

Ontario Landscape

The COVID-19 outbreak has set off a series of changes in the Canadian political landscape. In Ontario, satisfaction with the government's handling of the COVID-19 outbreak has been decreasing in recent months as more and more Ontarians say that the government doesn't have a plan, and increasingly say that the current restrictions in place are too loose.


Today, INNOVATIVE is releasing results from our October 2020 Canada This Month survey. This online survey was in field from October 1^{st} to November 2^{nd} with a weighted sample size of 3,000 Ontario residents. Detailed methodology is provided in the appendix.

This report covers key results on how Ontarians rate their government's performance overall, its handling of the COVID-19 outbreak, whether restrictions should be made tighter or looser, and whether the government has a plan or not.

Ontario Mood Tracking: Satisfaction with the Ontario government is down to 63% from 67% in September



COVID-19 Handling Tracking: Approval of the ON gov'ts handling of COVID down to 61% from a high of 75% in July




Government Approval: Satisfaction with the government in Ontario has closely followed approval of its COVID-19 handling





Plan to Deal with COVID: More than half (56%) either don't know or say the provincial government doesn't have a plan




Plan to deal with COVID-19: The share of respondents who say the Ontario government has no plan is up 6 points since July



Restrictions: The share who thinks restrictions are too loose continues to shrink, with 42% saying they are too loose now

Methodology

Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between October 1st and November 2nd, 2020.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=3,178 Ontario residents, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=3,000 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: Oct 1st to November 2nd, 2020.

Weighting: Results for Ontario are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

Note: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.
