

# Federal Response to effects of COVID-19 on Canadian Municipalities

The COVID-19 outbreak has led to significant shortfalls in revenues for municipalities across Canada. Thus far, the Federal government has not been willing to provide support to COVID-19 related financial issues.

Today, INNOVATIVE is releasing results from the 7<sup>th</sup> wave of COVID-19 tracking. This online survey was in field from May 15<sup>th</sup> to May 20<sup>th</sup> with a weighted sample size of 1,500 and oversamples in every province. Detailed methodology is provided in the appendix.

This report covers key results on Canadians' awareness, perceived importance and support of the Federal government's current stance on municipal assistance.


Over half (54%) of respondents support the federal government providing financial assistance for municipalities. More than a third (37%) support the government's position on financial assistance, that none will be provided for municipalities.


#### Familiarity with Municipal Operating Budget shortfall: Almost half (48%) are familiar with the issues Municipalities face

In late April, The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) said, "With plummeting revenues, rising expenses and a legal proscription against running operating deficits, municipalities are at imminent risk of having to cut essential services to Canadians to remain solvent."

[asked of all respondents; n=1,500]









## Support of Financial Assistance for Municipalities: More than half support the federal government providing assistance to municipalities

To absorb these revenue losses and rising expenses in the near term, the Federation of Canadian Municipalities is asking the federal government for \$10–15 billion over the next six months.

[asked of all respondents; n=1,500]








## **Federal Government Position on Financial Assistance:** A slight plurality (37%) support the government's position

#### Methodology

#### **Survey Methodology**

These are the results of an online survey conducted between May 15<sup>st</sup> and May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

**Method:** This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

**Sample Size:** n=2,266 general population, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=1,500 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: May 15st to May 20th, 2020.

**Weighting:** Results for Canada are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

**Margin of Error:** This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

**Note**: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.
