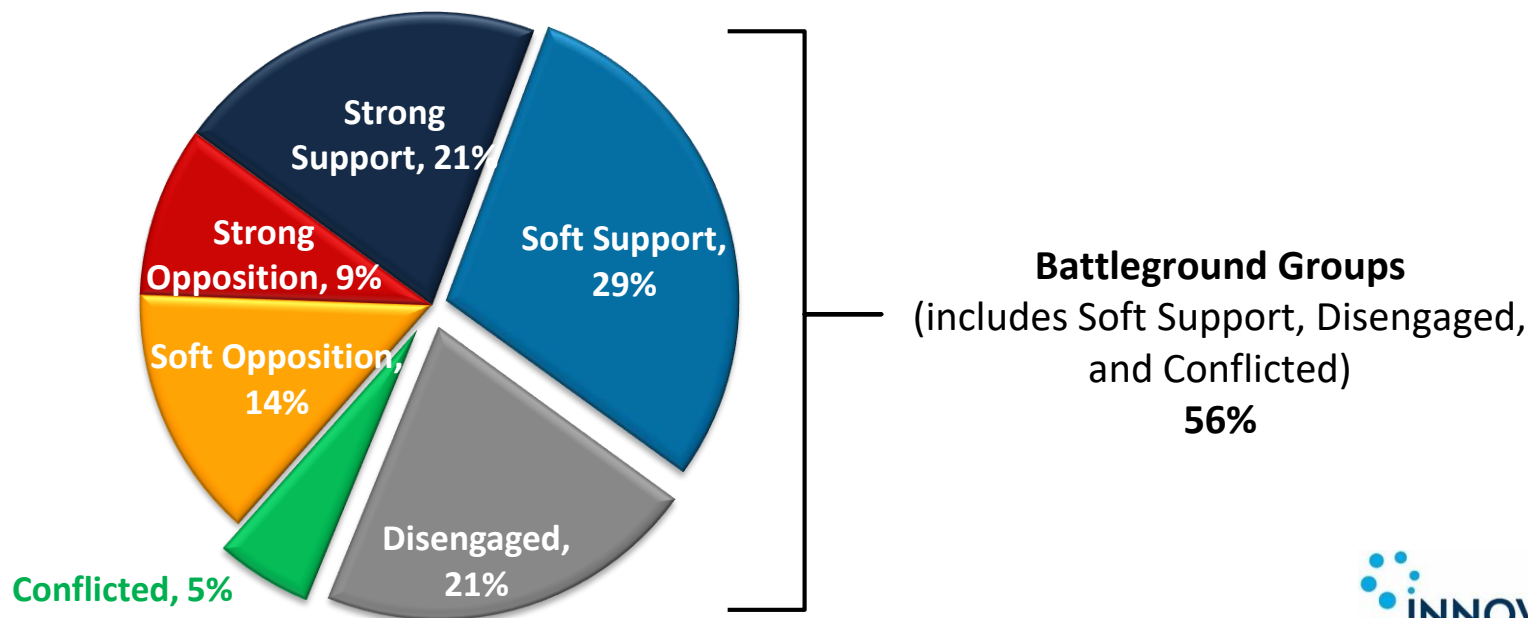

# Support Segmentation: Half (56%) are in the Battleground Groups, with 29% in Soft Support and 21% Disengaged

Based on the four questions on general support for oil projects, we group respondents into six groups.

- **Strong Support** includes respondents who say support more often than oppose, and say *strongly support* three or four times.
- **Soft Support** includes those who say support more often than oppose, and say *strongly support* to no more than two out of the four projects asked.
- **Disengaged** includes those who say *don't know* or *neither support nor oppose* at least three times.
- **Conflicted** includes those who are equally likely to say either support or oppose. This group also includes those who say support once more than oppose (or vice versa) and have given a strong opinion only once.
- **Soft Opposition** includes those who say oppose more often than support, and say *strongly oppose* to no more than two out of the four projects asked.
- **Strong Opposition** includes those who say oppose more often than support, and say *strongly oppose* three or four times.

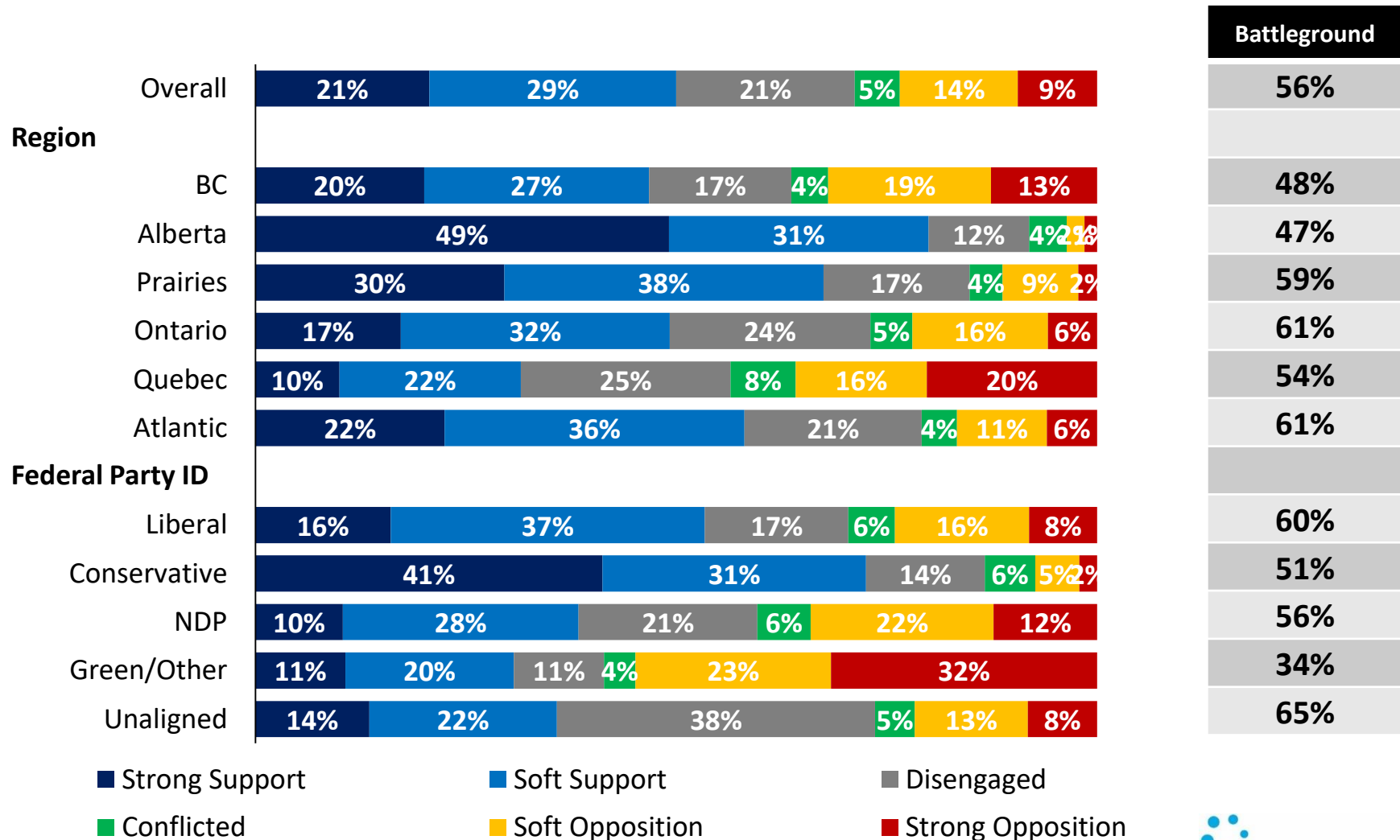




# Segmentation Breakdown: Battleground Groups are most prevalent in Ontario and the Atlantic Provinces

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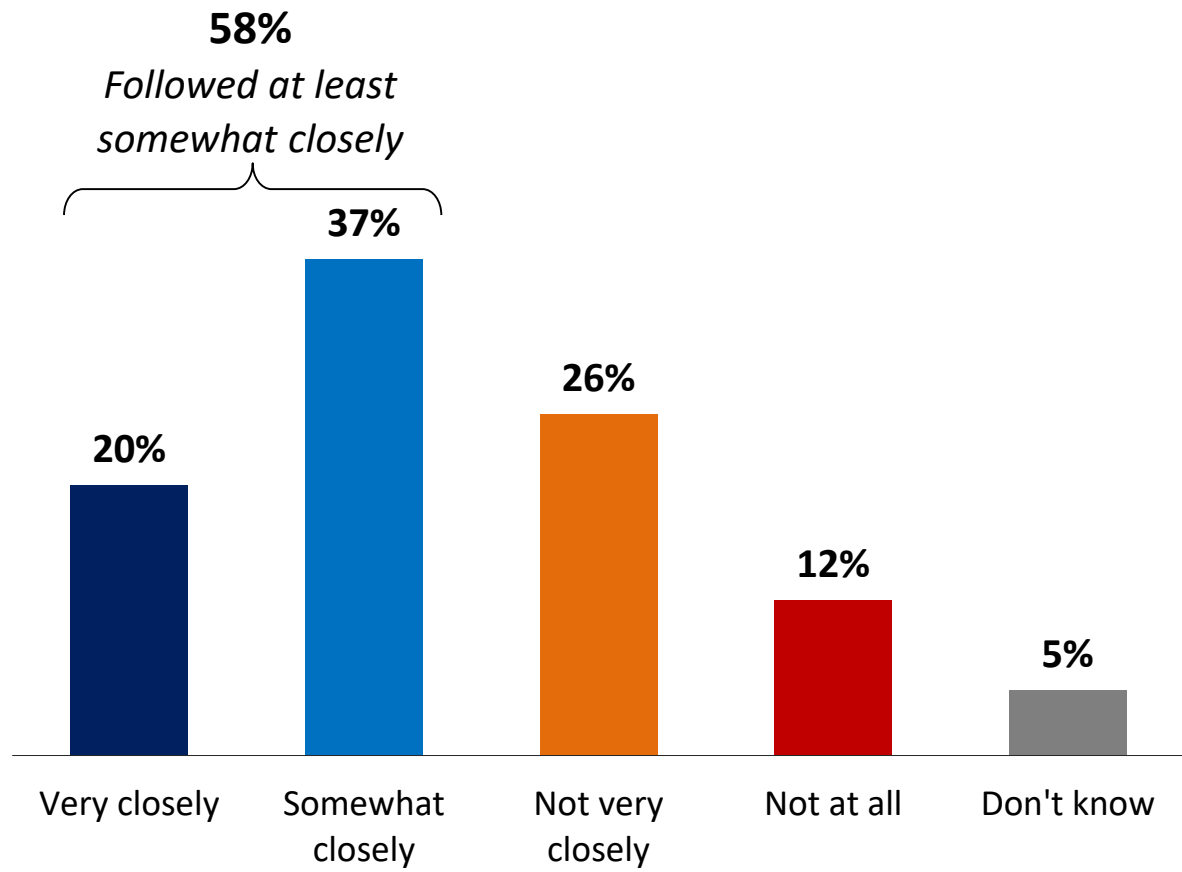
Segmentation BY Region and Federal Party ID

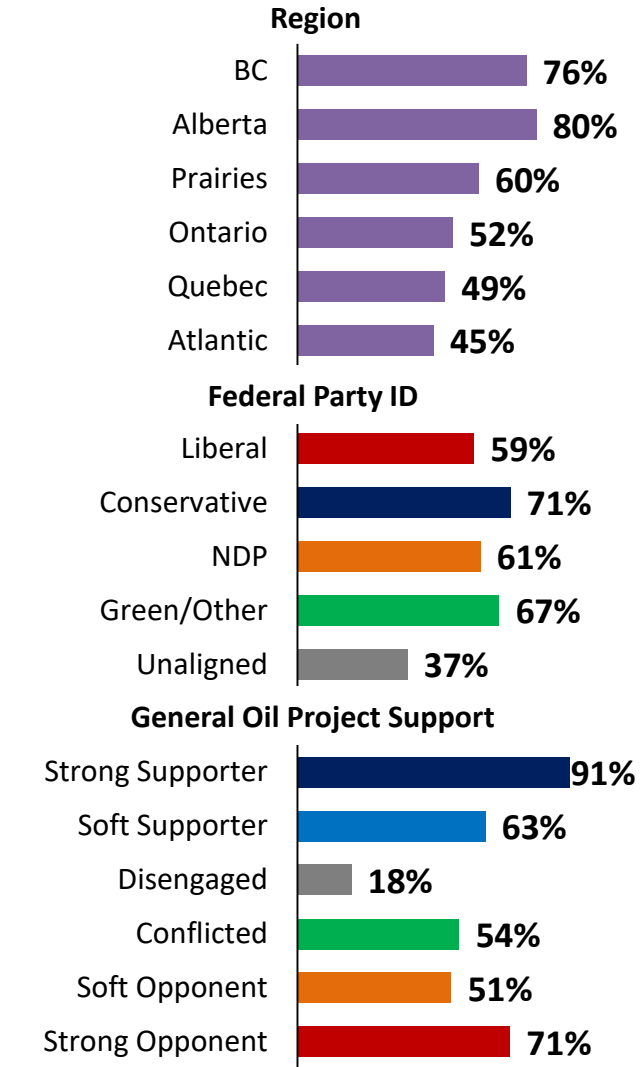
# Awareness: 6-in-10 (58%) have followed the news at least somewhat closely; highest among strong supporters (91%)

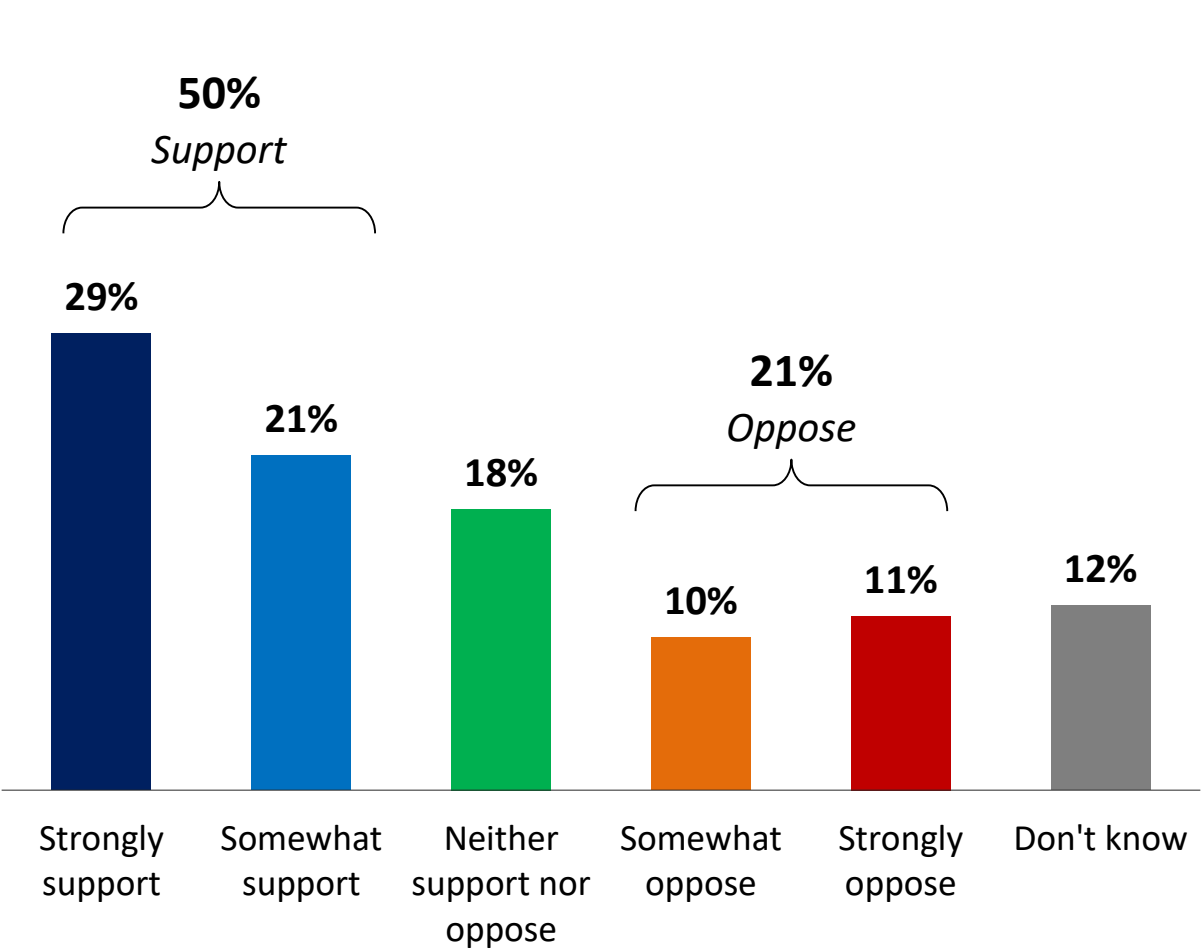

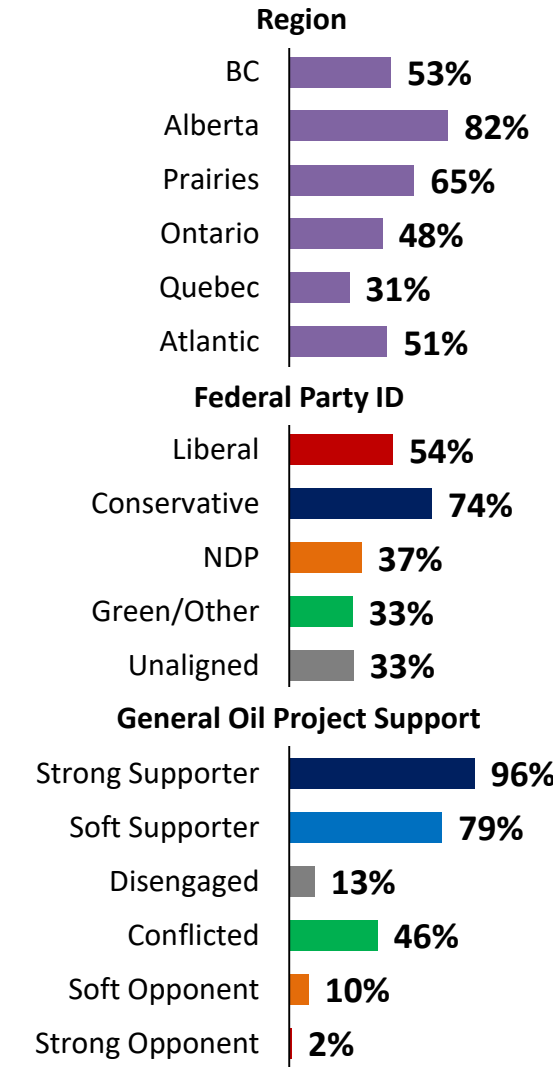
# Approval Support: Half (50%) support federal government's expansion approval; highest in Alberta (82%)<sup>12</sup>

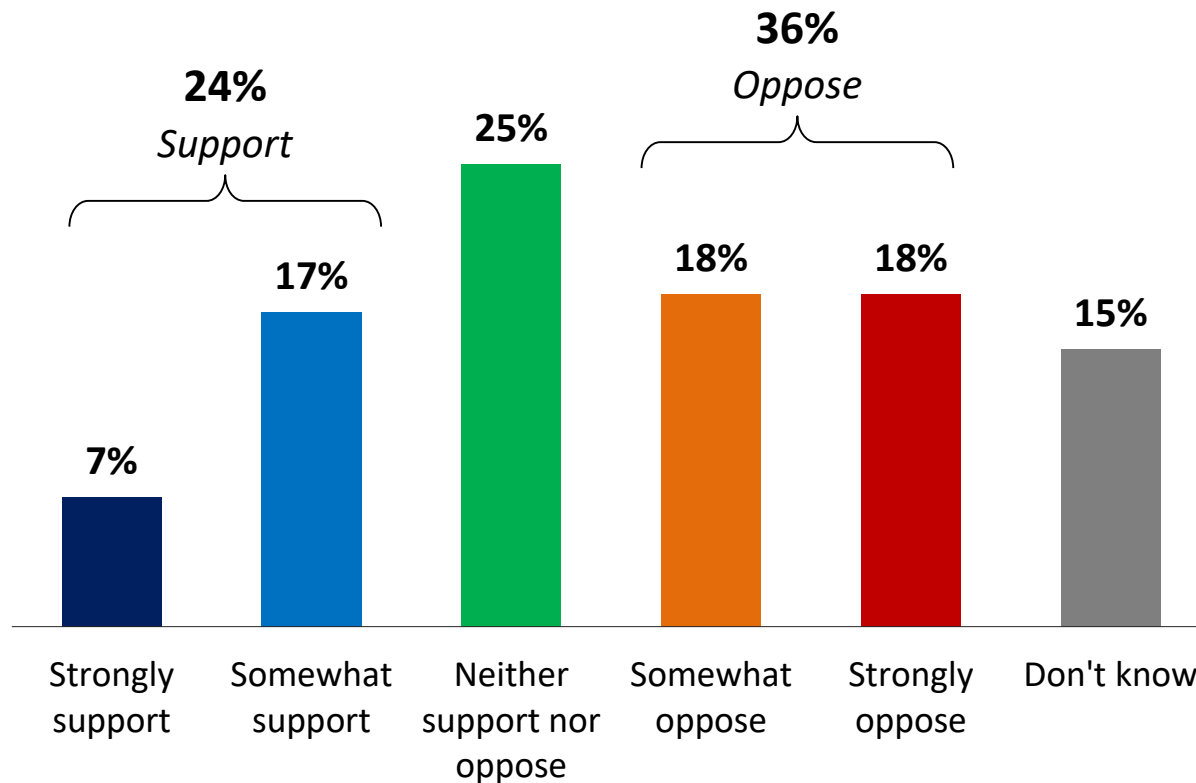
# Fed Gov't Management Support: Opposition (36%) higher and more intense than support (24%)

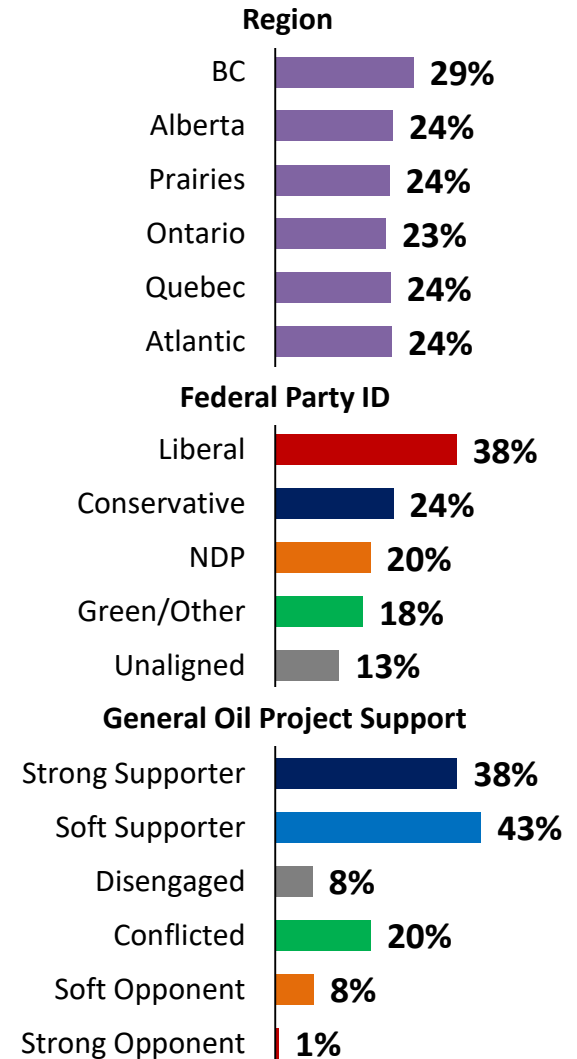
Since the government approved the pipeline in 2016, do you support or oppose the way the federal government has managed this issue?

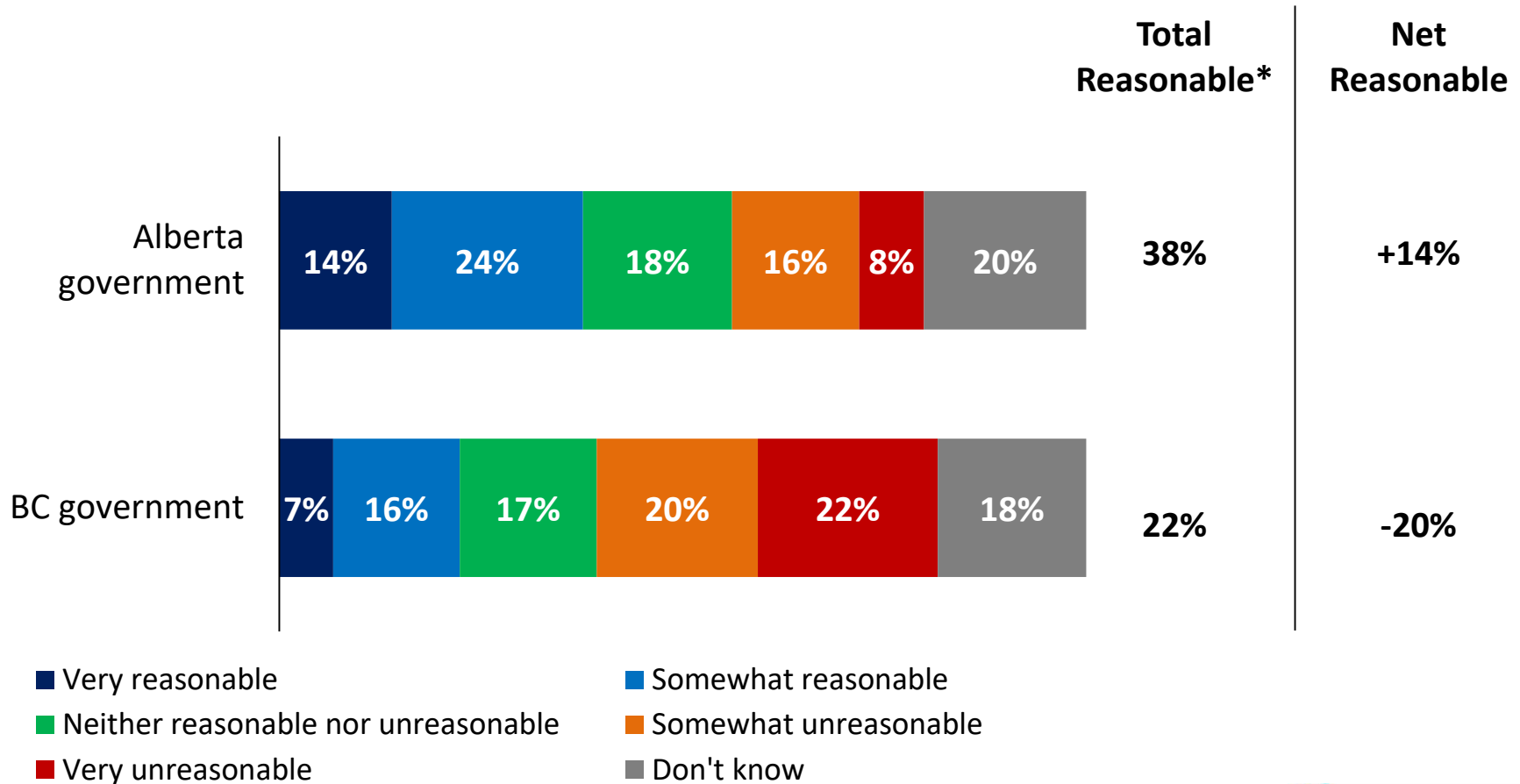
# BC/AB Dispute: Less than half view either province as reasonable, but AB seen as more reasonable than BC

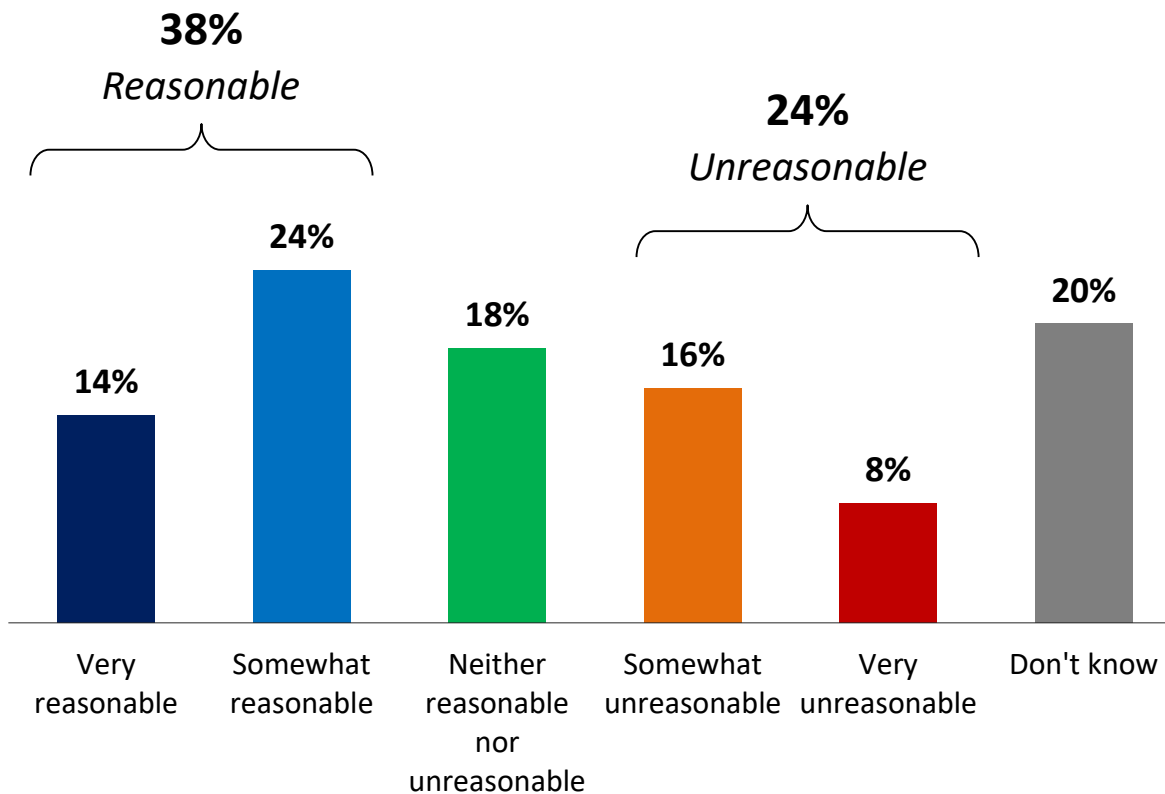

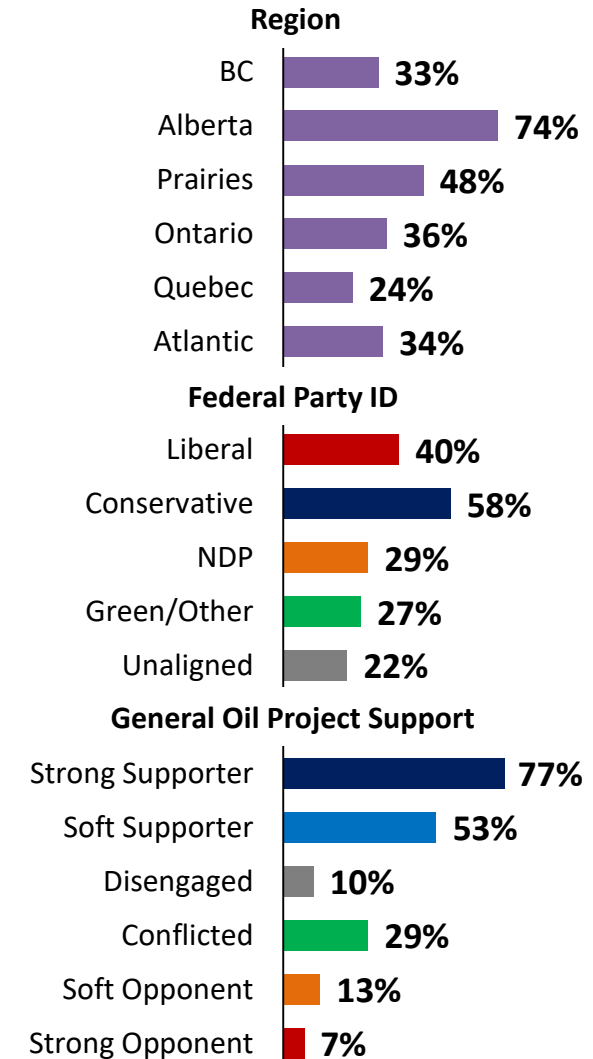

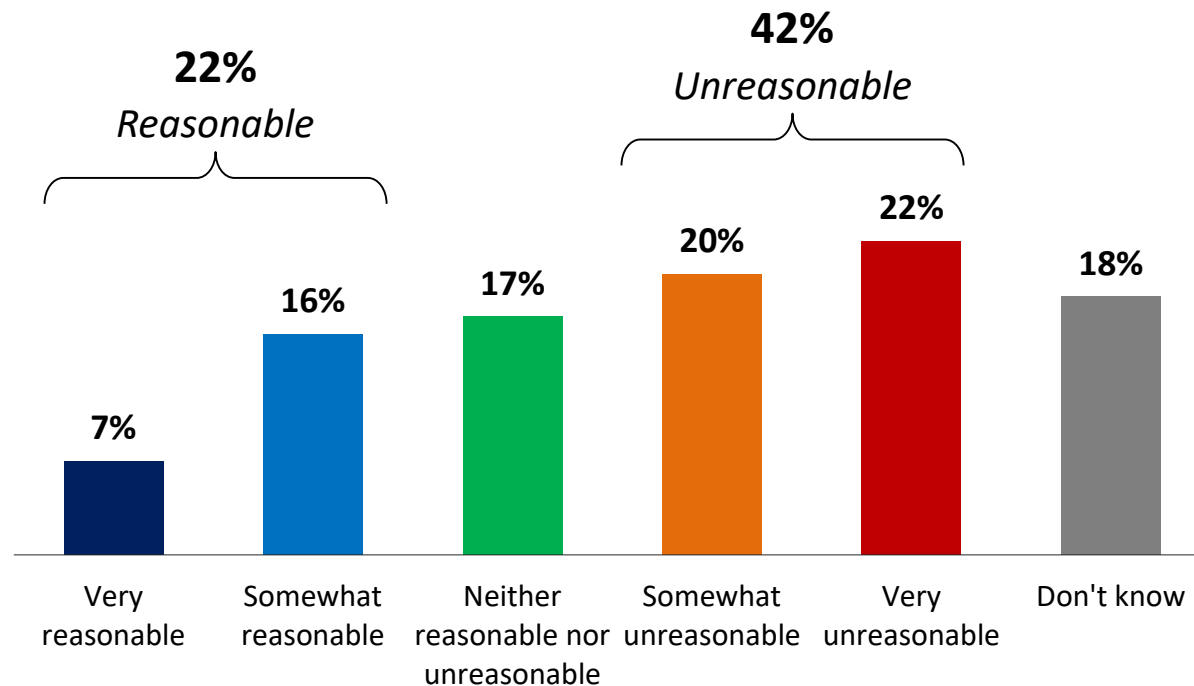


# BC Government: Only a third (34%) of residents feel the BC government has been reasonable, much lower outside BC <sup>17</sup>

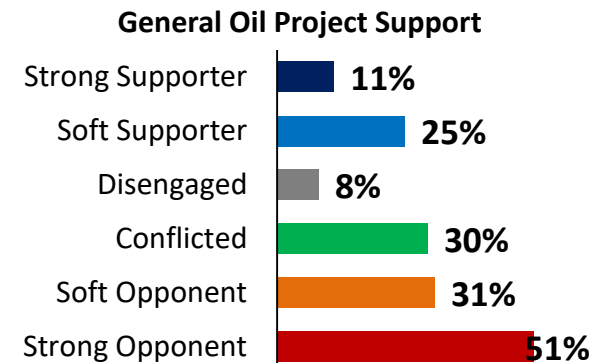
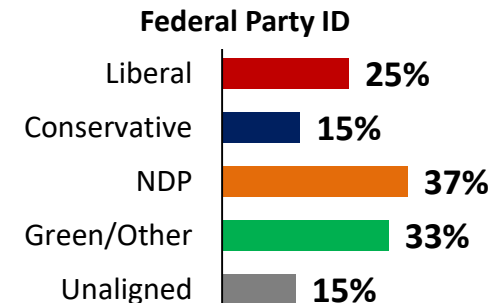
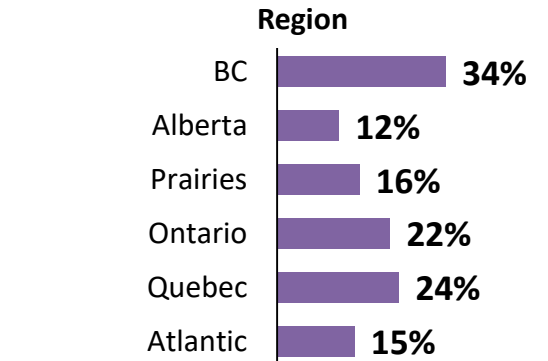

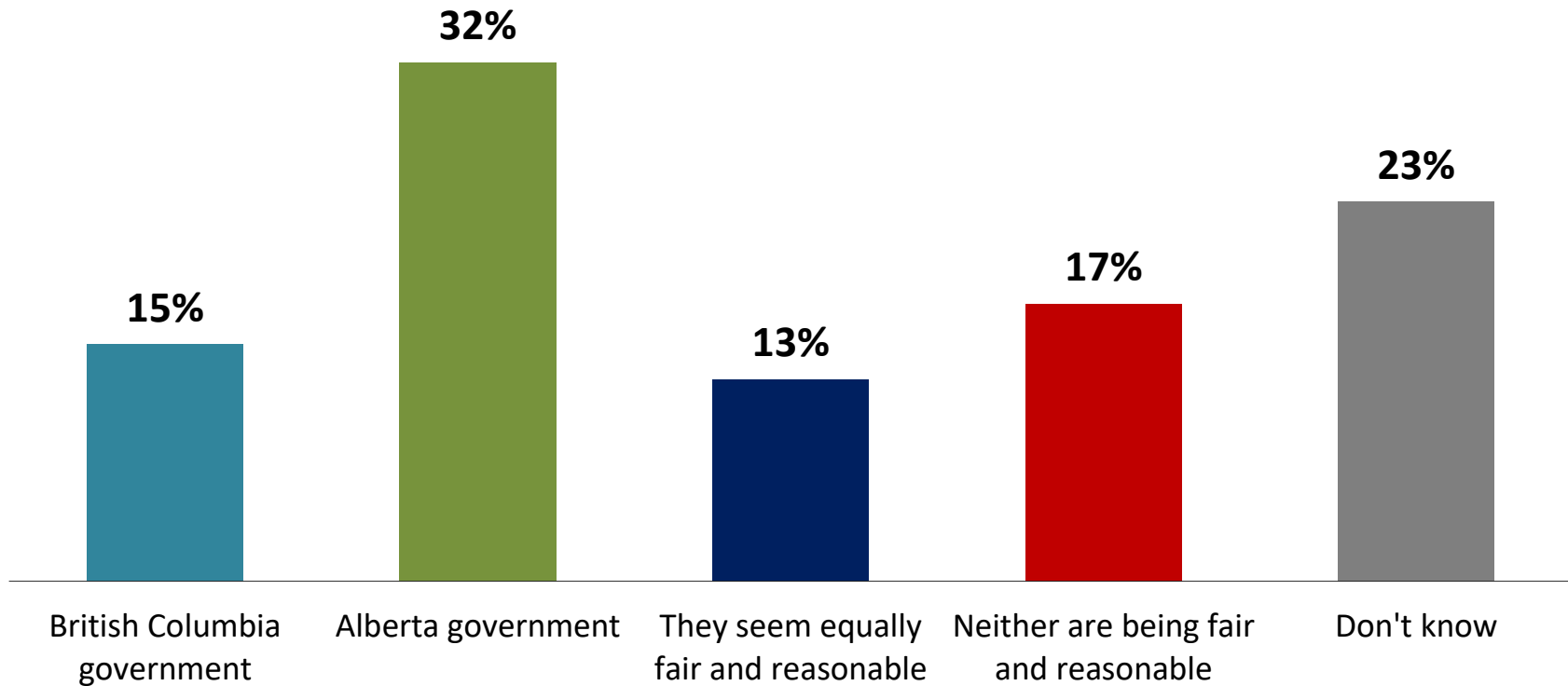


# Most Reasonable: Most (53%) don't choose sides, but twice as many choose AB as most reasonable over BC

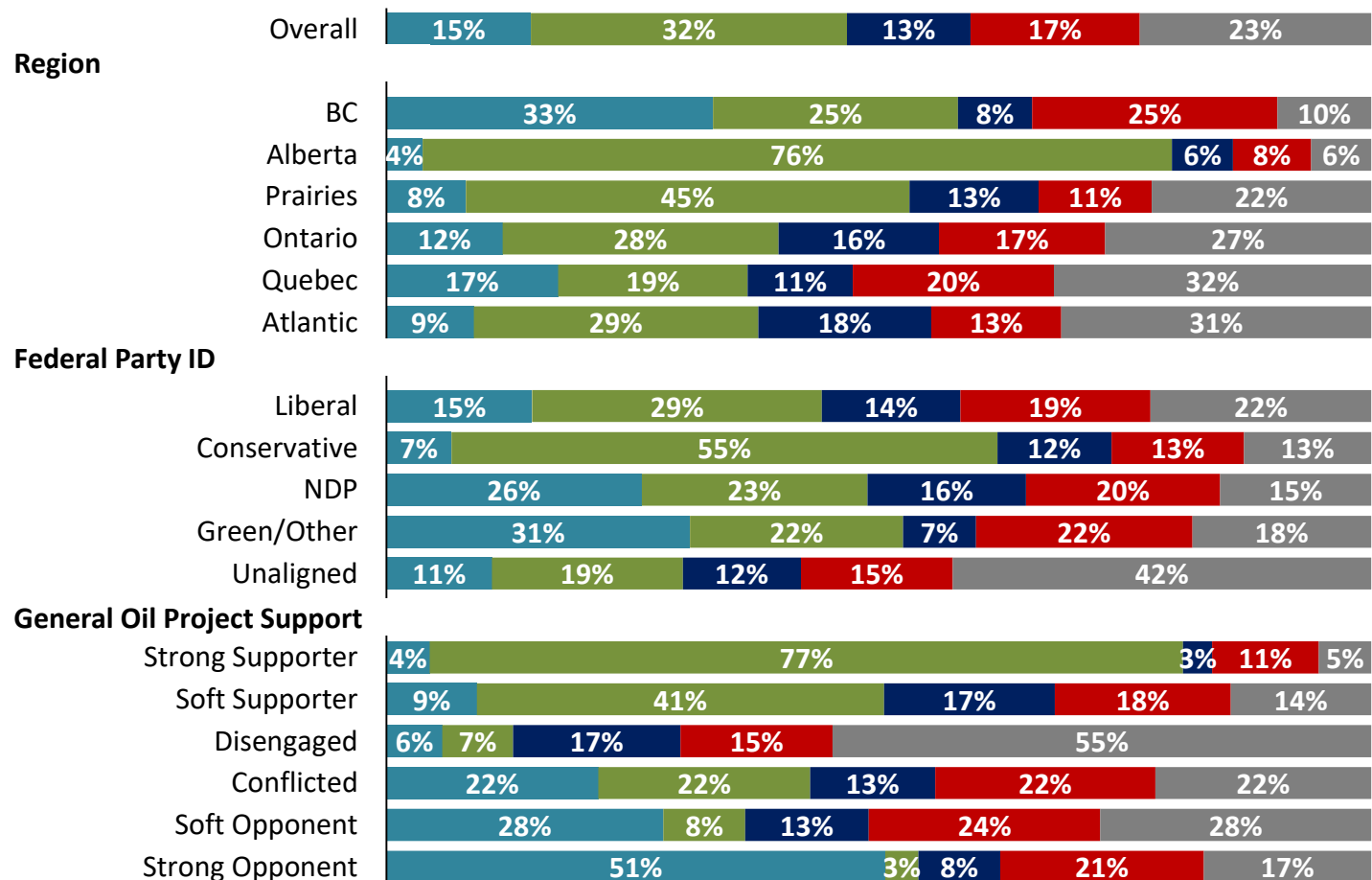

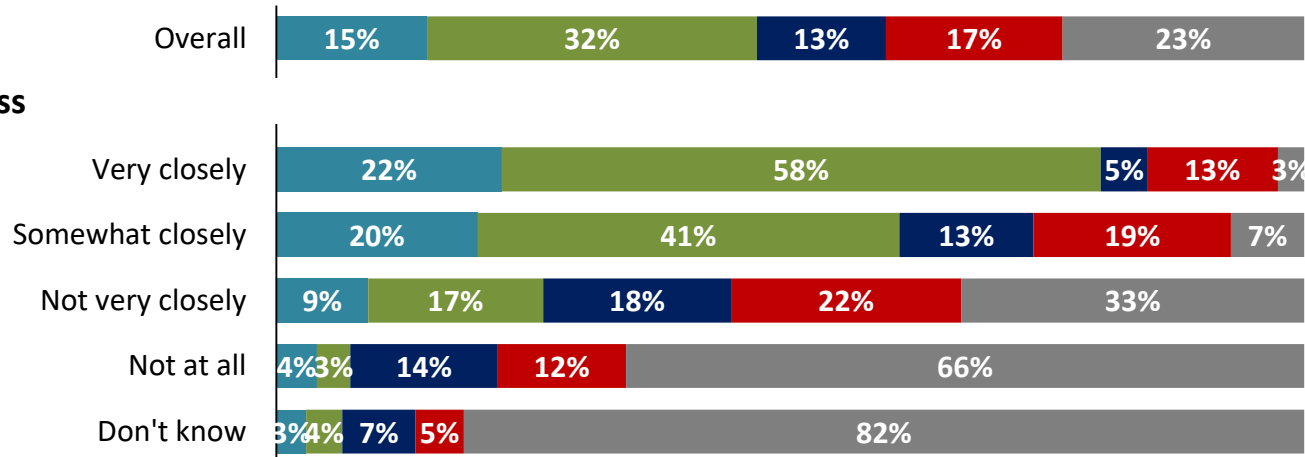

# Most Reasonable: Those following most closely are more than 2x as likely to deem AB gov't most reasonable over BC

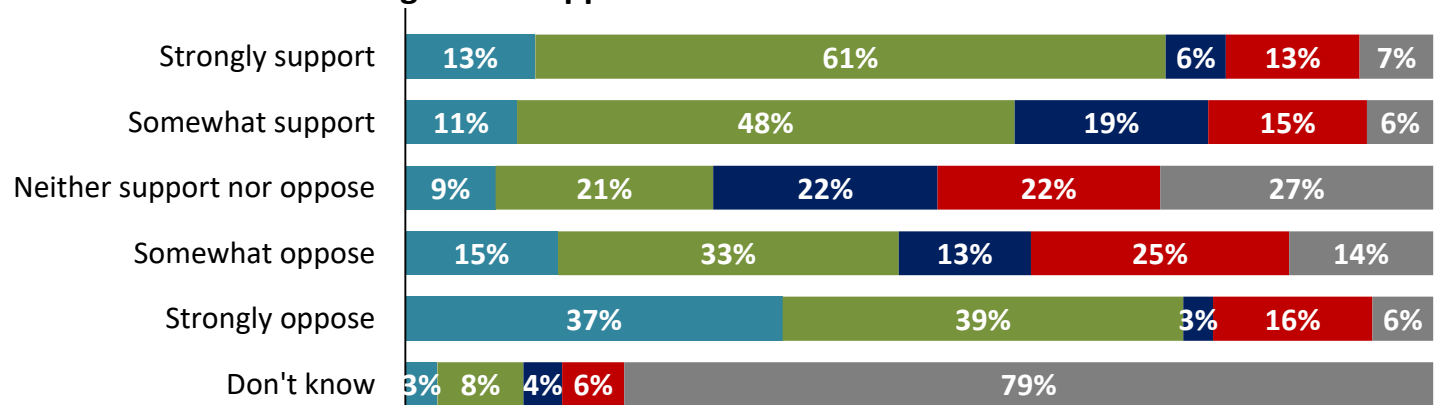

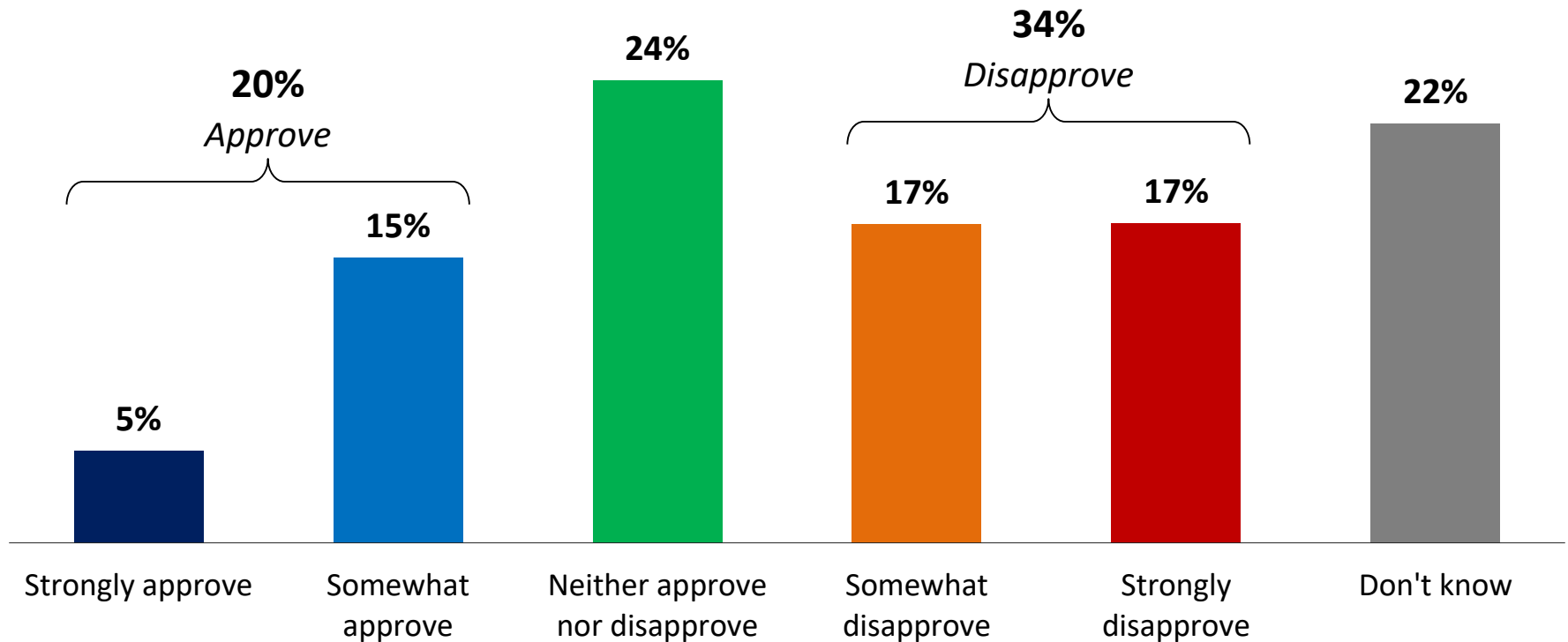

Do you approve or disapprove of the way the federal government has handled the dispute between Alberta and BC?

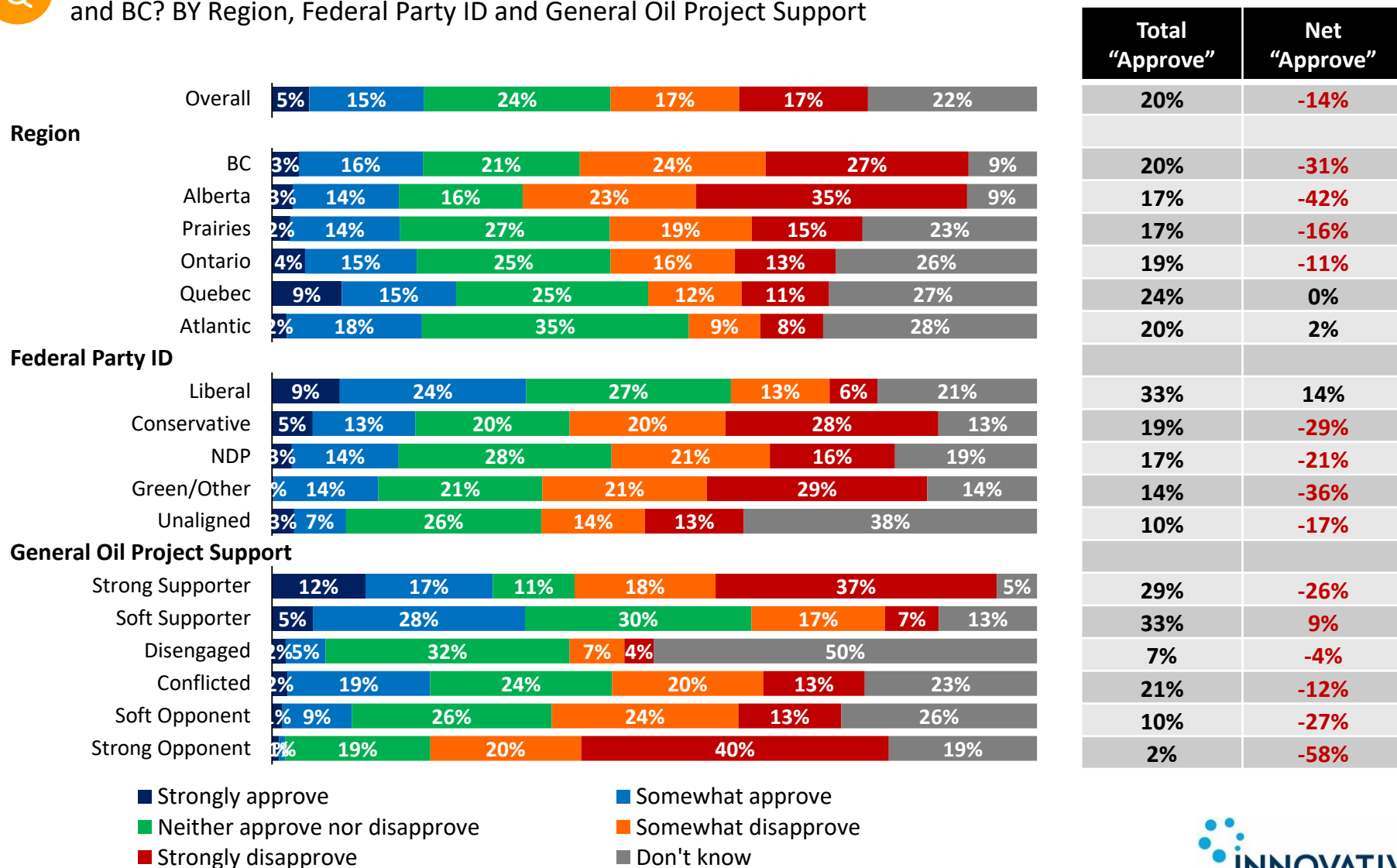

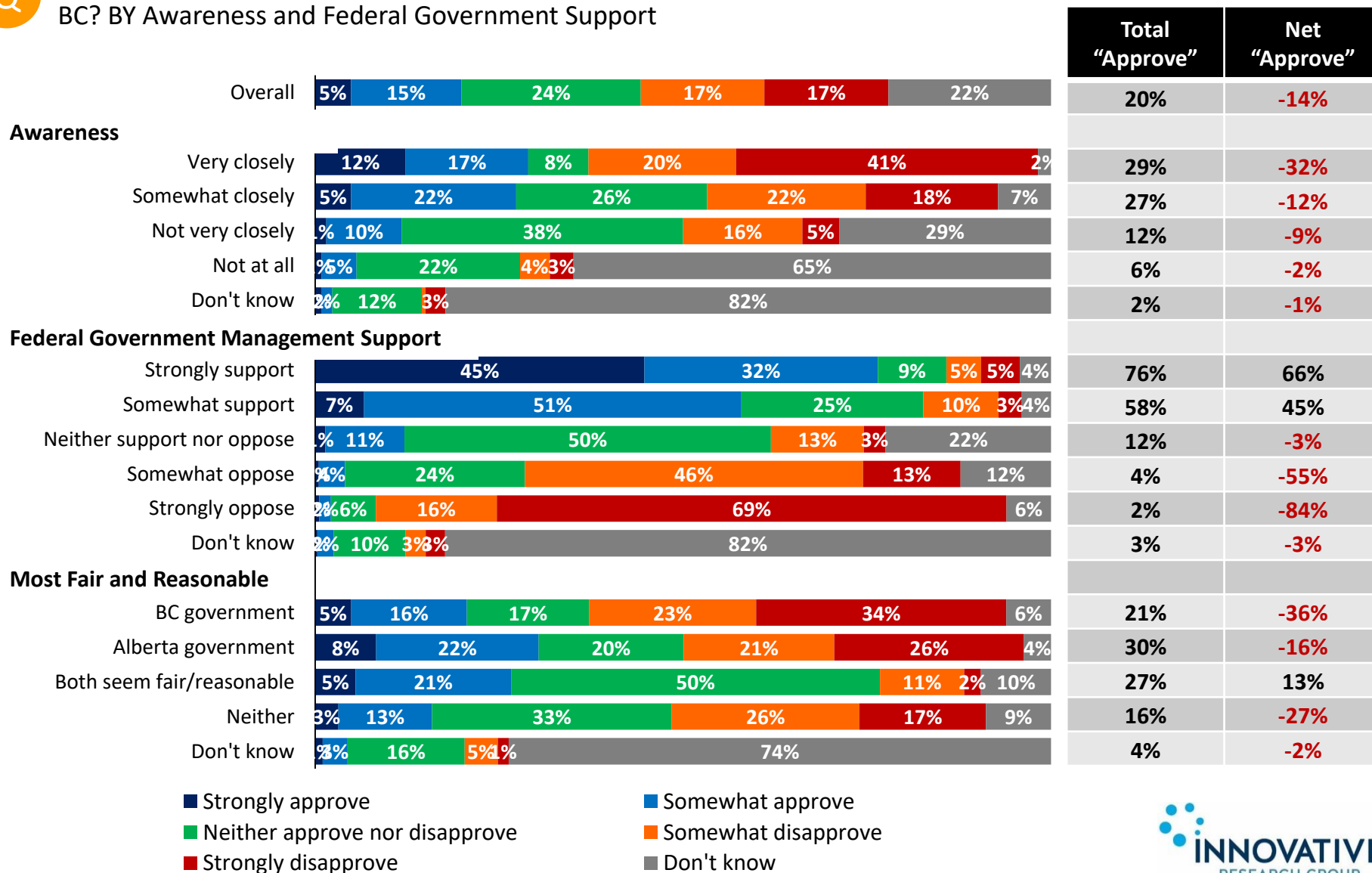
Do you approve or disapprove of the way the federal government has handled the dispute between Alberta and BC? BY Region, Federal Party ID and General Oil Project Support

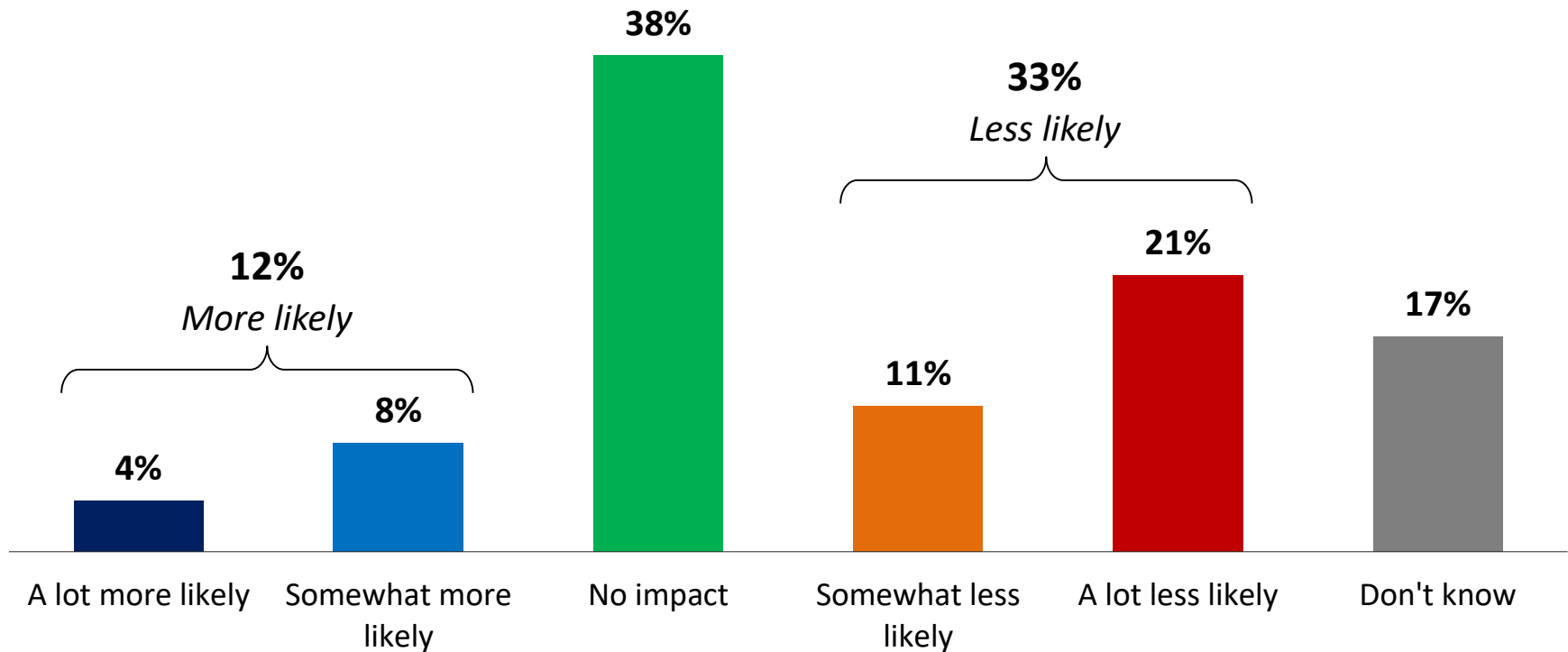


# Impact on Vote: No impact or uncertainty for most, but negative impact higher and more intense than positive

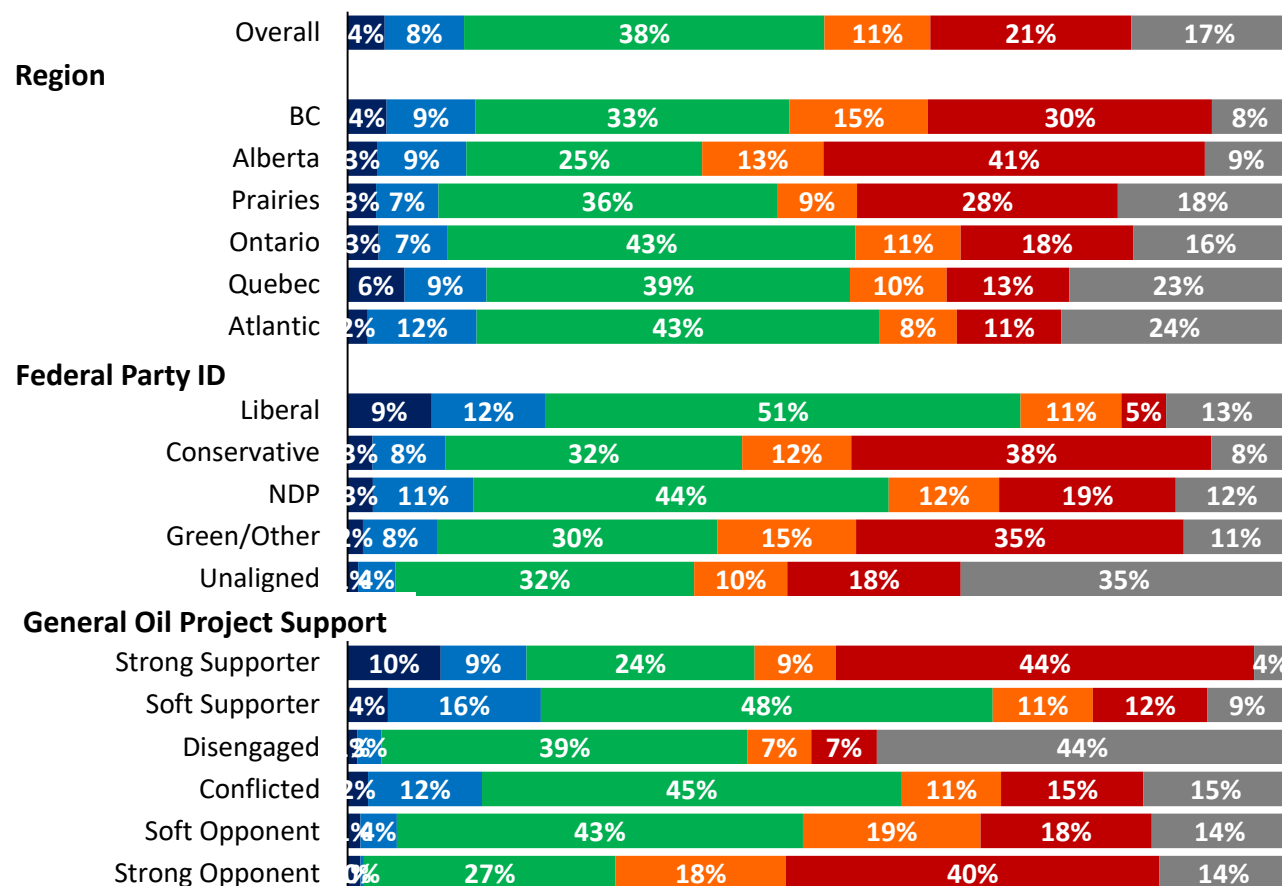
# Impact on Vote: Net positive impact only among Liberal partisans; most negative in AB and among Strong Opponents

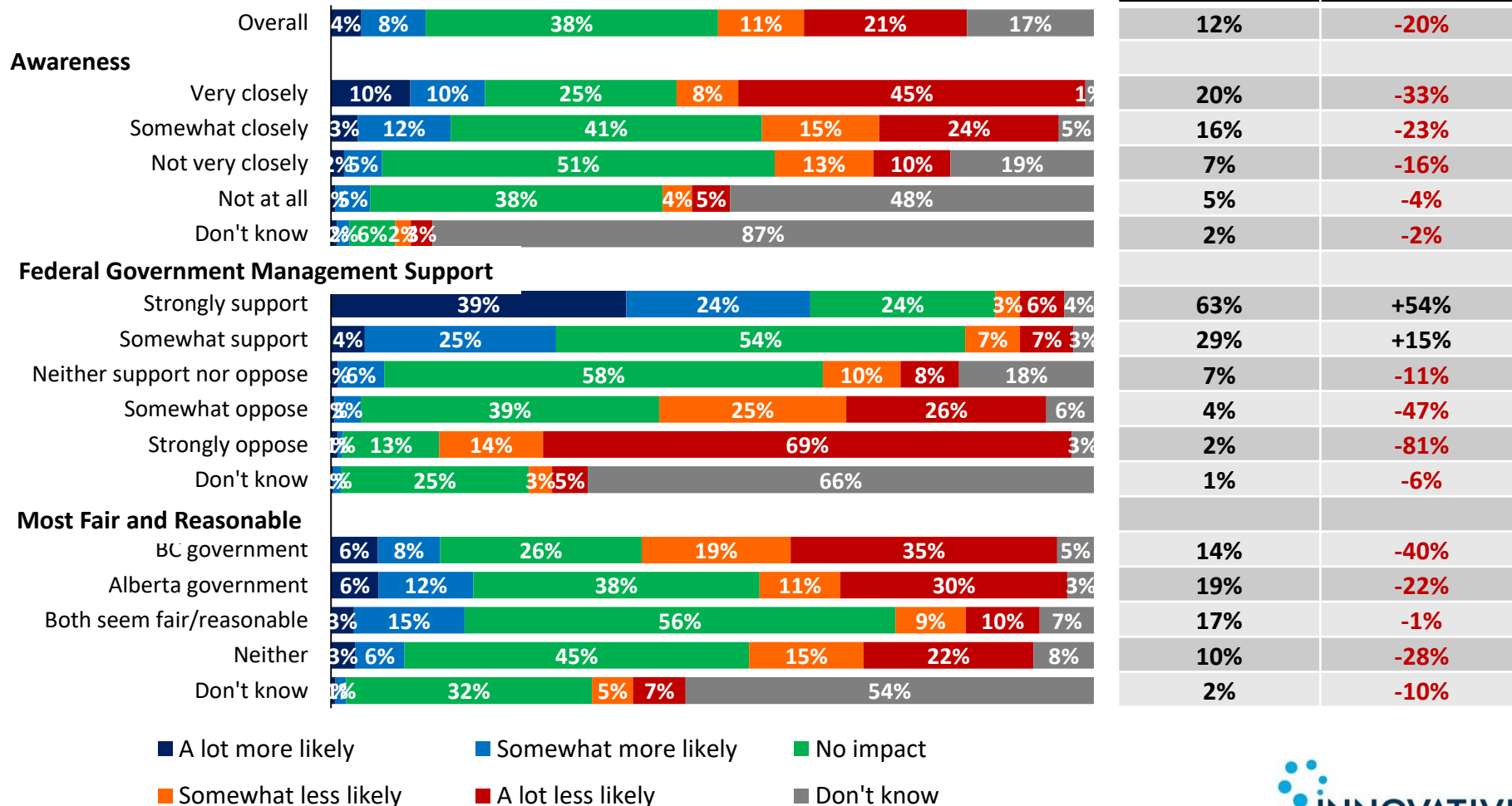
# Impact on Vote: Net positive impact only among those who support federal government management of expansion <sup>27</sup>
