

Economic Transformation


Today, INNOVATIVE is releasing results from our monthly national survey, in field from August 6 to August 11 with a weighted sample size of 1,200 Canadian residents. Detailed methodology is provided in the appendix.


Half of Canadians continue to believe that we need to radically transform our economy, on par with tracking since the end of May. Canadians believe that access to universal basic income is the top transformative change.

One of the priorities for government has been dealing with the economic impacts of COVID-19. Which of the following comes closest to your point of view?








Point of View | Tracking: The need to radically transform our economy tracks on par with August of last year



When we talk about transformation, which of the following is the most important change to you? And which is the second most important to you? And which is the third most important to you?






Government Actions




Gov't Action: Increase Canadian manufacturing of medical goods is up 4 points since August 2020






Gov't Action: Overall, net support for these actions has trended upwards since August 2020 except support for oil & gas sector




Gov't Action: 4-in-5 (85%) support an increase in Canadian manufacturing of medical goods; strong support across party ID








Gov't Action: 4-in-5 (84%) support the increase of support for mental health; highest amongst women and NDP partisans




Gov't Action: 4-in-5 (83%) respondents support requiring access to sick leave; highest amongst older women and NDP partisans








Gov't Action: 4-in-5 (78%) support reducing dependence on imports such as PPE; likelihood of support increases as age increases








Gov't Action: 75% support increasing healthcare spending; highest among women 35-54 and those living in the Atlantic region and BC




Gov't Action: 3-in-4 (74%) support increasing wages for essential and service industry workers; highest amongst women and NDP






Gov't Action: 7-in-10 (71%) support improved access to affordable daycare; highest among young women, Liberals, and NDP partisans




Gov't Action: 68% support an increase in minimum wage; highest amongst NDP partisans and those in the Atlantic region





Gov't Action: 65% support transitioning to a green economy; highest among the Liberals and NDP




Gov't Action: 62% support lowering taxes; highest among women 35- 21 54, those living in the Atlantic region and CPC partisans







Gov't Action: 3-in-5 (59%) support reducing the amount of extra gov't spending on COVID-19 measures; highest amongst CPC partisans

Beginning to reduce the amount of extra government spending on COVID-19 measures









Gov't Action: 59% support implementing a universal basic income; highest amongst NDP partisans, and those in the Atlantic region







Gov't Action: 35% support moving away from capitalism; highest amongst women 18-34 and NDP partisans

Move away from capitalism









Gov't Action: Canadians are split in their decision towards increasing support for oil and gas, highest support for increase among those in AB

Methodology

Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between August 6, 2021 and August 11, 2021.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Dynata, a leading provider of online samples. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=1,282 Canadian citizens, 18 years or older. The results are nationally weighted to n=1,200 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: August 6th, 2021 to August 11th, 2021

Weighting: Results for Canada are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

Note: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.
