


New Blue Party

Respondents were randomly shown the ballot question either with or without the New Blue Party to assess the impact of seeing the party on a ballot. A total of 613 respondents were shown the New Blue Party while 587 were not.



Impact of COVID-19


COVID Attitudes: 26% of Ontarians are angry at the way government has tried to force Canadians to get vaccinated


Do you agree or disagree with the following statements? - I am angry at the way the government has tried to force Canadians to get vaccinated, whether they want to or not.






Vote by Vaccine Anger: Among those who are angry about government vaccine policy, 12% would vote New Blue



Political Attitudes: 42% say neither the Liberals nor the PCs are committed to making the changes Ontario needs




Do you agree or disagree with the following statements?














Vote by Pace of Change: Those who think everything is changing too fast are most likely to vote PC






Vote by Strong Central Government: A majority who disagree would vote PC

Appendix: Methodology

Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between May 17th and May 23rd, 2022.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Dynata, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Ontario population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. More details about Dynata can be found here.

Sample Size: n=1,434 Ontario residents, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=1,200 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: May 17th to May 23rd, 2022.

Weighting: Results for Ontario are weighted by age, gender, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data; in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Results are additionally weighted by party ID to match a six-month rolling average from live caller telephone surveys (both landline and cellphone). Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table. The design effect from this weighting procedure is 1.33. The design effect is an estimate of the effect of the weighting procedure on the sampling error.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.
