Ontario Politics in the time of COVID-19

The COVID-19 outbreak has set off a series of changes in the Canadian political landscape. In Ontario, the impression voters have of Doug Ford has remained negative after a large drop in early April.

Today, INNOVATIVE is releasing results from the fourth week of our April 2021 *Canada This Month* survey. This online survey was in field from April 22nd to April 26th with a weighted sample size of 400 Ontario residents. Detailed methodology is provided in the appendix.

This report covers key results on how Ontarians rate their government's handling of the COVID-19 outbreak, Ontario vote choice, and evaluation of party leaders.

Read, Seen, Heard

Attention to the Ontario government is down from last week but remains high with 76% saying they have heard something recently. The net impact of what Ontarians have heard remains strongly negative.





Ontario government's satisfaction remains low at 45%, with 52% saying they are dissatisfied with the government.


Ontario Government Approval: A majority in Ontario (52%) are dissatisfied with the provincial government

Generally speaking, how satisfied are you with the performance of the PROVINCIAL government in Ontario? Would you say you are...? [asked of all respondents; n=400]




Government Approval Tracking: Satisfaction is up directionally from last week, but a majority remain dissatisfied

Do you approve or disapprove of the way the Ontario Government has handled the outbreak of COVID-19? [asked of all respondents; n=400]








Party Identification

The Ontario Liberal Party continues to hold a strong lead on party ID (35%) while the PCs trail at 25%. We use party ID to understand how voters in each party's base and unaligned voters react to events.

Provincial Party ID: The Ontario Liberals hold a strong lead on Party ID 13 (35%) followed by the PCs at 25%

Thinking about politics in Ontario, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a...



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Thinking about politics in Ontario, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a... [asked of all respondents; n=400]




Recent Lockdown

Attention to recent press conferences and restrictions put in place by Doug Ford is high with 73% following the news at least somewhat closely. A majority in Ontario feel that the way Ford has dealt with the situation is a sign of a deeper problem.


Awareness: 3-in-4 (73%) respondents are following Doug Ford's recent ¹⁶ press conferences regarding COVID-19; higher among NDP partisans



Ford's Response: A plurality (43%) believe Ford has responded poorly to the criticisms; highest among NDP partisans (73%)










Government Responsible: 40% of PC partisans agree that the government is directly responsible for the current spike


Political Points: A majority agree the government's health measures seem more focused on scoring political points than fighting COVID-19






Balance Health and the Economy: A majority of PC partisans agree Ford has done his best to balance the economy and public health



Tightest lockdown: More than one third (35%) believe that Ontario has implemented one of the tightest COVID restrictions in the world

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

Restrictions

More Ontarian's than ever say restrictions in place in the province are too tight (30%), but a plurality still say restrictions are too loose (39%).

Leadership


Doug Ford remains the leader with the lowest net favourability, down to -20% on net. However, he remains the top choice for Premier at 27% followed by Horwath at 21%.






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
Ontario Party Leader NET Favourables Tracking: Horwath remains the ³⁷ most popular leader on net with a slightly positive net impression

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The Liberals hold their lead over the PCs in Ontario.


Innovative reports on vote intention in two ways.

When we ask people who they would vote for if an election were held today, and who they lean towards if they are unsure, we call those results **<u>Combined vote</u>**. This accounts for the views of everyone in the population including decided voters, undecided voters, and non-voters.

When we look at the results among *only* decided voters, we call that <u>Decided vote</u>. These results most tell us what the election results would be like if the survey results matched the election exactly.

Provincial Combined Vote: The Ontario Liberals have a 2-point lead over the Progressive Conservatives among all voters

If a provincial election were held today, which party would you vote for? In that case, which party do you lean toward slightly? [Vote + Lean] [asked of all respondents; n=400]






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Provincial Vote Tracking: The Ontario Liberals (29%) maintain their narrow lead over the Progressive Conservatives (27%)

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
If a provincial election were held today, which party would you vote for? In that case, which party do you lean toward slightly? [Vote + Lean] [asked of all respondents; n=400]



Provincial Decided Vote: Among decided voters, the Liberals (35%) lead the PCs (33%) by 2 points





Methodology

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Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between April 22nd and April 26th, 2021.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Dynata, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Ontario population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=413 Ontario residents, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=400 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: April 22nd to April 26th, 2021.

Weighting: Results for Ontario are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

Note: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.
