

Neighbours 2: The US Presidential Race

Public Opinion Research Release Date: July 04, 2024





01 Compared to 2020, American voters are more likely to feel that things in the United States have gotten off on the wrong track and that the economy today is either only fair or poor.

02

The horserace is a statistical tie. On a national level, Donald Trump leads Joe Biden by 1 point among decided registered voters. Among the four battleground states oversampled, Biden leads in Minnesota and Pennsylvania while Trump leads in Georgia and North Carolina.

Donald Trump is perceived as a better President than Joe Biden. A majority (53%) approve of Donald Trump's performance as President compared to 44% for Biden. Just 38% say Biden has made things better for them while 51% say the same about Trump.



Looking at specific issues, Biden has a strong lead on climate change and abortion while Trump has a strong lead on balancing the budget and crime and public safety. On pocketbook issues, Trump leads on making things better on affordable housing (9 points), on helping people like you get ahead (10 points), and helping people like you make ends meet (10 points)

American Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between June 7th and June 17th, 2024.

Method: This online survey was conducted using Dynata, a leading provider of online sample. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual American population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=2,946 registered voters, 18 years or older. The results are weighted to n=2,000 based on Census and Current Population Survey data for all adults, with those who report not being registered screened out. Four potential tipping point states were oversampled to n=300 each (North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Georgia and Minnesota)

Field Dates: June 7th to June 17th, 2024.

Weighting: Results are weighted by age, gender, education, race, past presidential vote, and region to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census and population survey data. Respondents who report not being registered to vote were screened out of the final sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability-based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.




National Mood: In 2024, 69% of Americans feel the US has gotten off on the wrong track, a 6-point increase since 2020






Voting Habits: Americans are divided relatively evenly between voting ^{*} Republican or Democratic

Upcoming Election: 87% agree the upcoming election will be the most ¹⁰ important in history; 70% have already made up their minds




Which statement is closest to your view about the upcoming federal election? [asked of all respondents]







Likelihood to Vote: Over 3-in-4 (77%) of registered voters say that they¹¹ will definitely be voting in the upcoming election








Combined Vote: Donald Trump (42%) has a slight one-point edge over ¹² Joe Biden (41%) in combined vote


If the 2024 presidential election was being held today, which presidential candidate would you vote for? [VOTE + LEAN] [asked of all respondents]

If the 2024 presidential election was being held today, which presidential candidate would you vote for? [DECIDED] [asked of all respondents]







Decided Vote BY Segmentation: 14% of those who say they voted Biden in 2020 are not voting for Joe Biden today

Those whose decided vote is Joe Biden






Likelihood to Vote in Upcoming Election


Decided Vote BY Segmentation: Trump does well with 2020 non-voters¹⁵ and holds more of his 2020 vote than Biden

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




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Decided Vote BY Battleground States: Minnesota and Pennsylvania lean towards Biden; Georgia and North Carolina favour Trump




Approval of Presidency: 53% of Americans approve Trump's performance as president, while 44% approve of Biden

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








Leaders in the US: Biden's strong unfavourables have jumped 9 points ²⁰ since 2020, while Trump's strong unfavourables are up 4 points








Better or Worse - Overall: 51% of Americans say Trump made things better for people like you, while 38% say the same about Biden









Better or Worse – Issues: Trump leads on budget, housing, crime and social assistance; Biden leads on climate change and abortion rights

Thinking about the various legal issues Donald Trump is facing, which of the following statements is closest to your own point of view? [asked of all respondents]






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Legal Issues BY Segmentation: 43% of Americans who will definitely vote believe the prosecutions against Trump is due to hijacking
