## Canadian Trucker Protests

## Following News: Nearly two thirds (63\%) of Canadians are paying close attention to the protests

The federal government has generally been requiring that anybody entering Canada from the US must be vaccinated against COVID-19. There has been an exemption for truckers but the government recently ended that exemption and now requires truckers also be vaccinated. A group of truckers have started a cross-Canada protest driving from $B C$ to Ottawa. How closely have you been following news about the truck driver protest?

Protest Method: Only 3-in-10 (29\%) approve of the way the truckers are protesting while 44\% disapprove

## Survey Methodology

## These are the results of an online survey conducted between January $\mathbf{2 7}^{\text {th }}$ and 31 ${ }^{\text {st }}$, 2022. <br> Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Dynata, a leading provider of online samples. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: $\mathrm{n}=635$ Canadian citizens, 18 years or older. The results are nationally weighted to $\mathrm{n}=500$ based on Census data from Statistics Canada.
Field Dates: January 27 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ and $31^{\text {st }}, 2022$.
Weighting: Results for Canada are weighted by age, gender, region, and party identification to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.
