

Public Opinion Research Ontario Election: May Polling Wave 4

Vote, Leadership and Final Debate

Field Dates: May 27th (immediately following the final debate) to May 30th, 2018

Sample Size: n=1,000

Methodology

- These are the findings of a special Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) online poll conducted from May 27th (immediately following the final debate) to May 30th, 2018 with tracking drawn from our monthly Canada This Month surveys.
- This online survey of 1,112 adult Ontarians was conducted on INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Léger, a leading provider of online sample. The sample is weighted to n=1,000 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.
 - The vote, leader and debate analysis, as well as segmentations and cluster analysis herein is based on the 958 completed surveys as of May 29th, (weighted n=800). The survey ran for an additional day to bring the final sample size up to 1,000. Thus, sample sizes noted on some slides will vary.
- The panels are recruited from a wide variety of sources to reflect the age, gender, region and language characteristics of the country as a whole. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey, and panel members can only complete a particular survey once.
- This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a
 margin of error can not be calculated. The Marketing Research and Intelligence Association prohibits statements
 about margins of sampling error or population estimates with regard to most online panels.
- **NOTE:** References to May 2018 Wave 1 refer to our May 2018 Canada this Month survey in field from May 7th to May 9th, with a weighted sample of n=915 respondents. References to May 2018 Wave 2 refer to our first special online poll in field from May 9th to May 12th, with a weighted sample of n=1,500 respondents. References to May 2018 Wave 3 refer to our online poll from May 18th to May 23rd with a weighted sample of n=1,050. The current wave of results is referred to as May 2018 Wave 4.


Note: Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.

Ontario Weights: Age, gender, and region

Results for Ontario are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported below.




Provincial Vote and ID

Thinking about politics in Ontario, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a... [asked of all respondents; n=800]




Combined Vote Tracking: NDP now have an edge over PCs, while Liberal vote continues to decline




Decided Vote Tracking: NDP vote continues to surge, while PC and Liberal support declines post-debate




2nd Choice: Liberals neck-and-neck with NDP as second choice party




Voting for Second Choice: Almost two-thirds (64%) say it is unlikely they will vote for their second choice


Likelihood to vote 2nd choice












Battleground Segments (May 2018 Wave 4)




Issue Salience in Ontario: Health care (42%), cost of living (41%) and jobs (30%) consistently top issues for Ontarians





















Kathleen Wynne: Wynne's reviews are marginally more favourable since the final debate







Andrea Horwath: Horwath's net favourability declines post-30 debate due to increase in unfavourable opinion


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Mike Schreiner: Marginal improvement in net favourability for Schreiner as recognition increases



Best Premier: Gap between Horwath and Ford for best premier widens; Wynne continues to decline




Attributes: Doug Ford now leads in all three negative attributes; Horwath up across the board






Party Attributes Tracking (1 of 2): PCs strongest on cutting taxes; NDP gain on health and ethical standard




Party Attributes (2 of 2): NDP strongest party on education, 37 PCs highest on energy, Liberals don't lead on any issue










Alienation Segmentation



Economic Values Tracking: These two value statements define economic alienation segmentation we can track over time




Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?




Economic Alienation Segmentation: 4-in-10 (40%) are either ambivalent or alienated

Economic Alienation Segmentation: Marginal shift between Dream Achievers and Hopefuls




Tracking Decided Vote by Alienation Segmentation








