Field Dates: January 22nd to January 26th, 2013

Sample Size: n=553; MoE ±4.2%

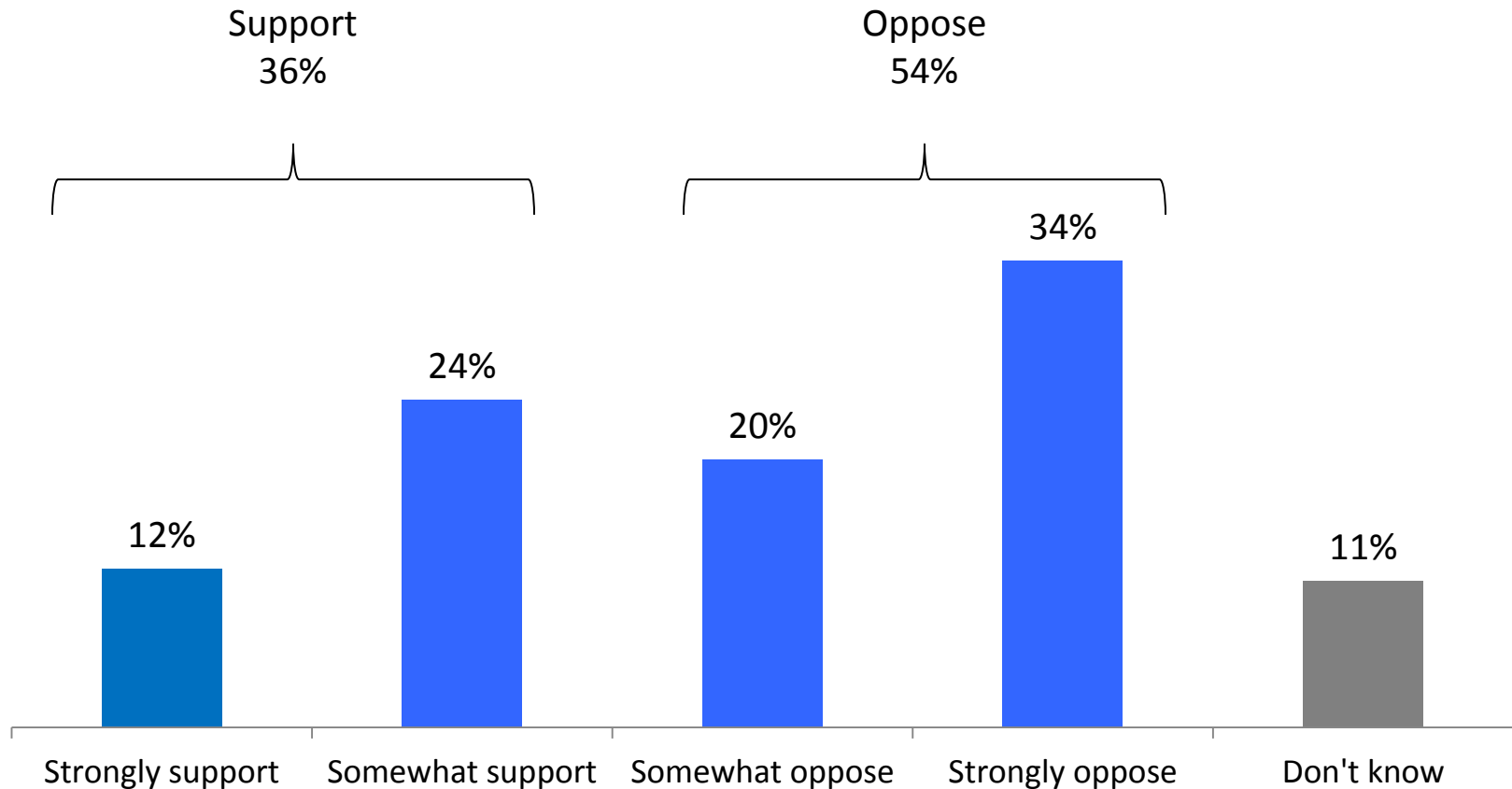
Methodology

- This survey was conducted by telephone among 533 randomly-selected Nova Scotia residents, 18 years or older, from January 22nd-26th, 2013.
- Only one respondent per household was eligible to complete this survey.
- The sample has been weighted by age and gender using 2011 Statistics Canada Census data to reflect the actual demographic composition of the population.
- The margin of sampling error for an unweighted sample of this size is ± 4.2 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
- The margin of error will be larger within each sub-grouping of the sample.

Note: *Graphs and tables may not always total 100% due to rounding values rather than any error in data. Sums are added before rounding numbers.*
