Methodology

Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between April 13th to April 19th, 2023.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=1,508 Alberta residents, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=1,500 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: April 13th to April 19th, 2023.

Weighting: Results for Alberta are by age, gender, region and education using the latest available Census data to reflect the actual demographic composition of the population.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability-based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

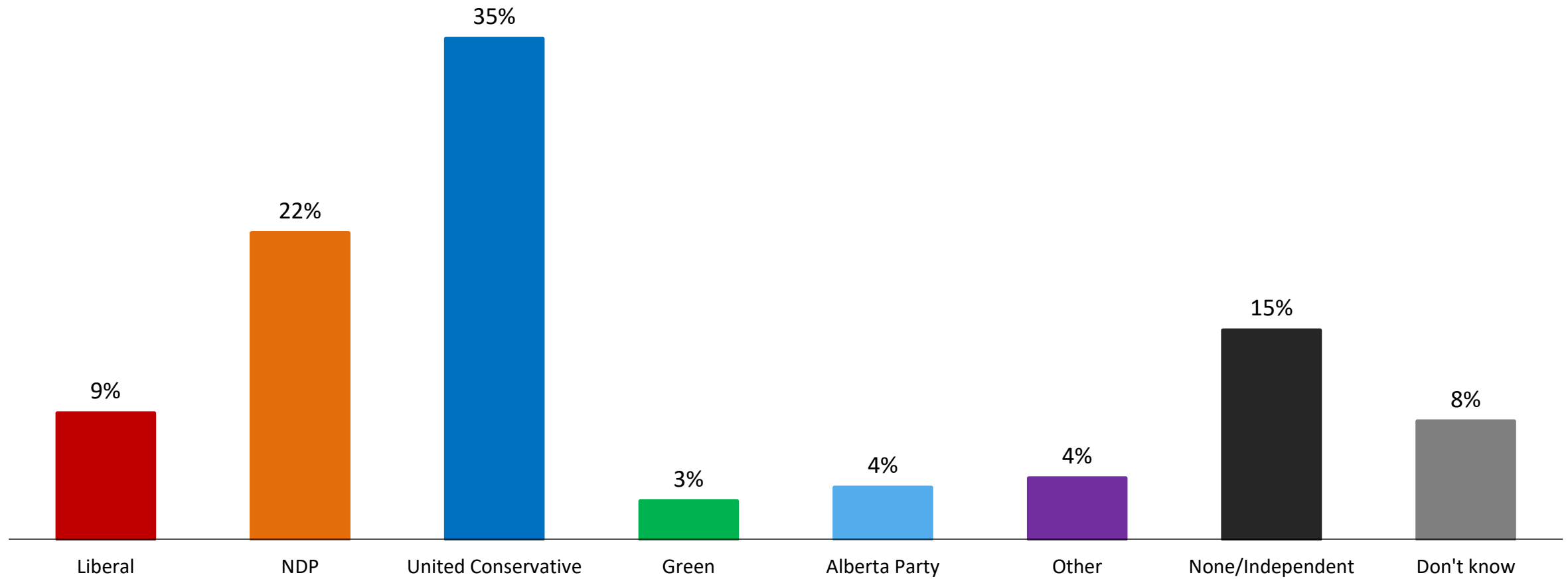

Thinking about politics in Alberta, generally speaking, do you usually think of yourself as a...

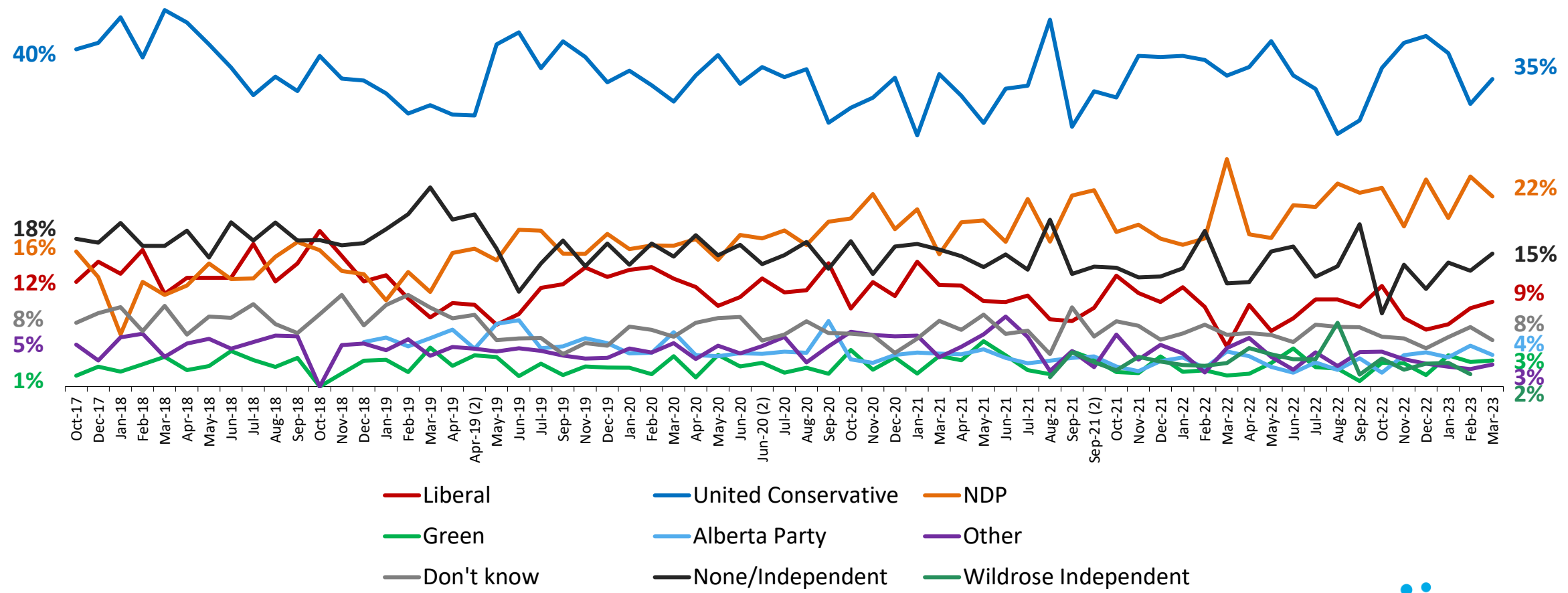

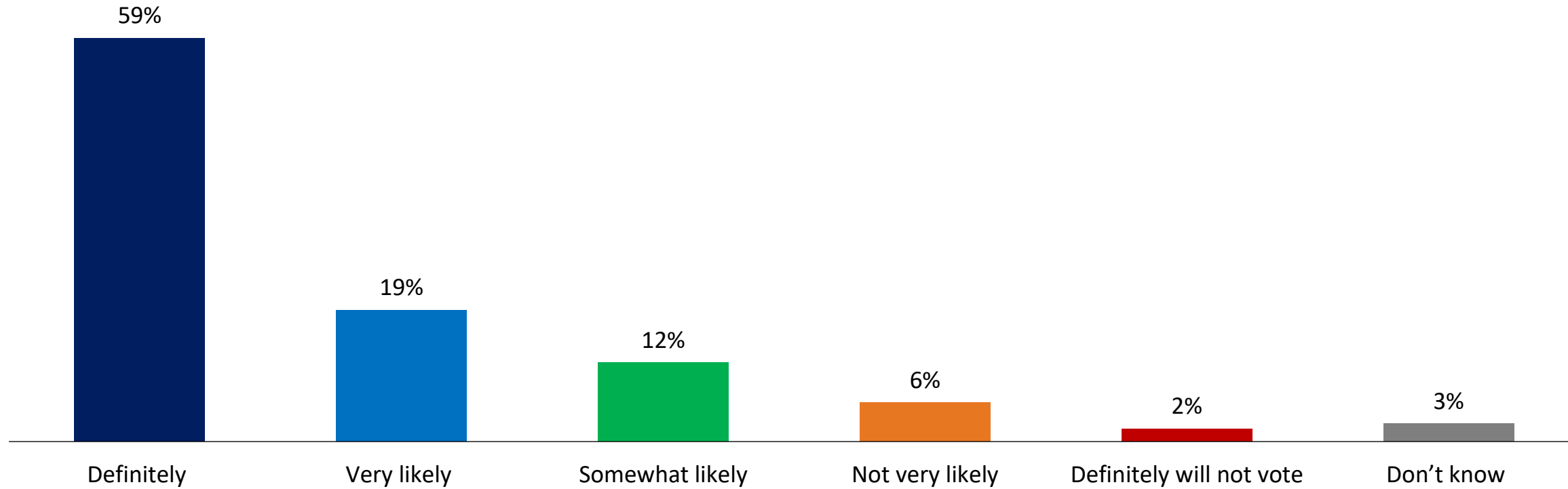


Likelihood to Vote: Nearly 3-in-5 (59%) respondents say they are definitely going to vote in the upcoming Alberta provincial election



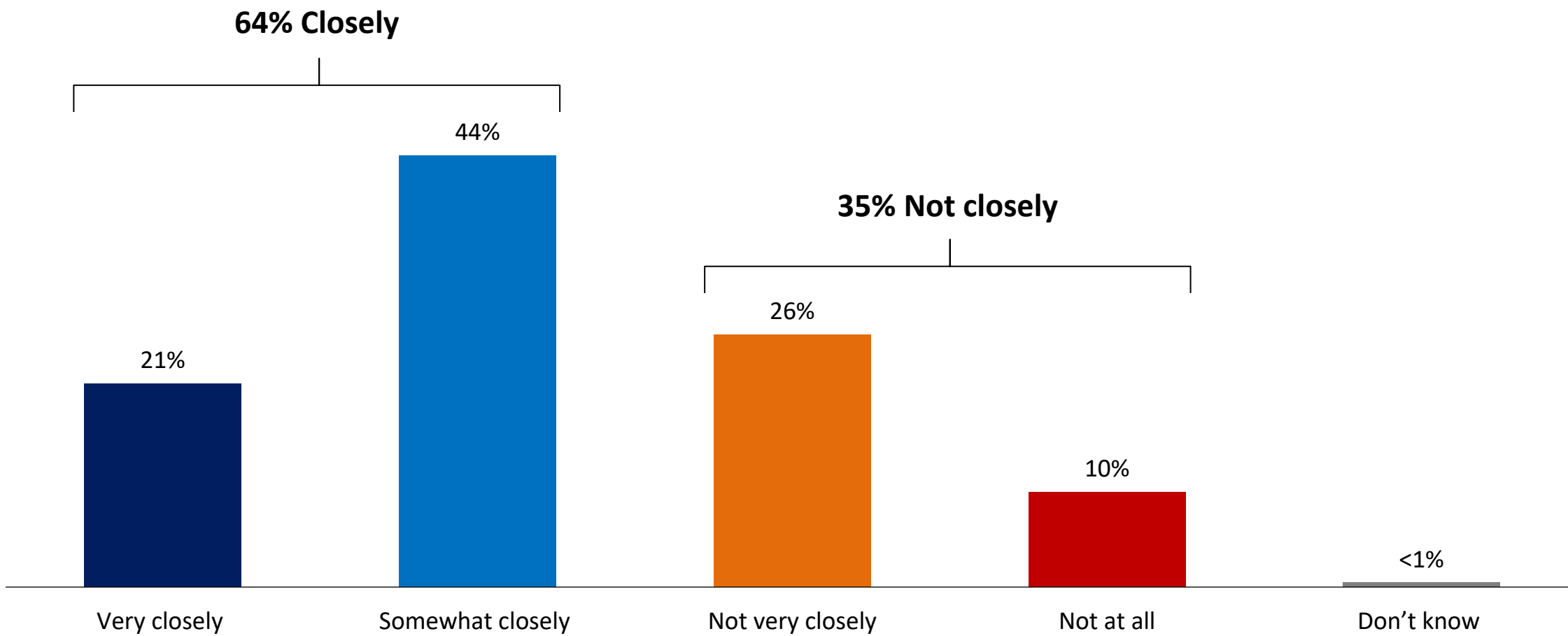
As you may have heard, there is going to be a provincial election May 29 of this year. How likely are you to vote in the upcoming Alberta provincial election?

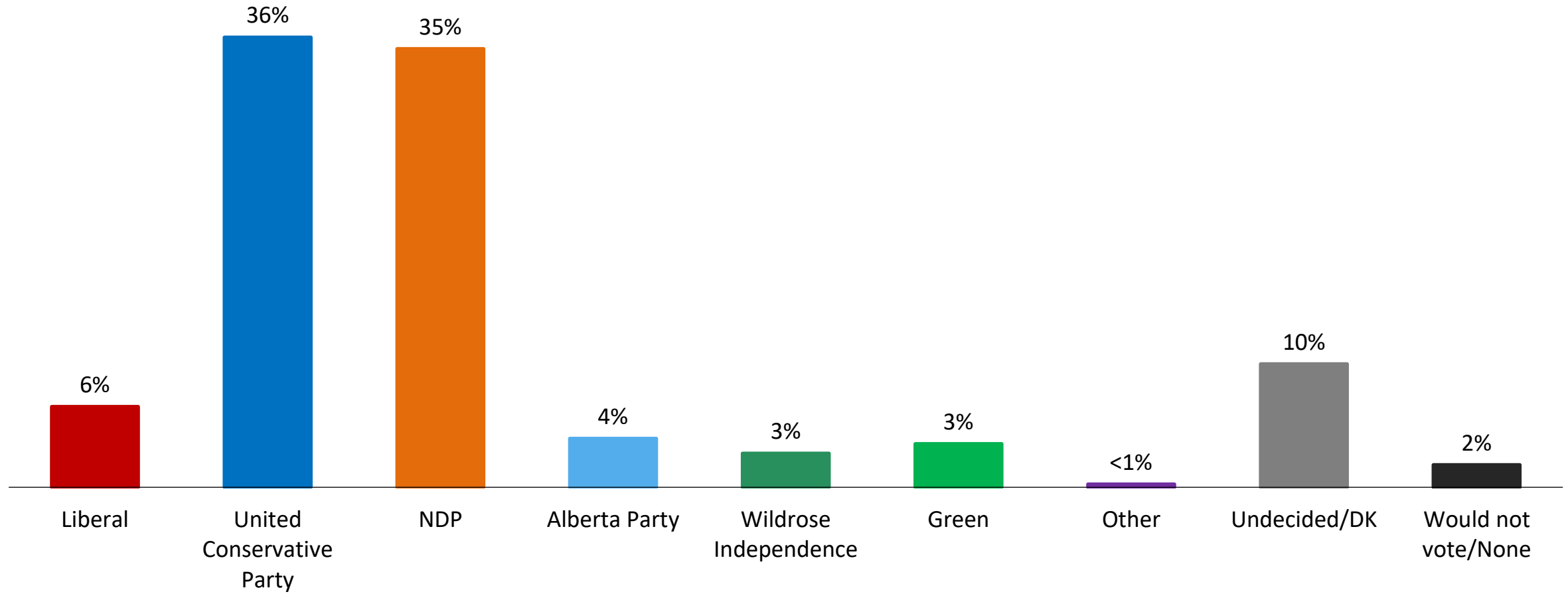
Provincial Combined Vote: Albertans are split between UCP (36%) and NDP (35%) on combined vote ⁹

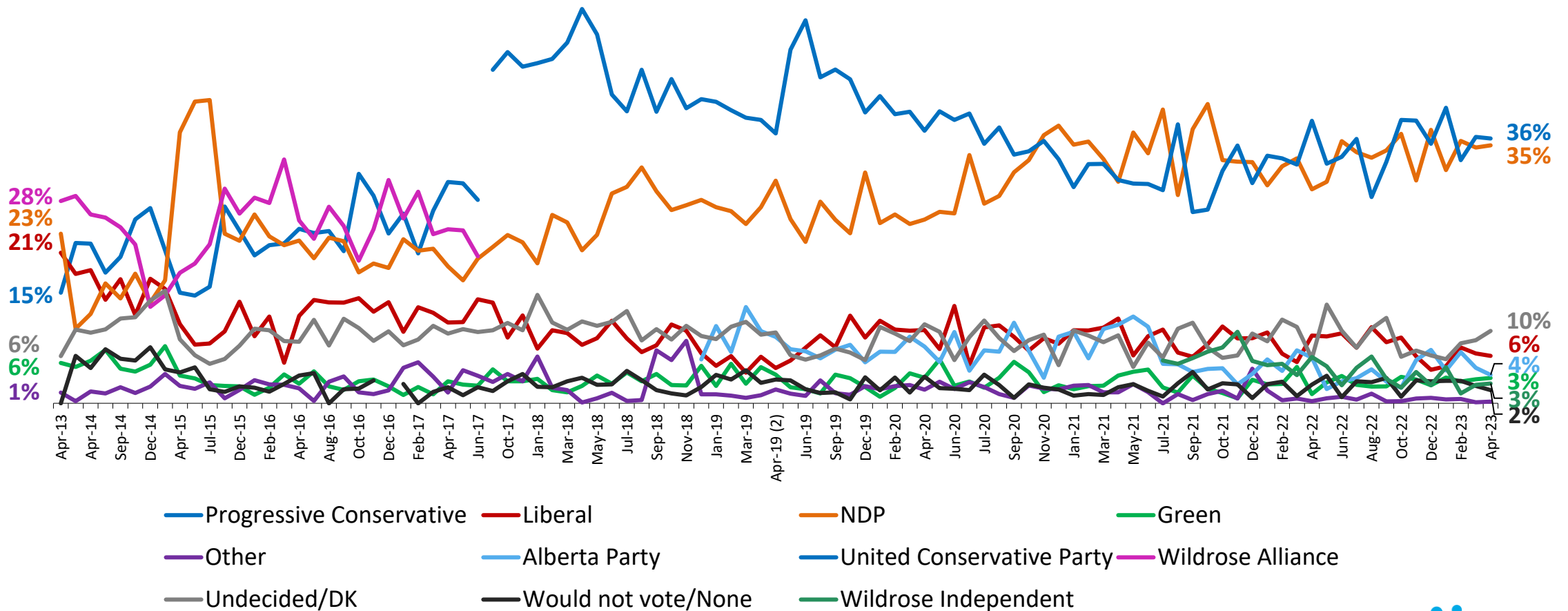

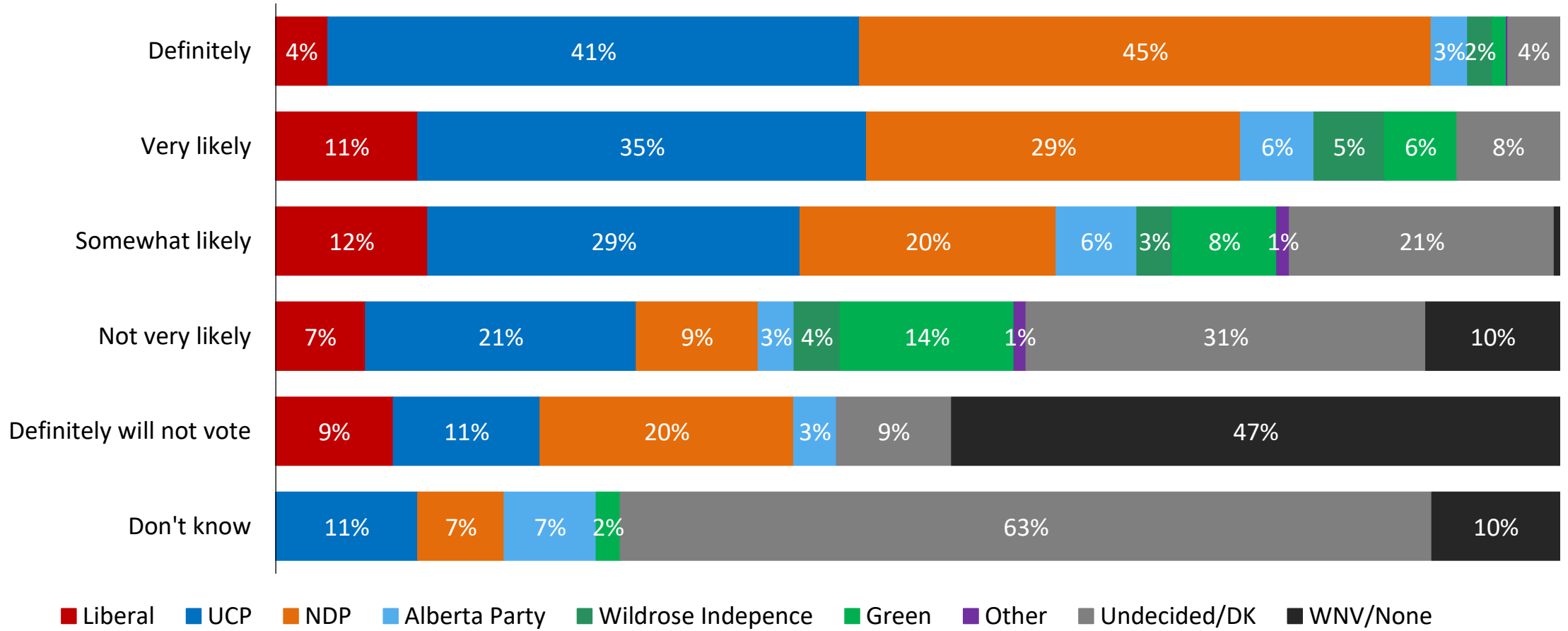

Vote by Likelihood to Vote: Among definite voters, the NDP has a 4 point lead, while UCP leads for 'very likely' and 'somewhat likely' voters

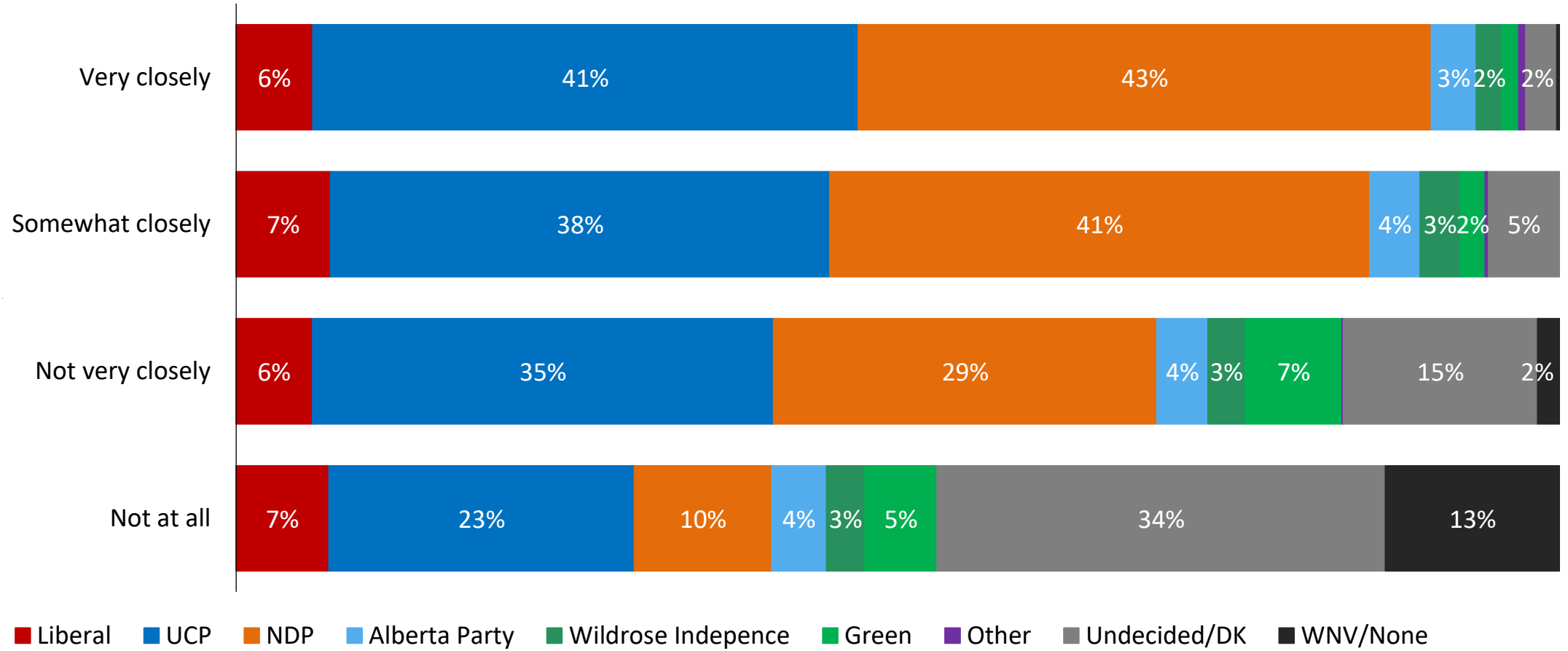

 [asked of all respondents; n=1,500]



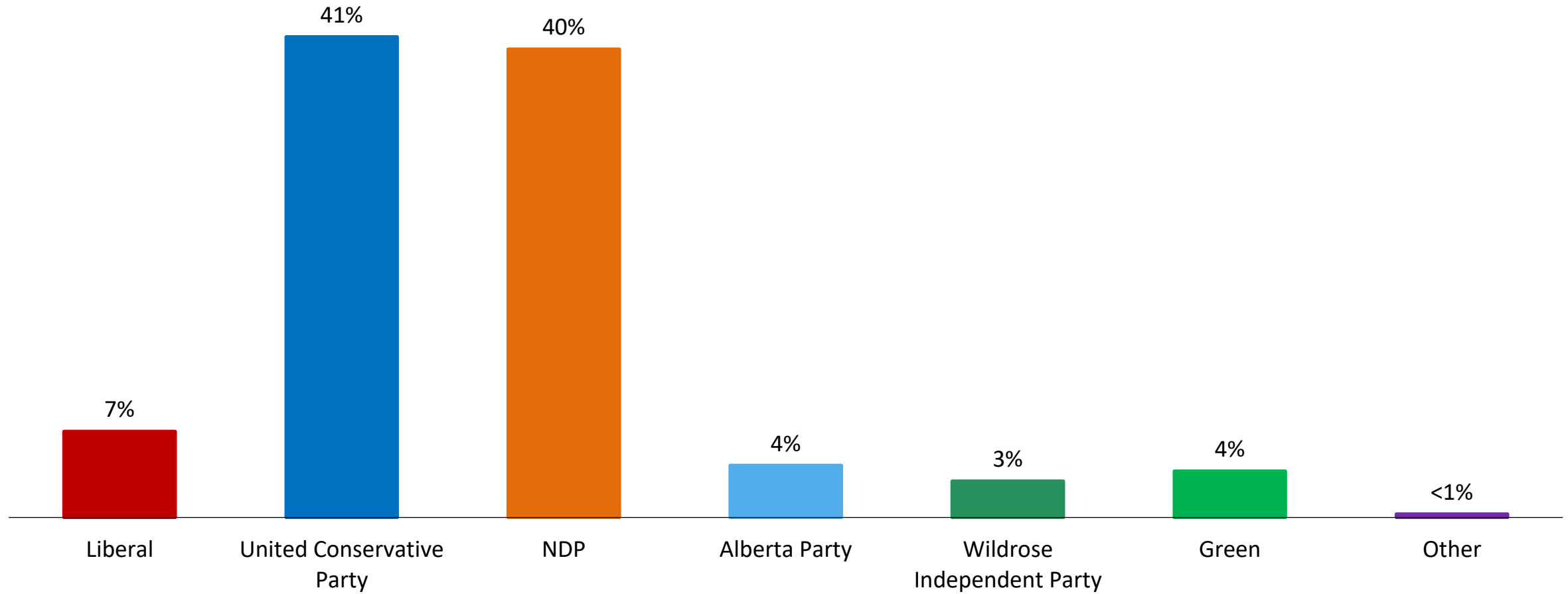

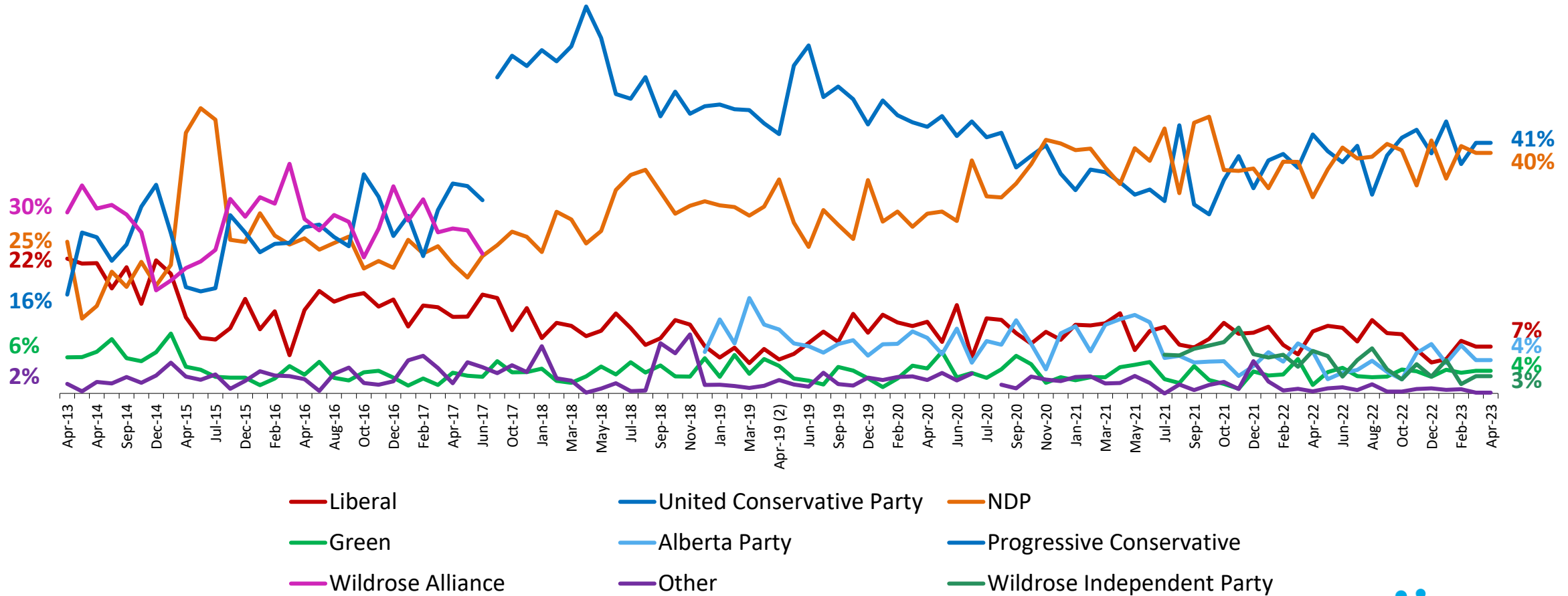


Provincial Decided Vote Tracking: UCP and NDP vote share continues to converge since last month

[only decided voters; n=1,324]



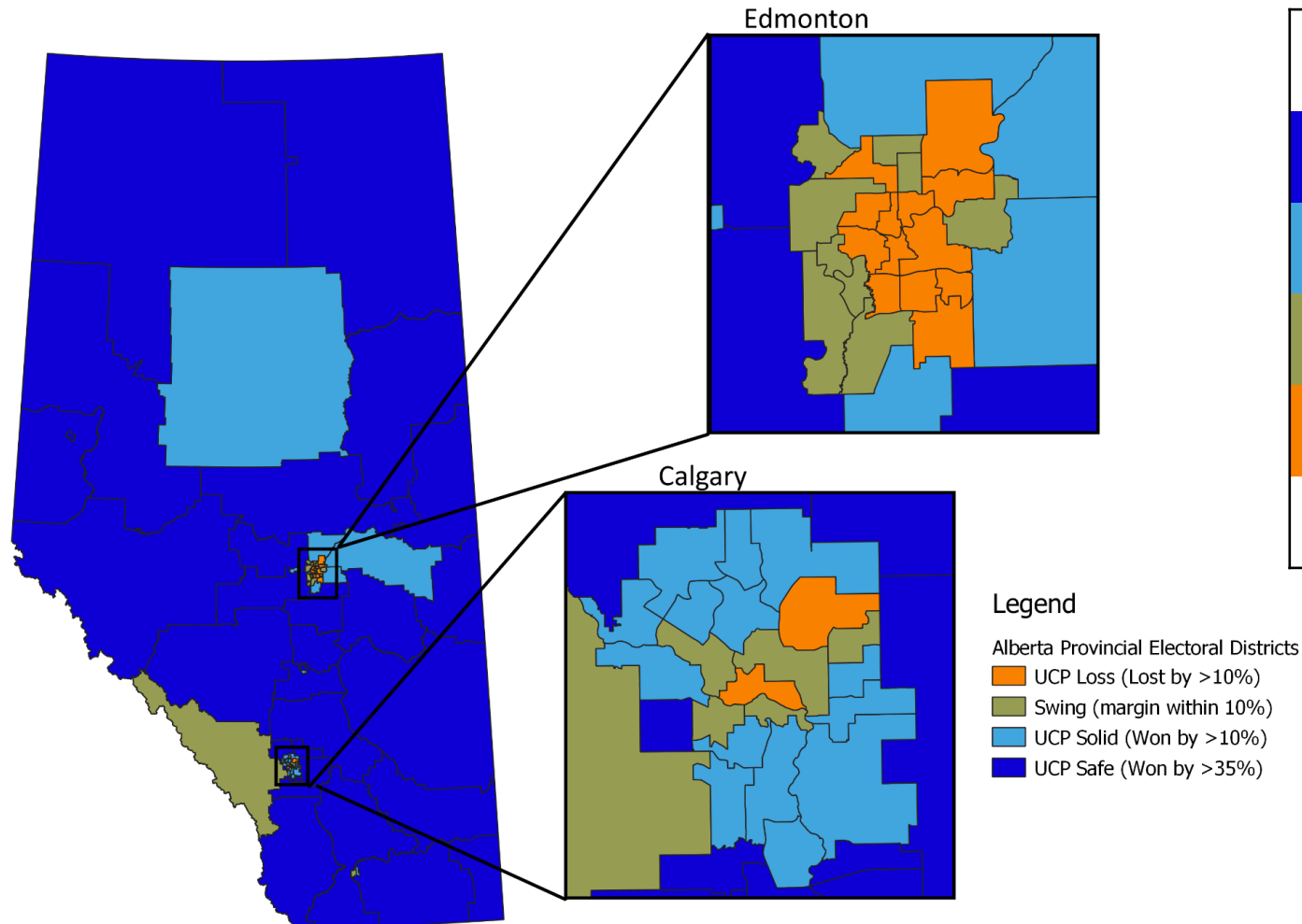

Alberta Riding Segmentation

We have also grouped respondents by provincial electoral district.

Districts are grouped into 4 clusters based on how the governing United Conservative Party performed in the 2019 Alberta Election. Each of these clusters is listed below with the sample size of respondents in each. As of the last election, the UCP have 63 seats, and the NDP have 24.

Vote by Riding Segments

In Canadian elections, we count seats, not votes. To understand the race to secure a majority of seats, we have grouped the results in seat clusters based on the closeness of the 2019 results. The UCP hold a strong lead in 34 “Safe UCP” seats. The NDP should hold all the 15 “UCP Losses”. The NDP currently hold an 8-point lead in Swing ridings and could win all 16 2019 “Swing” seats. The election will depend on the 22 “UCP Solid” seats. 14 are in Calgary, 5 on Edmonton’s outskirts and 3 are rural.

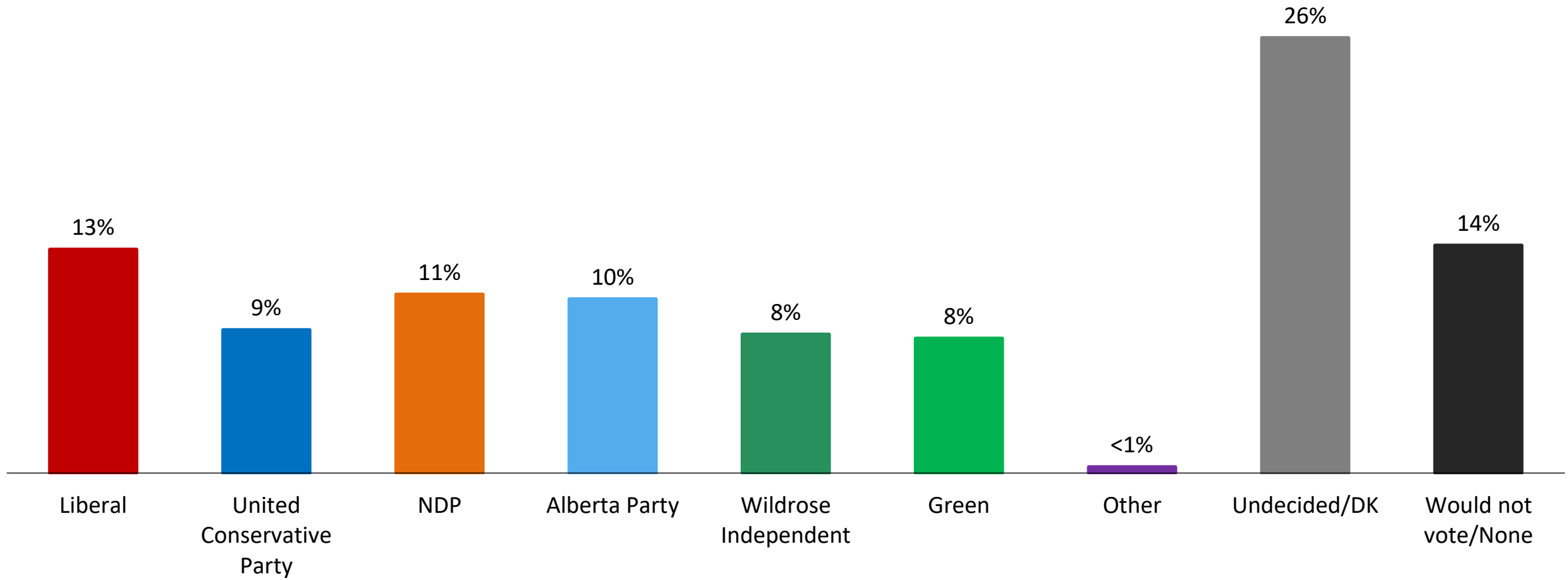

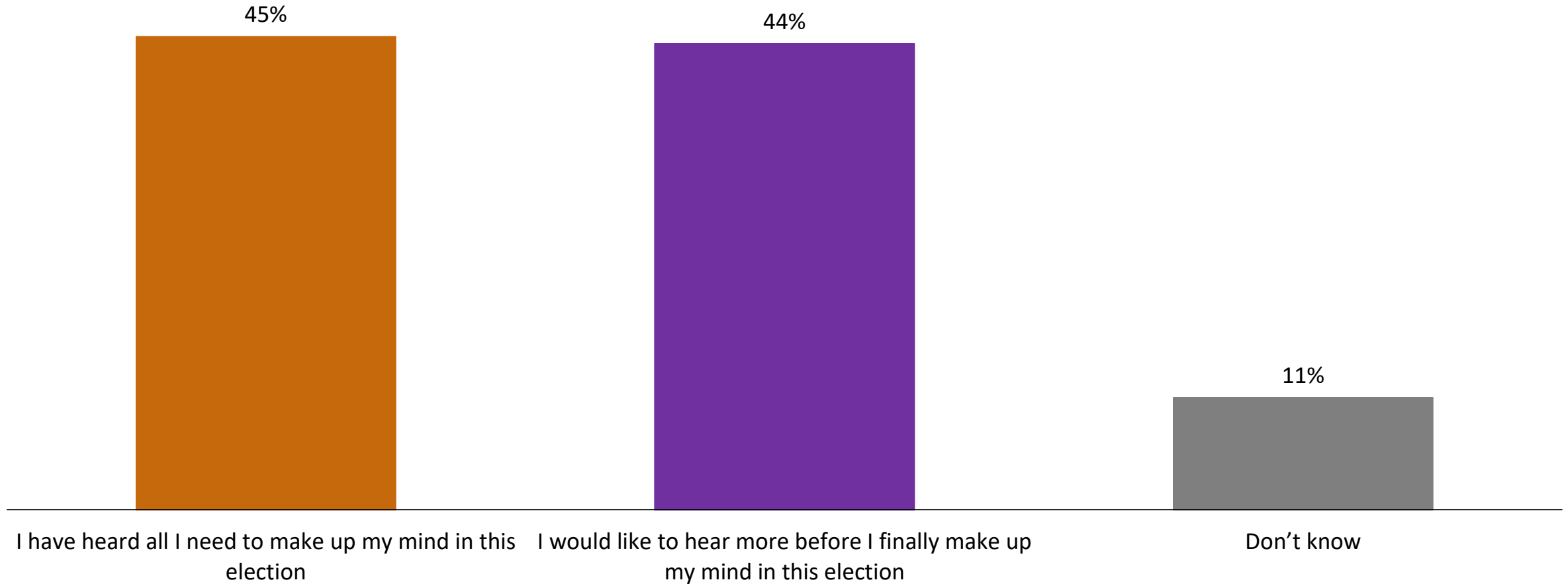

Satisficing: Albertans are split on whether they've made up their minds about the upcoming election

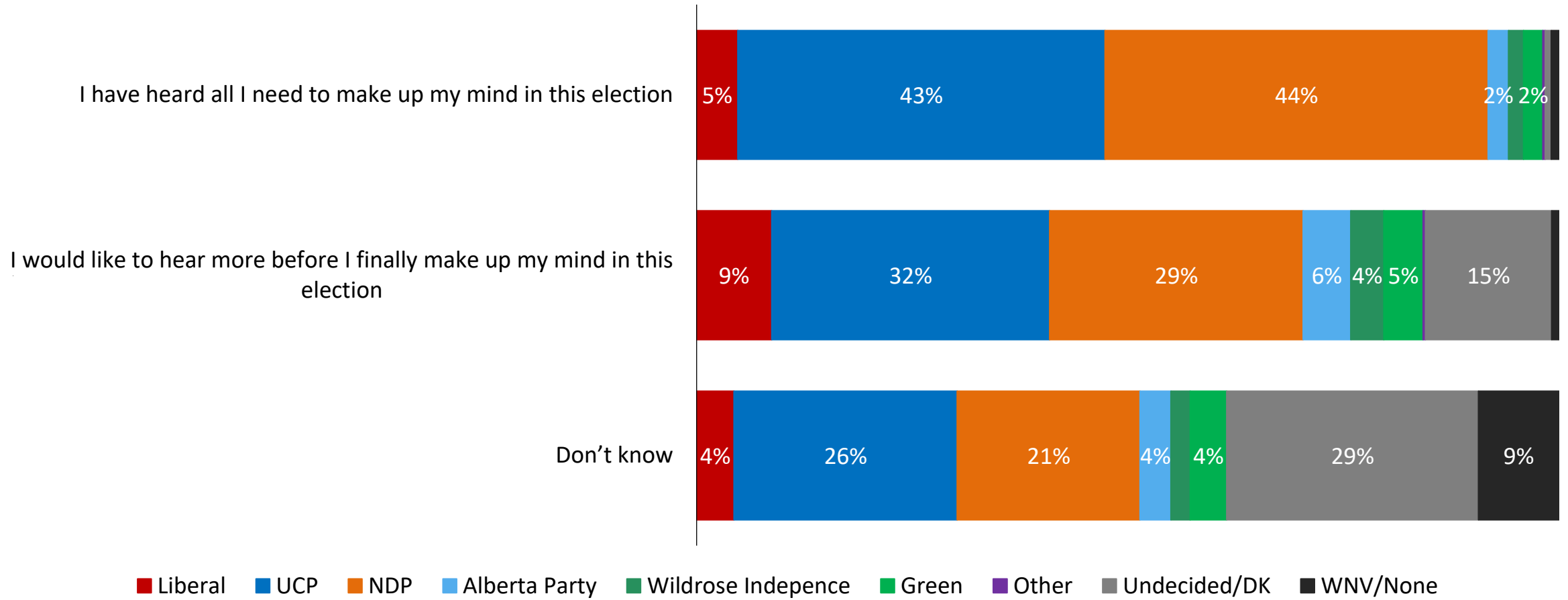
Q Which statement is closest to your view about the upcoming provincial election?
