Canadian Attitudes on Free Trade with the U.S.

Public Opinion ResearchField Dates: November 22nd to December 3rd, 2024

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Survey Methodology

These are the results of an online survey conducted between November 22nd to December 3rd, 2024.

Method: This online survey was conducted using INNOVATIVE's Canada 20/20 national research panel with additional respondents from Lucid, a leading provider of online samples. Each survey is administered to a series of randomly selected samples from the panel and weighted to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual Canadian population according to Census data to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample.

Sample Size: n=2,390 Canadian citizens, 18 years or older. The results are nationally weighted to n=1,000 based on Census data from Statistics Canada.

Field Dates: November 22nd to December 3rd, 2024.

Weighting: Results for Canada are weighted by age, gender, region, education, and self-reported federal past vote to ensure that the overall sample's composition reflects that of the actual population according to Census data, in order to provide results that are intended to approximate a probability sample. Weighted and unweighted frequencies are reported in the table.

Margin of Error: This is a representative sample. However, since the online survey was not a random probability-based sample, a margin of error cannot be calculated. Statements about margins of sampling error or population estimates do not apply to most online panels.







Which of the following leaders do you believe is more equipped to handle Canada-US relations during Trump's renewed presidency? BY Attitude Towards Trump








Efforts on Issues: A majority (68%) of Canadians say we need to 'do more' to stopping criminals and terrorists from entering Canada






Stopping Criminals/Terrorists from Entering: Over 2-in-3 (68%) say we ¹¹ need to do more; highest among Conservatives



Unfair Competition: Over half (52%) of Canadians say we need to do more in standing up to unfair competition from China




Defending Canada: Compared to other regions, the Atlantic are more likely to say we need to do more to defend Canada's North






Illegal Border Crossings: More than half of Canadians believe efforts to ¹⁶ prepare for potential increases in illegal border crossings are inadequate




Free Trade Agreement: Since June, more Canadians think free trade with the U.S. is a good thing




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
Re-negotiating the Free Trade Agreement: Nearly half (46%) think renegotiating the free trade agreement will leave Canada worse off




If the new American administration led by Donald Trump re-opens the current free trade agreement, do you think Canada will be better off or worse off than it is now?



Tariffs: An overwhelming majority (76%) of Canadians are concerned about the possibility of increased tariffs on goods exported to the U.S.






Familiarity with Supply Management: Only one third of Canadians are ²² familiarity with supply management




Supply management is a system that allows specific farming sectors (such as dairy, poultry and eggs)

to limit the supply of their products to what Canadians are expected to consume in order to ensure




Attitude Towards Supply Management: 2-in-5 support think supply a management sounds like a good thing; highest among Liberal partisans




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New Free Trade Agreement: Making it tougher for criminals/terrorists²⁴ enter Canada' has the highest support




Stricter Border Security: An overwhelming majority (80%) support tougher border control against criminal activities and terrorism




Unfair Competition: Two thirds support stronger stance towards unfair ²⁶ competition from China, more so amongst Populist Conservatives



North Border Defense: Majority of Canadians support efforts strengthening north border defense from Russia and China




NATO Commitment: Most Canadians (56%) support the notion of Canada living up to its commitment as a member of NATO











Water Supply: Support for exporting water to the U.S. increases further³³ eastward from BC; younger demographics more likely to support this


Would you support or oppose exporting Canadian water to the US to help states like California with their water shortage?


Water Supply By Segmentation: Across most segmentations, more are ³⁴ opposed of exporting Canadian water to the U.S.




Would you support or oppose exporting Canadian water to the US to help states like California with their water shortage? BY Segmentation
