

### Ontario Politics in the time of COVID-19

The COVID-19 outbreak has set off a series of changes in the Canadian political landscape. In Ontario, Ford is seeing very high approval on his handling of the outbreak, which has translated into a massive turnaround in his personal favourables. Ontarians have never been more satisfied with the provincial government since our online tracking began in 2012.


Today, INNOVATIVE is releasing results from our May 2020 Canada This Month survey. This online survey was in field from May 1<sup>st</sup> to May 5<sup>th</sup> with a weighted sample size of 600 Ontario residents. Detailed methodology is provided in the appendix.

This report covers key results on how those from Ontario are rating their government's handling of the COVID-19 outbreak and the impacts that is having on more general government approval and provincial vote choice.

# **COVID-19 Handling:** Nearly 3-in-4 (73%) are satisfied with the Ontario <sup>4</sup> government's handling of the COVID-19 epidemic

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
Do you approve or disapprove of the way the Ontario Government has handled the outbreak of COVID-19? [asked of all respondents; n=600]



# **COVID-19 Handling Tracking:** Approval of the Ontario government's handling of the outbreak is trending up since March




Do you approve or disapprove of the way the Ontario Government has handled the outbreak of COVID-19? [asked of all respondents; n=600]




This approval of COVID-19 handling has created a halo effect for general government satisfaction, driving it up to its highest point in years

### Ontario Mood: 7-in-10 (70%) are satisfied with the Ontario provincial government, only 1-in-4 (26%) feel dissatisfied

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
Generally speaking, how satisfied are you with the performance of the PROVINCIAL government in Ontario? Would you say you are...? [asked of all respondents; n=600]

### Ontario Read, Seen, Heard: 3-in-4 (73%) recall something about the Premier, and 64% of those people felt more favourably towards Ford




Have you read, seen or heard anything about [PREMIER] in the last few days?



### **Read, Seen, Heard Tracking:** Recall about the Premier is trending up; it 12 now reaches the highest since the middle of last year








### **Core Political Values:** Half (50%) feel government should listen to experts when it comes to policy

Now we would like to ask a few questions about basic values and society...When governments make major decisions concerning spending on programs and services, do you think they should be basing their decisions mainly on...?




Which of the following statements comes closest to your view? [asked of all respondents; n=600]






### Value Clusters: Largest clusters in Ontario are Core Left (24%) and Business Liberals (24%); only 11% are Deferential Conservatives

**Value clusters:** Clusters are based on 4 basic values: equal opportunity versus redistribution; trust in the profit system; whether spending should be based on ability to afford or public need; and whether government should listen to experts or common sense.



Do you agree or disagree with the following statements? -[asked of all respondents; n=600]






### **Economic Gap Segmentation:** Achievers (34%) are largest economic segment, followed by Alienated (24%)






### **Time for Change Attitudes:** Respondents are evenly split on whether or not it is time for a change in government



Do you agree or disagree with the following statements? - [asked of all respondents; n=600]






### **Time for Change Segmentation:** 40% of respondents are either Soft anti-PC or Hostile




Ford has seen a remarkable turnaround in his personal favourability during the outbreak

Has the way premier Doug Ford has responded to the COVID-19 outbreak left you with a better or worse impression of him? [asked of all respondents, n=600]






### Impression of Premiers, Ontario: Plurality (31%) of those who said








#### And why do you feel that way? [OPEN ENDED]








### Andrea Horwath Favourability: Horwath sees a decline in the portion saying "favourable"; those saying unfavourable is steady




### **Steven Del Duca Favourability:** Most respondents don't have a firm opinion of Del Duca




### Ontario Party Leader NET Favourables Tracking: Ford's favourability has jumped 56 points since March



### **Leader favourability by Value Clusters:** More Ontarians see Ford favourably than unfavourably across all groups except the Core Left




#### **NET Favourability by Value Clusters:**

Each chart shows the net favourability (% favourable minus % unfavourable) for each leader within INNOVATIVE's 6 value cluster segments.




### **Leader favourability by Economic Gap:** Ford receives the highest net favourability from Strugglers (+48%) and lowest from Alienated (-16%)


### **Leader favourability by Time for a Change:** Those hostile towards the government show highest favourability towards Horwath (+39% net)

# Ontario PC is trending up in vote, but still lagging behind Ontario Liberals

Innovative reports on vote intention in two ways.


When we ask people who they would vote for if an election were held today, and who they lean towards if they are unsure, we call those results **Combined vote**. This accounts for the views of everyone in the population including decided voters, undecided voters, and non-voters.

When we look at the results among *only* decided voters, we call that **Decided vote**. These results most tell us what the election results would be like if the survey results matched the election exactly.

# **Provincial Combined Vote:** 1-in-3 (34%) would vote Liberal, 3-in-10 (30%) PC, and 16% for NDP with 10% Undecided



If a provincial election were held today, which party would you vote for? In that case, which party do you lean toward slightly? [Vote + Lean] [asked of all respondents; n=600]






### **Provincial Vote Tracking:** PCs gain slightly (30%) month-to-month, now within striking distance of Liberals (34%)



If a provincial election were held today, which party would you vote for? In that case, which party do you lean toward slightly? [Vote + Lean] [asked of all respondents; n=600]



















### Tracking Decided Vote by Alienation Segmentation: Liberals are up among the Alienated group, while PCs gain among Achievers








## **Provincial 2nd Choice:** 1-in-5 (21%) would pick NDP as their second choice; more than a third (36%) remain undecided or would not vote



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
Thinking about politics in Ontario, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a... [asked of all respondents; n=600]

### Methodology

#### **Survey Methodology**

These are the results of an online survey conducted between May 1<sup>st</sup> and May 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

**Method:** This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

**Sample Size:** n=791 Ontario residents, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=600 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: May 1st and May 5th, 2020.

**Weighting:** Results for Ontario are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

**Margin of Error:** This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

**Note**: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.
