## **Learning Targets**



This is the second report of the March Wave 2 data. Building from findings from previous waves, this report further expands on:

- Financial confidence
- Standard of living
- Job anxiety
- Economic transformation



#### **Summary**

- Canadians Confident in Finances and Employment despite Tariff Threats. Canadians are confident when it comes to their personal finances and employment situation, but they are concerned about the future of their employers. While lower than initial seen during COVID, the desire for economic transformation remains strong in the face of Trump's tariff threats.
- In spite of the ongoing Trade War, confidence and security over household finances is robust, with 55% feeling at least somewhat confident. Confidence is lowest in Atlantic Canada at 52% and among women (48%). Liberals are considerably more confident that NDP partisans (61% vs 51%).
- In the midst of tariffs and an unemployment rate that continues a slow and steady climb, Canadians' confidence in being able to find another job remains positive at net +35% agree. Confidence is highest in the Prairies (63% total agree), and among men (60%).
  - Where we start seeing real concern is among employed Canadians who are more concerned about the welfare of their employers than they have been since 2008 far more so than during the height of COVID. Asked if they feel the organization they work for is going to survive the downturn in the economy, 37% agree while 33% disagree, resulting in +4% net agreement
    - Half (47%) of Canadians feel the pandemic showed that we need to radically transform our economy to work differently in the future (down from a high of 53% in August of 2021). There is also a decline in those who feel the economy was working pretty well before COVID, down from a high of 44% in January of 2024 to 38% today.

The findings in this survey report are based on an online survey sponsored and conducted by Innovative Research Group Inc.


# **WHO**



Canadian adults, 18 years or older.

Survey conducted in both French and English.

## **SAMPLE**



Unweighted sample of 3,253 (W1 n=1,695, W2 n=1,558) respondents. Weighted nationally to 2,000 respondents based on 2021 Census data from Statistics Canada.

Sample weighted by age, gender, region, education, and self-reported federal past vote.

W1 March 5<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025 and W2 March 11<sup>th</sup> to March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025

Online survey from representative online panels.

Survey conducted in both French and English.




## **Engagement with U.S.-Canada Relationship:**


Trump's election as US President leaves 60% of Canadians feeling afraid, easing slightly



The Liberals and Bloc are almost tied in Quebec; Conservatives hold a 11-point lead over Liberals elsewhere


#### Party ID: Quebec

[Respondents in the rest of Canada; n=770]







The next few questions are about issues important to you. Which of the following issues is the most important issue to you? [asked of all respondents, n=1,000]




#### **Household's Financial Confidence – Tracking:**

Financial confidence tracking remains stable despite tariff threats




Generally speaking, how confident and secure do you feel about your household's current financial situation? [asked of all respondents, n=2,000]




#### **Household's Financial Confidence:**

Household confidence lowest amongst NDP supporters (51%); men are more likely to say confident








#### Household's Financial Confidence BY Attention to News:




#### Household's Financial Confidence BY Trump Emotions


#### **Confidence in Finding Another Job:**





Most feel confident in getting another job; lowest among NDP, highest in Prairies and among men








Canadians' concern about the health of their employer highest since 2008

#### Among those who are currently employed














#### The share of those feeling the economy works pretty well now below COVID levels




## Transforming the Economy by Value Clusters:
