

Tracking Canadians' Attitudes on Indigenous Issues:
Residential Schools and Kamloops

Key Findings

Canadians show sustained awareness of residential schools and the discovery of potential graves in Kamloops

Often, events seize our attention while they're happening and are then forgotten. This is not the case when it comes to Canadians' views towards the Kamloops discovery and the treatment of Indigenous peoples in residential schools. Currently, 73% of Canadians are familiar with the history of residential schools, representing a 5-point increase since last year and the highest level recorded in our tracking. Furthermore, 72% of Canadians are aware of the Kamloops discovery, which has remained steady since last year.

Canadians remain angry about the treatment of Indigenous peoples in residential schools

4-in-5 (79%) are angry about the treatment of Indigenous peoples in Canadian residential schools, up marginally since last year. Only 12% report not being angry. When it comes to reparations and acknowledgements from government to residential school survivors, about half (47%) say that that government efforts have been too little.


Majority of Canadians believe that the Kamloops discovery is an ongoing issue


64% say the Kamloops discovery reminds us that the history of residential schools still requires government responses today. More disapprove (32%) than approve (27%) of the way the federal government has handled this issue since the graves were discovered.

Familiarity:


Familiarity with the history of residential schools up 5 points since last year, reaching its highest point






Feeling about Treatment:

Opinion about government efforts steady since last year, with nearly half saying too little is being done





Familiarity:


Familiarity with the discovery of the bodies steady since last year, now at 72%







Issue from Past or Present:

64% believe the discovery is a present issue, higher among those who identify as Liberal and NDP






- This discovery is an issue from Canada's past and doesn't have any implications for governments today




Government Response:

Methodology

Survey Methodology



These are the results of an online survey conducted between May 11th and May 29th, 2023.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online samples. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=2,682 Canadian citizens, 18 years or older. The results are nationally weighted to n=1,500 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: May 11th and May 29th, 2023.

Weighting: Results for Canada are weighted by age, gender, region, education, and party identification to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data, in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability-based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.

Note: Graphs may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.
