
Methodology

- These are the findings of questions taken from an Innovative Research Group (INNOVATIVE) omnibus poll conducted from March 1st to March 4th, 2019.
- This online survey of 2,122 adult Canadians was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online sample. The results are weighted to n=1,500 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.
- Respondents from the Canada 20/20 and Lucid panels are recruited from a wide variety of sources to reflect the age, gender,
 region, and language characteristics of the country as a whole. INNOVATIVE provides each panellist with a unique URL via an email
 invitation so that only invited panel members are able to complete the survey, and panel members can only complete a particular
 survey once.
- Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel. Sub-regional quotas are set within regions to ensure there is a representative sample of respondents from across the entire region.
- The sample is then weighted to ensure it reflect the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.
- This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error can not be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

Note: Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.



Thinking about politics in Canada, generally speaking, do you think of yourself as a... [asked of all respondents]



If a federal election were held today, which party would you vote for? In that case, which party do you lean toward slightly? [VOTE + LEAN] [asked of all respondents, n=1,500]






Decided Federal Vote by Region Tracking: Vote and lean in each region of Canada among only decided voters


Segmentation Attitudes: 58% of respondents believe that the role of government is to create equal opportunity, while only 30% believe it is to redistribute wealth to the poor




When governments make major decisions concerning spending on programs and services, do you think they should be based on ...?

















Gap Segmentation: One-in-five respondents are "Thrifty Moderates" (20%) or "Business

Liberals"; only 10% are "Deferential Conservatives"

These clusters are based on 4 basic values: equal opportunity versus redistribution; trust in the profit system; whether spending should be based on ability to afford or public need; and whether government should listen to experts or common sense.




Vote by Value Cluster: In the past month, the Liberals have dropped 7 points among "Business

Liberals"




Combined Vote BY Value Cluster





Impact by Value: At least 1-in-4 members of each value group say what they have heard has left them feeling much less favourable about the Liberals and Justin Trudeau


Has what you have heard about this issue left you feeling more or less favourable towards Justin Trudeau and the Liberal Party of Canada? BY Value Cluster



Belief by Value: While all groups are more likely to believe Wilson-Raybould than Trudeau, Business Liberals are the most likely to believe the Prime Minister at 32%

















Trudeau's Favourability by Gap Segment: Net impressions of Trudeau drop from positive in every segment in September 2018 to negative in February 2019













In your view, using a scale of 0 to 10 where 10 is extremely serious and 0 is not serious at all, how serious a problem do you feel discrimination is in Canada today?



Importance of Discrimination: One-in-four respondents (40%) think that discrimination was a serious issue in the past and remains a serious issue today

Respondents were grouped together based on their views of how serious an issue discrimination has been historically and how serious an issue they believe it is today in Canada. Respondents who rate the seriousness of discrimination as at least 7 out of 10 are treated as calling it a serious issue.






Vote by Discrimination: The Liberal Party leads in both groups that feel discrimination has historically been a serious issue, while the Conservative Party leads in groups that feel it was not


Combined Vote BY Importance of Discrimination











Feminist Attitudes: 41% of respondents agree that they would describe themselves as feminists 38 while 35% of respondents believe equality has been achieved between women and men



Feminism Segmentation: Creating the Segments


Based on the two agree/disagree statements "I personally would describe myself as a feminist" and "Equality between women and men has been achieved in Canada", we have segmented the population for analysis.






Feminist Values: 21% of respondents both agree that they would describe themselves as feminists and disagree that equality between women and men has been achieved



Vote by Feminist Values: The Liberals lead by 27 points among strong feminists, but are either tied or trail behind the Conservatives among other groups






Trudeau's Favourability by Feminist Values: 46% of non-feminists have very unfavourable views




Awareness by Feminist Values: Strong feminists are the most likely to be following the issue closely (76%), while only a third (32%) of those who are ambivalent say they're following closely











Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?








Indigenous Attitude Segmentation: Creating the Segments






Indigenous Attitude Segmentation: Nearly half of respondents are conflicted on how they

think Canada should address indigenous issues



Combined Vote BY Indigenous Attitude




Trudeau's Favourability by Indigenous Attitude: Those who support equal treatment for all








